
Responsibilities of Western District Cricket Club Members

The Club has the right to enforce penalties where there are proven breaches of reasonable conduct in these matters.

As a player, we should endeavour to be available for all matches as membership carries with it a commitment to the Club. Part of that commitment includes working cooperatively with the captain, team members and officials to ensure your side achieves its optimum performance.

While there is no compulsion for individuals to undertake administrative duties, members should be aware that the workload in conducting all aspects of the Club's activities is considerable and should not be left to a select few. Our contribution to assist in making the Club work harmoniously and efficiently is encouraged.

WESTERN DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB INCORPORATED PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2000 - 2001

The Club's Women's team won its eighth successive premiership, being undefeated in the 2000-2001 season. Too often when a team follows a successful premiership path year-after-year, there can be a tendency to take that side for granted. Should that be the case with the Club's Women's team, then it is timely that we highlight their performances over the years.

The side has been premiers in 15 of the 21 competitions in which it has competed, including 14 of the last 15. These results are truly remarkable and we congratulate everyone concerned on that imposing record. Naturally, there has been quite a turnover of players over the 21 seasons but despite this, the Club has proved, season-after-season, it can still produce the best side. In the 1980s, one of the Club's players, Glenda Hall, represented Australia, touring India and New Zealand.

We should not assume the side will win in 2001-2002 – it may well do so – and if it does, then it will be the same as in other years in that, in the season in question, they will have to establish themselves as the best in the A.C.T. Congratulations to all those associated with the Women's side over the years – their efforts are outstanding.

A bright spot on the Club's horizon is the use of Jamison Oval for cricket. While the Oval may be the subject of a lease with the Western District Rugby Union Club Inc., with whom we have a close association, it will be available for cricket matches probably from November. It is anticipated that the first cricket match on the oval will be played before Christmas 2001. Whereas the pitches at Kaleen and Aranda Ovals have never been in the top bracket, it is expected that the playing surface at Jamison Oval will be of such a standard as to attract cricketers to our Club. Training will continue at Aranda Oval.

During the season, there appeared to be a more harmonious relationship between our Club and Evatt/Western District Juniors. Frequent meetings were held and several members took the time to assist the development of junior cricketers. It is anticipated that, in future, even stronger ties will emerge and these will be to the ultimate benefit of cricket in the district.

It would be remiss of me if I did not draw to the attention of members the fact that the Club's 5^{th} Grade side forfeited the last match of the men's season – a game which coincided with the Canberra Day holiday weekend. This would have to be one of the blackest days in the Club's history. A repetition in the years ahead would call into question our justification in competing in the A.C.T Cricket Association Competition.

While it may be that work commitments were a cause of the absence of one or two players on that occasion, there is little doubt that some members forgot their responsibility to the Club and the commitment made when accepting membership. How else can one explain that, whereas we fielded six men's teams during the season, on the occasion of a long weekend we couldn't manage five sides?

Members need to be constantly reminded of the need for greater assistance in the conduct of the Club's affairs. Too few members contribute in this regard and what is asked of each member is "Are you willing to devote two or three hours each month to assist in the numerous activities that are so necessary in the administration of the Club?". A handful of members are trying to do too much and the efforts of our volunteers are stretched. At all levels – men's, women's and juniors' – there is much that has to be done for the Club to function successfully.

To those who assisted in the conduct of the administrative affairs of the Club during the season, I express on behalf of the members my sincere thanks, and I include here our sponsors for their financial contributions (details of which are covered in the Management Committee Report). To those who didn't, I ask what are you prepared to do in 2001-2002.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP NOMINATIONS - GREG BESOMO AND KEN NORRIS

At the March 2001 meeting of the Management Committee, it was unanimously agreed that Greg Besomo and Ken Norris be nominated for Life Membership at the Club's Annual General Meeting.

When studying the profile of both Greg and Ken, it was noted that there were many areas common to both members. Each commenced his playing association with the Club in his 30s in 1983/84 and each soon found a place in our $1^{\rm st}$ Grade team. They were very soon in the thick of the administrative scene, involving

themselves in the conduct of the Club's affairs over and above the portfolios they held from time to time. Both members retired from grade cricket around the same time and each has since become a regular with the Club's Veterans' team.

Their contribution to the Club over many years has been invaluable and indeed, members are indebted for the extensive hours spent in furthering the interests of the Western District Cricket Club. For the record, each of these two popular Club members bats left-hand and bowls right.

Examination of the Club's annual reports reveals many acknowledgments of their efforts. Dual recognition was evidenced in 1994/95 by the President, Mick Brady, who highlighted the "commonsense and sagacious approach provided by Ken Norris and Greg Besomo on decision making, involvement of past players and the financial aspects of the Club". Ian Garrity, 1st Grade premiership winning captain in 1995/96, made special mention after the side's premiership victory when he thanked "Ken Norris and Greg Besomo for their terrific support again throughout the year". (Emphasis added.)

The following profiles are presented.

Greg Besomo

Greg joined the Club soon after coming to Canberra from Sydney. His significant contribution to the affairs of the Waverley Cricket Club had been recognised there by his being made a life member of that Club. In the 1986/87 season, he assumed the role of Treasurer midway through the year when Alan Middleton relinquished the position. The post of Treasurer, which is generally recognised as the least sought-after position in any club, did not deter Greg who used his CPA skills in more than capably filling the position.

He has always been interested and involved in all aspects of the Club. In the 1988/89 Report, the President, Allen Rapley, wrote:

"Special mention must be given to Secretary David Hunt and Treasurer Greg Besomo not only for their efforts this year but also for those of previous years. I applaud the selection of Greg Besomo as Club Sticker - it is a richly deserved acknowledgment of his contribution to Wests' cricket over many years as player and administrator".

In all, Greg was Club Treasurer from 1986/87 to 1989/90 and again from 1994/95 to 1997/98. It was always of comfort to the various Management Committees to know that the financial affairs were being competently managed.

Playing Record - WDCC Grade Cricket 37 matches - 838 runs, average 33.52 - 58 wickets, average 16.83.

Ken Norris

After enjoying considerable success on the playing fields of Bendigo, it didn't take Ken long to make his mark in Canberra, being chosen to represent the A.C.T. Against the touring West Indies side of 1984/85, he notched an impressive 49 not out.

Ken's role with the Club was more diversified than Greg's, filling numerous positions. Upon arriving on the Club scene, he was soon active in his administrative chores. The Management Committee's report of 1984/85 noted his "untiring efforts" in fund-raising and social activities. In the following Annual Report, it was stated that he provided great input towards "improving junior development".

When the President stood down early in 1986/87, Ken filled the breach for the remaining part of the term and also the following year. The prestigious Club Sticker Award came his way in 1987/88. He was regularly part of the Management Committee after that season. He played a major part in the overhaul of the Club's Constitution in the late '80s, including its incorporation. In the mid-90s, he was the Club's Senior Vice-President and delegate to the A.C.T.C.A, and his interest in the Club has never waned.

Playing Record - WDCC Grade Cricket 95 matches - 2,081 runs, average 21.45 - 112 wickets, average 23.06.

Summary

The contributions of Greg Besomo and Ken Norris to the Western District Cricket Club, both on and off the cricket field, have been outstanding. They have always proved great ambassadors for the Club and, by any standard, their efforts are worthy of the Club's highest honour - Life Membership.

At the Annual General Meeting, it will be moved:

That Greg Besomo and Ken Norris be made Life Members of the Western District Cricket Club.

AUSTRALIAN SPORTS MEDAL

During the year 2000, the Australian Sports Medal was awarded by the Governor-General of Australia to commemorate Australian sporting achievement. The stated aim of the medal was to "recognise persons who have made a contribution to Australian sport as a current or former participant or through the provision of support services to sport".

Peak sports bodies recognised by the Australian Sports Commission, as well as members of the Federal, State and Territory Parliaments, were eligible to submit nominations for the Medal. Twenty-two medals were awarded in the A.C.T for the sport of cricket.

The Club was delighted that two if its members - Gerald Garrity and Ashley Heddle - were recipients of the medals, which were presented at a special function held in the Sir Donald Bradman Stand at Manuka Oval. Two former players - Vic Cristofani and Lyndon Howe - also received medals.

In presenting the awards, it was mentioned that the aggregate contribution of the 22 recipients exceeded 600 years.

WESTERN DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB INCORPORATED MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE'S REPORT 2000 - 2001

The ultimate goal is to have a Club that is successful in providing the infrastructure for a collective, cohesive unit, all working in the same direction, where each member is able to reach their full potential and derive maximum enjoyment from their cricket, on and off the field.

The Western District Cricket Club faced a number of challenges in season 2000-2001, which made it difficult for the Management Committee to fulfil that objective. There were the normal pressures associated with being a volunteer organisation having to meet increasing costs. In addition, the removal of the Canberra Comets for the Mercantile Mutual Cup severely depleted the morale and playing strength of A.C.T cricket. The Club felt this more keenly than most, with the loss of several senior players. This reduced our playing depth and, perhaps more significantly, meant that important leaders were lost.

In this context there were some significant administrative successes which included:

- all Committee positions being filled at the Annual General Meeting there was even a vote for the final director's position;
- fee payment was greatly improved. This may sound mundane, but it makes the administration of the Club much easier. Congratulations to Marcus Cosgrave and Geoff McKinnon for their efforts in this respect;
- relations with the Evatt/Wests Juniors Club has improved significantly this season. This is obviously vital for the future of the Club. Thanks to Mick Brady for his continued efforts in this area, and also to members such as Darren Richards and Rob Thiel-Paul for their involvement;
- the production of another quality Annual Report. Our appreciation is extended to Geoff McKinnon for his efforts in these matters, and to David Jess for statistics;
- the number of social functions increased this season, including a Trivia Night. Thanks to James Harrison and Dave Jess for their efforts, and particularly to Darryle Macdonald for his assistance with the organisation of the Trivia Night;

- the securing of a \$10,000 sponsorship from Henderson Homes. The Western District Cricket Club is particularly grateful to Craig Henderson for his outstanding display of generosity and support, with no praise being too high for the initiative and commitment of Jon Fuller in securing this sponsorship; and
- last, but by no means least, the efforts of Marcus Cosgrave in securing a series of grants, some of which will be received next season. These will greatly assist in our move to Jamison Oval, and include a \$3,000 Runs for Australia grant (for covers at Jamison Oval), a \$17,000 grant from the Western District Rugby Union Club, and a \$25,000 Bureau of Sport and Recreation Active Australia grant (for capital improvement at Jamison Oval).

All of these successes are to be commended.

However, the administrative performance of the Club is not generally at the level it needs to be if it wants to be consistently successful. This was apparent in a number of areas, but some striking wide-ranging examples are the:

- general poor attendance and lack of organisation at practice; and
- a failure of the Club to carry out its responsibilities in relation to the Monday Night Raffle at the Western District Rugby Union Club.

There are numerous other examples of administrative failings that have hurt the Club. However, the Committee doesn't wish to dwell on the negatives, suffice to say that the two examples illustrated above underline the problem for the Western District Cricket Club, and the challenges it faces going forward. As a matter of necessity, this includes ensuring that each member makes some contribution to the administration of the Club.

Impossible it is, for a handful of people to successfully administer the entire Club. This requires a commitment from both the members and the Management Committee.

One of the roles of the Management Committee is to engage members to assist in putting in place and maintaining the administrative infrastructure. This means that the Committee needs to more effectively communicate what its policies are and what is required from members to implement these policies. For example, putting in place and articulating a structured system for practice.

However, every member must then assist in the implementation of the policies if they are to succeed. The greatest training system in the world will be of no benefit if people are not prepared to assist in running drills. The same is true for social functions - it is fine to have a great idea but if no one is prepared to help execute it the Club will not benefit.

That said, the Western District Cricket Club is about to embark on one of the most exciting and important initiatives in its history – the move to Jamison Oval. The opportunity this provides to reinvigorate the Club, so it can build successfully for the future, cannot be understated.

However, we, the Club, will only be genuinely successful when its members realise that they must necessarily, individually and collectively, in some way, assist in the Club's administration.

WESTERN DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB INCORPORATED 1ST GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT 2000 - 2001

Between the conclusion of last year and the start of the 2000-01 season we were able to experience the true impact that losing the Canberra Comets would make to Wests cricket, and more directly to the 1st Grade team. The loss of team members such as Darryle Macdonald (177 games) due to retirement, and Ian Garrity (166) taking a break, with Bruce Hara (149), last year's captain, and Duncan Brede (48) both relocating to Melbourne. The loss of this experience from the team had a major impact on it.

Unfortunately, this season was outweighed with more losses than wins (5-11), but six of these games were lost by less than 45 runs. In the bowling department, on top of losing Darryle, Andrew Jones suffered back problems that restrained him from building on solid performances displayed the season before, and six games into the season Matt McGann was also confined to the sidelines through injury.

Ben Keens then stepped up to show the competition what his captains have been saying for years now, that he is a strike bowler and capable of taking big wickets and turning a match. Ben was the best performing 1st Grade bowler, with 39 wickets for the season at 14.69 runs per wicket. With this effort, he polled well for the D.B. Robin Medal, finishing sixth in a tied vote count.

Wests bowling, through the example of Ben, was very competitive - no side scored in excess of 250 runs against us all season. Grant Smethurst, upon returning from his extended time in England, backed up 'Keensy' in opening the bowling. These two proved a great combination, offering inroads into all opposition batting line-ups.

Unfortunately, it was our batting on many occasions that failed to live up to expectations. Too often we found ourselves losing early wickets. If and when a partnership had developed, that partnership was seldom backed up with another – the old cliche 'one brings two' occurred too often and this allowed the opposition to gain the ascendancy.

Although our batting in general struggled when chasing a target, there were a few individual innings this season that deserved commendation. Firstly, Swee Pang's magnificent innings against A.N.U. in November, where he scored 174 runs in the day's play. He smashed their attack from pillar to post, continuing to accelerate his scoring at every break, despite suffering from illness. Of his six dismissals, 'Pangy' was run out on three occasions – oh, what could have been.

Dwayne Hall managed to score his maiden ton against Weston Creek and in the same match, Jack Scascacini learned the hard way why everyone else wears a helmet when batting. 'Scaz' top edged a short ball into his left cheekbone, which in turn blew up the same size as the ball that hit him.

Peter Widdup was another within our top order who improved throughout the season. 'Widds' top scored with 81 at Manuka, and along with Ian Garrity managed the season best 2nd wicket partnership of 101 runs. Together, they lifted the team to a standard that both the side and myself, as captain, generally hadn't experienced previously throughout the season.

Tim Purser's keeping behind the stumps improved all season, as did his batting. He was a shining light behind the wickets and is an outstanding example for young aspiring cricketers. Timmy's attitude and determination developed throughout the season and are testimony to his hard work and enthusiasm.

With the ball, highlights included Matt McGann finally getting his first 'Michelle' against Ginninderra, with the figures of 6-23 in a Konica Cup match, and Jimmy Harrison's effort in the last round, though he'll have to wait till his first ball of next season to complete his 'hat-trick'. I personally managed to achieve the feat against Queanbeyan, and four wickets in six balls. And Ben Keens took nine wickets in the match against Weston Creek (the ultimate premiers), providing our only opportunity of an outright victory. Our bowling was largely a team effort – there weren't as many 5-wicket hauls as last year, but as a team we performed consistently throughout 2000-2001.

Having been able to reflect on the season past, I must thank everyone who played under my captaincy. It was with great pride that I accepted the opportunity and challenge. I believe that club cricket goes through cycles, to re-build, grow and maintain. Wests has lost much experience in the past 12 months and now we have to rebuild. That said, we have perhaps had the season 'we had to have', giving opportunities to many people whom in the past would have remained in 2nd Grade. So now I look forward to seeing everyone again next season, and hope that individuals don't just walk away due to the phase that 1st Grade was in this season. We have a lot of talent within the Club which now has that extra year's experience, so if everyone can commit at training and the games, I have every confidence that season 2001–2002 will be highly successful.

Speaking of young blokes, another to come from the junior ranks this year and impress was Peter Lusted. His technique and patience are both very good, and I have no doubt 'Keensy' will be sitting on the sidelines watching him making a few runs within the next few years. He just needs to get into the kitchen and tuck into some of mum's good cooking to get a bit more strength and this dream will be realised.

Queanbeyan was then back for another crack at us, and thankfully this time we didn't have to travel, they came to us. Aranda was one of the best decks 3's played on this year. Jonesy (as in Shaun Jones), you did a great job with it. We made 9 declared for 258 - 'Sootie' Evans scored a solid 42, Hindsy an industrious 66 and the skipper 36. Hindsy and I shared a 99 run partnership for the 7th wicket, another 3rd Grade partnership record this year. Our batting was on its way back. We rolled them for 157 the following week, so a comprehensive 101 run win, almost making up for the previous two floggings they gave us.

Last round and we needed a good win or an outright, and Eastlake to draw or lose, for us to take the minor premiership on percentages. Thank god for Ginninderra! We rolled them for 61 in the first dig (Matty Broers snagging 5 for 2 off 4.5 overs) and then we made a slogging 6 declared for 138 (Shaun Jones 62). Ginninderra were put in again and Jason Jensen went to work, leaving them 3 for 0 after the first over. They ended up 5 for 19, all this happening on the first day of the game. Thanks to the 36 blokes who came through and played with 3's this year and to 'Cossie', who helped out with the captaincy when I couldn't be there. Next year, hopefully, we can go two steps further and take the Grand Final, but that was probably said last year.

The 2000-2001 season is one that is difficult to describe. The 4th Grade team that took the field each week was more than competitive, but if you look through the scorebook, the statistics tell a different story. Only twice in the season did we pass 150 runs as a total and no 4th Grader scored a century. Embarrassingly, no one qualified to receive the 4th Grade batting award at presentation night.

On the other side of the coin, our bowling more than matched any opposition. Bowling teams out for 120 or less was quite common. Unfortunately, the old adage of 'catches win matches' haunted 4th Grade throughout the season. Whilst the totals we chased were already modest, I believe had we held better than 90% of our chances, our opposition would have averaged something like 80 against us. That would have been a feat no other 4th Grade side could have matched.

For the 2000-2001 season, there were stand out performers that I would like to mention.

Leigh Lavery showed his abilities early with a 5-for at Aranda (four bowled) and ended the season in 2's, which I believe is a true indication of his ability.

Tony Bailey came back to cricket after Christmas and is probably the most unrewarded bowler playing Canberra cricket. If we could have managed to hold at least 60% of the chances that came from Tony's bowling, he would have ended the season with 25+ wickets. In supporting Tony, his tight line and length bowling allowed me to record my best bowling figures. The Eastlake batsmen found him unplayable and could only attack from one end, which happened to be mine. I can only hope that Tony will be around again next season, as I believe he must surely be due for a bumper wicket-taking season and I would dearly like for that to happen in 4's.

Other bowlers came and went through 4th Grade and performed quite well. Paul Goddard, who carried 5th Grade the previous season, started in 4's and ended in 2's. Bevan Kirk, an indoor cricketer who played his first outdoor season in many years, showed the potential he has, again ending the season in 2's. Both Bevan and Paul will form the basis of a very lively Wests bowling line-up for some years to come.

And Ajay Mehta, before leaving cricket to sell real estate, put on a bowling performance at Aranda that will be talked about for quite some time. Whilst bowling at the Queanbeyan captain, Ajay was dispatched over 'cow corner', and if ever a ball has deserved to have 10 runs scored against it, it was that one. The ball only came to rest after hitting a light pole, located on the other side of the cycle path, some 30-40 metres beyond the boundary. Thanks for the memories 'Jiz'.

I would like to make special mention of a young guy whom, from my point of view, is worth his weight in gold to Wests. Ryan Selmes is a cricketer who exemplifies the true spirit of how the game should be played. With the ball in his hand, he bowls flat out and unfortunately this season, without just reward. His efforts cannot be questioned with his intent exactly what a captain wants. In the field, he is electric – safe hands, quick across the outfield and a bullet-like arm. But overall, it is his attitude and application that stand out. On top of this, Ryan brought with him fellow juniors like Mark Russell to bolster the lower grade ranks. All of them will be better cricketers for having a season in grade and I look forward to watching Ryan's star rise with Wests as he slowly but surely reaches his full potential.

Further, I was lucky enough to captain a current Australian representative during this season. Kris Britt had a taste of grade cricket and showed that the world is at her feet. I sincerely hope that Kris decides to play grade full-time next season as she left her 4^{th} Grade team-mates in no two minds as to how much talent and ability she has. Come on Kris, I dare you, play men's grade next season and show us what you can really do.

And a guy who started the season as a broken-down bowler who could easily have sat the season out, displayed what he is made of by not only applying himself with the bat, but showing that playing lower grade cricket is not a negative for a 1st Grader. Andrew Jones, who opened the bowling for 1's the previous season, delighted the lower grades with his versatility. 'AJ' ended the season in 1's as a bat and topped his season with the Club Champion award. For me, it was his willingness to contribute to the Club, even if his first choice of bowling had been taken away from him, which stands out. I believe there are quite a few current players who could learn a thing or two from AJ and I can only say that his time in 4's was greatly appreciated by a skipper desperate for people to score runs.

Lastly, it would be remiss of me to neglect the 4th Grade veterans. Gary Lacey, Ajay, Geoff McKinnon and Glen Croker all played their part in the 4th Grade season. Who could ever forget five catches shared between 'Kinners' and Ajay in the one game? How could any opposition team be so unlucky?

And, it must be said, once again, the absence of competent umpires had an adverse effect on several matches this past season. On occasions, some incomprehensibly blatant decisions left all amazed and had an adverse effect on the subsequent conduct of players.

Wests has quite a few challenges as a Club and perhaps the Grade performances this season are a wake-up call. As a Club, we have both the ability and the talent to be more than competitive, but maybe the missing ingredient is application. I don't think there are many players who could say that they couldn't have contributed a little more during the season.

I for one am already looking forward to next season in order to show the hunger I still have to play competitive, successful Grade cricket for Wests. I hope I am not alone in this quest?

I look forward to the 2001–2002 season and Wests 4th Grade re-establishing itself as a genuine premiership contender. Hope to see you all there.

Western District women's cricket team continues to be the premier team in the local competition with an undefeated season. And in the process some new records were established:

- during the 24 seasons of women's competition, Wests have competed in 21, winning 15 premierships;
- fourteen of those premierships are from the past 15 seasons;

On a sadder note, the Women's team lost one of its foundation members with the passing of Margaret Hall in Rockhampton, Qld. Wests captain Sarah-Jane Moore attended Margaret's funeral. A minutes silence was observed by the Western District and Weston Creek teams, officials and spectators prior to commencement of play in round 11 (4 February). Black armbands were worn throughout the game. These observances were repeated in round 14 (25 February), when the Bookham and Wests teams paid their respects to the 'Don'.

SUMMARY OF THE GRAND FINAL

The Grand Final was played at Boomanulla Oval on 11 March 2001 between minor premiers Western District, and Weston Creek.

Weston Creek's captain Ianthe Astley-Boden won the toss and elected to bat. At the completion of the second over, Weston Creek were 1/11 with Anna Stewart run out for 1. Ianthe then took to the bowling, hitting three quick fours but was out leg before in the seventh over for 25 runs with the score 2/35. Further Weston Creek wickets went cheaply in the eighth, tenth and 14th overs, to be 5/54. At this stage Kelly Brett had two wickets, with Kath Brown and Kris Britt one each. Then Rachel Tokley and Genevieve O'Keefe put on a 30 run 6th wicket partnership, the fall of Tokley's wicket seeing M McNamara join O'Keefe for a 25 run 7th wicket partnership. At 7/118 in the 35th over, Bernie Moroney

joined McNamara at the crease and they took it to 146 in the 43rd over. Kris Britt captured her second wicket when Moroney popped up a catch to Kath Brown. Weston Creek proceeded to be all out in the 49th over for 160 runs, M MacNamara top scoring with 43 and Kath Brown taking three wickets.

Kris Britt and Kath Brown then opened the batting for Wests in a confident manner, averaging four runs per over until the ninth over when Kath was out Ibw for 10 with the score 1/35. Kelly Brett and Melissa Campbell teamed together for the fourth wicket partnership of 25 before Melissa failed to make her ground to be run out. Kelly also failed to make her crease in the 29th over with Westies in the box seat at 5/109 and plenty of batting to follow.

Captain Sarah-Jane Moore and Simone Osborne settled in and gradually whittled away the runs required until in the 44^{th} over when S-J was caught for 28, eight runs short of celebrations. Trish Jean joined Simone and in the 46^{th} over the premiership was Westies with a well-deserved win.

The 2000-2001 final was an entertaining match played in the spirit of good sportsmanship.

My thanks to the players, parents and supporters of the Western District Women's team, a team that has continually changed over the years but always with a diverse range of ages (14 to 30+), cricket experience and abilities that manage to blend and play together very competitively. The senior players are to be congratulated for passing on their enthusiasm and technical knowledge to the juniors and new players. In particular, 'S-J', Kath and Kris make the manager/coach role very enjoyable and rewarding. The Western District Women's team continues to be a wonderful group of cricket lovers.

WESTERN DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB INCORPORATED VETERANS' REPORT 2000 - 2001

Season 2000-2001 was somewhat disappointing for the Wests Veterans team for a number of reasons.

Initially the weather was our bug-bear with the first three games of the season being washed out. These games were rescheduled after Christmas, but again one of these, against Norths, was washed out.

When we did get to play, our performances were not as good as they could have been. The team won only one game against Ginninderra. We had a tight tussle against Queanbeyan only to be again interrupted by rain, with Queanbeyan going on to win by one after an amended run requirement.

During the year, 19 players turned out for Wests Veterans. Six of these were new players who had not had any previous connection with Wests Cricket Club. The new players were Brad Tepper, Michael Ford, Michael Bennett, Bob Hitchcock, Geoff Besgrove and Mark Slater. All these players made a good contribution to the team with Michael Ford doing well with the bat and Brad Tepper showing good form with the ball.

Other notable performances during the year included:

- Ashley Weston with the bat, scoring 69 runs at an average of 23. 'Shearer' also made his debut as a bowler for Westies. After taking 1/8 of two overs against Tuggeranong, he was thrown the new ball against Queanbeyan. His season's figures were 1/28 off three overs;
- □ Mike Sainsbery showing consistent form with the ball, finishing with seven wickets at an average of 9.29; and
- □ Greg Besomo's allrounder skills, which has made him a legend at both Waverley Cricket Club and Wests. Greg averaged 16.33 with the bat and took three wickets at 11.66.



A.C.T JUNIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR

WESTERN DISTRICT CRICKET CLUB INCORPORATED HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT AND FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2001)

Given the imminent relocation of the Club's home ground fixtures to Jamison Oval in season 2001/2002, it was extremely important that the Club establish a sound financial springboard during season 2000/2001 to meet the substantial relocation costs associated with the move. With this factor in mind, it is with pleasure that I submit the Audited Financial Statements for the Club for the year ended 30 April 2001, which discloses an annual operating surplus of \$10,700.

Grants and Sponsorships

The result is a tremendous one for the Club. However, it could not have been achieved without substantial financial support from third parties. They were the Western District Rugby Union Club Inc., Henderson Homes Pty Limited and Jamison High Grade Meats.

Extensive liaison with the Western District Rugby Union Club secured a \$12,000 development grant that is vital to funding various Club overheads, including:

- maintaining subscription fees at reasonable levels;
- funding ongoing capital improvement commitments;
- funding curation costs for Aranda and Kaleen Ovals; and
- a funding of the Jamison Oval relocation.

The grant may be increased by up to \$5,000 on the basis that the Cricket Club provides a minimum of one (1) table for a minimum of four (4) functions per year. Given this caveat, it is imperative that our Club acknowledges the Rugby Union Club's contribution on an ongoing basis, and I urge all players to attempt to contribute their time to attending these functions wherever possible.

The efforts of Jon Fuller secured a major sponsor for the Club in *Henderson Homes Pty Limited*, its Managing Director being Club veteran Craig Henderson. The sponsorship of \$10,000 has underpinned the Club's overall surplus for the year and the Committee has elected to set aside \$8,000 of the sponsorship toward refurbishing the practice facilities at Aranda, and funding the purchase of some capital equipment associated with the Jamison relocation.

Jamison High Grade Meats has again extended support to the Club via a \$300 sponsorship and provision of meat for Club barbecues at discount rates. We thank the proprietors for their generosity and encourage Club members to utilise their services wherever possible.

From a financial and development perspective we acknowledge the tremendous support that all of the above sponsors have given to the Club during the year, and it is important that we continue to nurture these relationships and return our support in kind wherever possible.

Subscriptions

Subscription fees were increased for season 2000/2001. However, overall collection of approximately \$17,000 was some \$2,000 less than budget, mainly attributable to a poor collection of 6^{th} Grade fees, and a higher than anticipated uptake by senior players of the early payment discount option. Subscription fees were as follows:

Senior men's subscriptions were increased to cover the cost of the imposition of GST from 1 July 2000 with a weighting toward full seniors (13% increase) rather than the subsidised players, being students and the unemployed (6% increase). Senior women's subscriptions increased by 25% on the full season amount to bring them into line with men's subscriptions on a pro-rata playing time basis, and also to absorb the imposition of GST. It should be noted, however, that the Committee maintained the \$15 per game rate for women, partially mitigating the lump sum increase.

Debtors collection in general was much improved from season 1999/2000, with the Committee taking a far more positive stance to enforcing the 'no pay, no play' policy. This could not have been enforced without the dogged efforts of Geoff McKinnon, who assisted throughout the season with fee collection. It is not an enviable task, but Geoff carried it out with aplomb, and I thank him sincerely for his commitment.

However, one negative was the abysmal subscription levels of 6^{th} Grade. Due to difficulties getting a team on the field from one week to next, the Club relied on some 40 players during the season. Most of these players played no more than one or two games, and subsequently disappeared. It is highly recommended that 6^{th} Grade fees for next year be levied on a per game basis and be collected weekly.

Club Expenditure

An analysis of the main items of club expenditure for 2000/2001 reveals the following:

- A.C.T Cricket Association Fees were nil for 2000/2001 as they have been waived. However, this reduction was offset by a corresponding drop in grants from the A.C.T.C.A for the year;
- A.C.T Ground Hire of \$6,045 was in line with budget (\$6,450), whilst Umpire Fees \$3,625 were substantially less than budget (\$5,800);
- □ Total Equipment costs of \$5,101 were less than budget (\$6,500), attributable mainly to a drop in kit equipment costs;
- Ground Maintenance costs of \$5,880 were less than budget (\$7,000), attributable to a drop in repair and maintenance costs on Aranda & Kaleen Ovals.

Overall, the maintenance of overheads was encouraging, and more than offset the lower than expected subscription collections referred to above.

Further Grants

Subsequent to the end of the Club's financial year there have been other very important developments:

- the Committee secured a \$25,000 grant from the A.C.T Bureau of Sport and Recreation, to assist in the purchase of capital equipment associated with the Jamison Oval relocation; and
- the Committee secured a \$3,000 Australian Cricket Board grant, which will be set aside to fund the purchase of new covers for Jamison Oval.

Securing these grants is a tremendous achievement for both the Club and the Belconnen community in terms of securing first class facilities for the Belconnen region, and brings to fruition the Jamison relocation that the Committee has been ruminating on for the prior 20 years. Our sincere thanks are extended to both organisations for all their assistance.

In conclusion, I would like to thank the Committee for their ongoing support and acknowledgment of the importance of the treasury function. Further, it would be remiss of me if I did not also acknowledge Chris Evans, Ben Keens, Peter Widdup, and James and Alexis Harrison, who assisted in various financial matters and tasks during the season.


