PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Members,

It is with continued pleasure to be able to preface another club annual report, this time at the completion of our twenty third season.

Certainly season 1991-1992 commenced as another of rebuilding, but concluded with a flourish of high playing achievement.

It was most encouraging to have our: Senior Women's team winning yet another premiership; first and fourth grades of the men competing in their respective finals and; several junior teams vying for premier status. This does reflect a preponderance of talent, pride and commitment among our club membership.

The playing achievements are even more admirable when it is remembered how young the clubs players are and that for the majority of the season the training facilities for the women and senior men were totally inadequate for decent match preparation.

For the ensuing seasons there are a number of areas that require great improvement, apart from the quality of training facilities.

Firstly, the need for more effective communication; so that the Club can be properly administered, the appropriate office bearers receiving advice and; information passed onto players so they are aware of what they can expect and what is required of them.

An area that should be considerably revitalised is the social aspects of the Club, where activities must be properly

base needs to be contemplated and a decision made on a long term basis.

A third element for improvements is broadening the resource base of the Club's administration, both financial and people wise. If on-field progress is to be maintained then the administration must, at least, equal that development.

Thanks to those who maintained the Club throughout the season should be apportioned to a number of willing and committed individuals. Particularly the grade captains who are left to fulfil a range of responsibilities, particularly on game day. Also the Juniors Committee, led capably by Eddie Wheeler, who co-ordinated the ten junior teams effectively as well as Kanga Cricket, and can take a deal of credit for the number of young players adorning our senior sides. Finally, Brian Hall for ensuring that the women's teams are cared for in every aspect. (Sadly Brian Hall will no longer be able to take on that role. The warmer climes of the north have proved to attractive to be denied in his retirement.)

Season 1991-1992 must now be viewed as a watershed for the Club's endeavours, as the last few seasons have only held isolated success.

A platform has now been established for the attainment of greater success. Not just for all players wanting to achieve and maintain higher playing standards, but also for those administering the Club's activities and doing so in a thoughtful, industrious and pro-active manner. Consistent effort should the primary essence for both endeavours.

JUNIOR CRICKET REPORT

Junior cricket with Wests during the 1991/92 season, from all accounts, was enjoyable as ever with 10 teams competing from Under 10 to Under 17, and some 50 children playing Kanga.

There were many highlights including the performance of the Under 14 division 1 team in winning the Championship; our usual high number of representative players and our performance in the Twilight six-a-side competition.

One pleasing aspect of our junior cricket season was the relationship we built up with Evatt in relation to Kanga cricket. Some 12 or so seven to nine year olds joined with us of a Saturday morning in the conduct of our Kanga at Canberra High School oval. The parental support from Evalt was wonderful and we look forward to a strengthening of our association in future sessions.

TRADITIONAL CRICKET

The Under 10's and 11's had a very enjoyable season, playing a modified version of traditional cricket. These teams played in a northside competition which was convenient from a travelling point of view and all three teams more than held their own.

The two Under 12 teams have both performed very creditably on the field and won about 50 per-cent of their matches.

The Under 13 1's had mixed success this season, but had a thoroughly enjoyable year, playing their cricket in the right spirit - for which Wests is noted. The highlight of their season was reaching the final of the six-a-side Twilight competition, in which they were beaten by one run. This performance showed what might have been only for a bit more luck throughout the season.

In forming a second side in the Under 13's Wests continued the tradition it pioneered by joining forces with In keeping with the spirit of even handedness, Ginninderra. this team played under the name of Ginninderra as our combined team last season, played as Wests.

The Under 14 age group was a real success story this year with both 14 1's and 14 3's playing for premierships. mentioned earlier, the 14 1's won the premiership in a nailbiting game in the last over. The 14 1's also made the sixa-side Twilight final, only to be beaten by one run.

The formation of the Under 14 Division 3 side this year was only possible through Wests offering to take some "surplus" players from Ginninderra and Canberra North. Coach Mike Sainsbery welded the boys into a formidable outfit and the team went down gallantly in the premiership final.

The Under 17's have had a very enjoyable year playing in the top Division and put up a wonderful performance in the latter part of the season, coming home with a wet sail to finish This was a commendable effort considering most of the lads are only 15.

The occasion was used to present special awards to our representative players, as well as parents to all players. Parents were well presented and it was great to see the interaction amongst everybody.

I should not let this occasion pass without thanking all coaches, managers, scorers and other helpers who made it all possible for the players to have a game every weekend.

Finally I would like to pay particular tribute to the hard working committee of Pauline and John Armstrong and Graham Bonnett. They were a great support to me throughout the season and enabled the administrative side of the juniors to run smoothly.

WOMEN'S REPORT AND STATISTICS

Wests women cricketers continue their dominance of the ACTWCA premiership competition by taking out the 1991-92 premiership. The record is looking more and more impressive - having been in the ACTWCA competition for twelve years, Wests women have now played in ten grand finals, winning seven, the last six being consecutive.

Despite the win, the season was not a real satisfying one throughout. It began with our captain of many years, Glenda Hall being forced to have the season off to try to heal a stress fracture in the leg, and a number of other players deciding for various reasons not to play. In fact we went right through the season without a complete senior team. With the assistance of a number of players' friends and the ability of some juniors to play, we managed to name a full team in all but one match, and in that, we managed to beat the pretenders to the throne in a one day match with only eight players.

Secondly, it was a very disrupted season on the playing side, with about a quarter of our games being washed out, and some forfeits due to the Australian National University team having troubles leading up to their exam period. Finally, I was not around for a bit of the season, having to be in Orange to oversee the Australian Championships, then going to New Zealand for two weeks with the Australian Team, and being tied up in Sydney for the Test Match against England. My thanks must go to Ashley Heddle for his work in organising the girls during these absences.

Even though four of our leading players were unavailable for representative duties this season, we still had form players in the team - Karen Hitchcock, Rebecca Heddle, Penny Brown

and Mary Johnston. (Mary only played a few games with us during this season). And Wests provided the coach for the representative team - Glenda Hall being determined to go to the Championship even though she could not play, managed to coach the team to third place, the best the ACT has ever achieved.

Perhaps the highlight of the season, apart from the premiership, came with the announcement of West's Karen Hitchcock as winner of the Chief Minister's Trophy as the most promising Under 21 player in the ACT. With this trophy Karen won a return airfare to England to play cricket (sponsored by Qantas) and \$1000 spending money provided by the Chief Ministers Office.

Our juniors team were showing some pleasing promise during the season as well. They finished the home and away games in second place behind St Clares. Unfortunately, they lost one wicket too many in the semi-final and were defeated by Ginninderra, who subsequently went on to win the juniors premiership. Four of our juniors, Jodie Young, Suzanne Rose, Belinda Wheatley and Melissa Button were named in the ACTWCA Developement Squad for coaching over the winter months.

My thanks to all the players for the way they performed during the season, and their application and concentration when put in to bat on a sticky wicket in the final. They deserved their rewards. In addition, my congratulations to the two juniors who played in the final - Jodie Young and Suzanne Rose. Without their efforts our task would have been more difficult. I hope all of the girls stay together as a team when Margaret and I leave Canberra for Queensland, and continue to set records in the ACTWCA Competition.

FIRST GRADE REPORT

"You've got to learn to crawl before you can walk!"

SECOND GRADE REPORT 1991/92 SEASON

It is hard to argue that when a team manages to win only one game during a season they have had a successful season. However, this is clearly the case with the second grade side. Success in this case is not measured in how many wins were achieved, rather in the improvement that was seen over the course of the year, particularly in a number of younger players.

Special mentions must be made to Paul Roberts and Chris Barnes (I think) for their efforts in winning bowling and batting averages respectively. Paul in particular put in a super effort during the entire year, a highlight being his effort against Queanbeyan in which he bowled every over from one end during the course of the first and second innings. He finished with 22 wickets at an average of 30.18. Barnsey also performed consistently during the year to finish with 204 runs at 18.55. Chris is one player who needs to concentrate for much longer periods and this is reflected in the fact that he had a number of scores between 20 and 30. He would have had a much better season, and probably would have put pressure on a first grade spot if only he could push on to bigger scores.

One area that needs to be improved is players concentration over the entire day, especially when batting and fielding. Numerous occasions players managed to get a good start with their batting only to throw away a golden opportunity to make a large score by playing a rash shot (see Barnsey above). This will no doubt improve with experience and maturity.

Other young players who performed well during the season were Swe Pang (232 runs at 15.47) our leading run scorer, Ben Keens (208 runs at 13.00 and 8 wickets at 28.63), Matt "numbers" McInnes (201 runs at 16.75) and Ken Norris. Ben in particular rates a special mention for the whole-

hearted effort he put in week after week. If more players

had this same attitude then their performances may have been better.

Another player to perform well during the season was Murray Eastman. While not setting the world on fire with his batting, Murray's wicket keeping improved significantly during the season. Only a couple of lapses at various stages took the gloss away from what was a terrific effort. A bit more work on his batting (the potential is there) will see him pushing for a first grade spot in coming seasons.

One pleasing aspect was the number of players who graduated from seconds to the first grade side at some stage during the year. Matt, Bruce Hara, Tom Armstrong, Damien Whitelum, Nigel Webster all played in the side during the year. While the high turnover of players was at times disruptive (31 players played seconds during the year) the experienced gained by these players will assist them in the coming season.

Overall it was an enjoyable season, one in which we can all build on for the coming year. Hopefully all the young guys will be back next season setting their sights a little higher. The potential is there - it is just a matter of application and hard work.

3RD GRADE REPORT 1991/92 SEASON

The 91/92 season held hopes for a 3rd grade premiership with players keen to have some wins under the belt early in the season to aid us in the run up to the finals. Unfortunately a loss against Weston Creek in round 1 and a draw against Ginninderra seemed to set the tone for the rest of the season.

Third grade managed to win only one game during the season, finishing on the bottom of the competition ladder. Despite a disappointing finish, we had many games that were close and if not for a lack of runs on the board a few more would have been converted to wins.

One aspect of our game that was most gratifying from a captain's point of view was the overall commitment of the players. Many times during the season when the team was staring another defeat in the face, players seemed to perk up and continue to be observant and enjoy the game. There was the odd undisciplined act of course, but that was to be expected. Third graders should be proud of what they managed to achieved and the way they always showed level heads and good sense on the field. This point was shown in the game against South Canberra at Forestry Oval, where despite only scoring 120 or so runs, all batsmen kept a level head, concentrated and stuck to their guns. I must add, it was fantastic to see the generally dominant South Canberra team walking from the field looking somewhat humbled by a gritty Wests effort. It is this determination that will see 3rd grade achieve great heights next season and in seasons to come.

But enough of captains spiel. A team consists of players, and 3rd grade had its fair share this season with a total of 42 different players taking the field for us. There were many fine and consistent performances during the season, many

players earning themselves a place in 2nd or 1st grade because of them.

With the bat, several players stand out. Tony Bailey batted superbly at the number 3 or 4 position with scores of 41, 40, 33 and 29 being one of the most consistent performers. Another, Stuart White was always entertaining and held up the middle order on many occasions. His best scores of 59, 45 and 36 showing him to be another 3rd grader destined for the higher grades.

Our middle order kept us going on more than one occasion and one player who always showed good form was David Piper. His innings of 64 n.o. against Tuggeranong was one of the best I've seen this year. A player who always gives his all under the most stressful situation is Geoff McKinnon. Geoff has held the opening spot in 3rd grade for several years and although he may be thinking differently always looked good. Runs on the board is one thing but to be able to be there to take the shine off the ball and frustrate and break the hearts of the opening bowlers is Geoff's forte. Frustration is the bowlers nick-name for Kinners, and we hope to see him back next season to try and get some games up on our Glen Croker, better known to us as Frog.

Consistency is the name of the game and one player who had the opening role and the tailender role was Mark Bradley. Scores of 25, 21 n.o.m 22 and 26 reflect his good concentration and determination.

There were many excellent cameo performances from players who were with us for 1 and 2 games only. Notably Andrew Armstrong 31 vs Ginninderra, Rick Bushell with 64 vs Ginninderra, Jim Mitchell with 46 vs Tuggeranong, Wes Stiller with 49 vs Canberra North/Daramalan and an extremely entertaining though sometimes bewildering 138 from Luke Healy in our last match against ANU (our only win for the season).

Third grade went through the season without a real strike opening bowler but that certainly doesn't take anything from our regular openers. This role was filled by Scott Bailey and Mark Bradley who faced some stiff opposition on some good batting tracks. At age 17, Scott Bailey showed great maturity as an opening bowler. With an ability to shake up opening batsmen with some good accurate fast bowling it was not surprising to see some good performances. 1/46 from 16 overs vs Canberra North/Daramalan, 1/23 from 17 overs vs Ginninderra, 3/62 from 20 overs and 2/47 from 15 overs both vs Queanbeyan showed that Scott has the discipline and character to be a great fast bowler for the club. Bradley matched his consistency with the bat with some good performances with the ball. He was always dependable when it came to making a bowling change late in the day when all else seemed to have failed.

Two young bowlers that stood out during the season were Graeme Abel and Paul Broadbent. Graeme found a secure spot in 2nd grade towards the end of the season but had some mammoth bowling performances with 3rd grade. One which stands out was the game against Ginninderra where he bowled 27 overs and took 3/35. Never once can I remember Graeme being hit around the park. Paul Broadbent was one of the quickest bowlers we had in 3rd grade this year and he bowled well in every innings. Efforts of 0/34 from 16 overs vs Weston Creek and 2/23 from 5 overs against ANU don't reflect how well Paul bowled. Hopefully next year he will get the new ball for 3rd grade on more occasions.

One thing that 3rd grade lacked in the bowling department was a spinner. Some players took on the role, including myself, but the absence of a genuine spin bowler like Richard Johns shortened the options of bowling changes, especially at some critical stages.

Being a young club, naturally there were many young players coming through the ranks and trying to establish themselves

at the 3rd grade level. Players like Chris Evans, Andrew Lunt and Shaun Jones showed themselves to be outstanding talents and will be welcomed to the club as valuable assets for years to come, building the base for 2nd and 1st grade sides in the future.

There are many players that performed beyond ability and to mention them all would be an annual report in itself, but each and every player was a valuable and dependable member of the 3rd grade side for the season 91/92.

As this was my first year as captain, it was certainly a challenging and often frustrating time. But it was a learning experience for me and I was always keen to take the field with 3rd grade this year and you could expect this being the intermediate grade with players going up to reach new heights and players coming down to get back some much needed form with bat or ball. I hope next year that there will be a nucleus of say 6 to 8 players who can form a solid and disciplined core of 3rd grade. With the experience of older players and an abundance of young cricketing talent in the club, I'm sure that with the right amount of commitment and a gentle thump behind the ear when concentration drops, then 3rd grade can bring home a long and sadly missed Premiership.

I look forward to being involved with Threes next year and helping to build a committed and formidable side for years to come. Thanks to all 3rd grade players for such a good effort during the 91/92 season.

T.V.C.C Captain elected to field a second time, which in turn gave us some much needed batting time in the middle, no-one appreciated it more than Paul Broadbent who made a nicely compiled 72 before Tuggers decided to call it a day.

Queanbeyan proved to be a side you don't easily forget after we met them at M.Donohue in Round 5. After winning the toss and fielding we managed to dismiss Q.C.C for 156. Paul Margrain was by far the pick of the bowlers capturing 3 for 19 with Dai Jenkins also capturing 3 wickets. After getting off to a solid start the undiscilpined batting of earlier rounds came back to haunt Wests. With the aid of Gary "Who's shout is it" Lacey and Steve Matthews we then cruised past their total with the loss of 6 wickets with Crazy remaining 41 n.o. That wasn't the end Crazy's feats that day as he made a fine job of the Mug-of-the-day Award and then impressed people at a party later that night by impersonating Ken Done by painting himself in quite nice colours.

Round 10 was also a one dayer when Wests met G.C.C. at Kippax. After being sent in some disciplined batting saw us at 7 for 194 after 50 overs. Luckily I called correctly and we sent T.V.C.C. in to A fine display of quick left arm bowling, aided by a track that was doing quite a lot, from Dai Jenkins destroyed any chance T.V.C.C. had of trying to at least last out the day's play let alone score a decent total. T.V.C.C. were dismissed for 71 off 45 overs with Dai Jenkins taking 5 for 18 from 16 overs. The sad part being that because of the softness of the pitch and the surrounding square, Dai fell over in his follow through and tore the ligaments in his ankle. Besides the fact that they didn't have enough players to declare a side until 1.27pm, it also showed up a weakness in 4th Grades ability to bowl to a "Slogger". In a total of 203, Q.C.C. only had two batsmen of note and both of them were in the above mentioned category. We also learned the Queanbeyan interpretation of umpiring with Jeff Clark bowling his right arm slow looping things, a very confident appeal for LBW was turned down, when asked why the umpire (Q.C.C. player) said because it pitched just outside off stump. When asked where would the ball have hit if it had missed the batsmans' pad, he then replied "Middle Stump". The Wests batting slumped to an all time low in reply. In a total of 124 only myself, Steve Matthews and Paul Broadbent could manage double figures. A top score of 36 from 124 certainly shows that our minds were not on the job at hand, with Q.C.C. wanting to call it a day early, I decided that we needed the bowling and fielding practice so we continued the game with Q.C.C. finishing at 6 for 118 at the end of the day. It was during this game that I learnt a few new swear words and took note that the W.D.C.C. book of cricket etiquette and the Q.C.C. book of cricket etiquette were worlds apart. The old Easts cricket club seemed like choir boys compared to Queanbeyan.

In what was to be the most pleasing game of my short captaining career we met S.C.C.C. at O'Connor in Round 13. After winning the toss we finally showed that batting discipline and ability that I knew lurked within Wests' 4th Grade. We declared half an hour into the second day at 4 for 263 with scores of 49, 50, 53, 22 and 68 n.o. gracing the score book. With a little more experience than I had on that day maybe an earlier declaration may have seen us bowling towards the end of day one, but the decision stood and we had to bowl them out, surprisingly they did not shut up shop but in fact had a bit of a go at the total in front of them. Paul Broadbent proved again his all round ability by following his 50 with the bat with 4 for 22 from 13 overs. Although the last of 3 wickets were slow in the getting we bundled S.C.C.C. out for 114, the most impressive win of the season thus far.

In the final round, Round 14, we met the side that stood between us and second spot, ANU at ANU North. After winning the toss and bowling I started to wonder if I had made the correct decision when they raced to 35 runs from 5 overs. I don't think Crazy Proebstel will ever miss a catch like he did that day, but we were lucky that we got ourselves into a position where we could look back and laugh at the incident, and not look back and cry. ANU stumbled to be all out for 100 with Paul Broadbent showing why I and the team expected so much of him when he had the ball in his hands, by returning the figures of 4 for 11 overs. A lost legend Tanvir Haque also chipped in with 3 wickets, making you

wonder what he could do if fully fit. In reply again we got ourselves in some early trouble, but Crazy, myself and Trevor Clark put together partnerships that saw us pass the ANU total for the loss of only 3 wickets. I still reckon there was a single in it Crazy.

The goal of obtaining second spot was ours. In the semifinal we were to meet a much improved C.N.D.C.C. at Reid. The reason that they had improved so much was evident when reading some of the names in the declared team. players had not played much 4th Grade because of their 2nd Grade duties, but that was a hurdle we would have to jump. Although he's not a pretty sight first thing in the morning, Paul Margrain showed that my decision to bowl first was a correct one. Pissy returned the figures of 4 for 37 from 16 overs as we bowled C.N.D.C.C. out for 177. Although our batting had finally realised it's own ability in the games leading up to the semi, 177 in a semi-final would not be easy. With openers Gary Lacey and Jeff Clark on fire, it seemed that we would pass the total within 20 overs. the game changed for the worse with the loss of 3 quick wickets, 2 of them in succession. We ended the day at 3 for 74, with C.N.D.C.C. captain on a hat-trick. The man for all occasions, B.D. Broadbent would prove to be the man for the job, not only did he see off the hat-trick but he also finished the day 68 n.o. as we cruised to 4 for 179 and a date with Weston Creek in the final.

With the wisdom of hind sight, and the lesser effect of nerves, perhaps the outcome of the final could have been different. We were fairly young, except for Piper and Lacey, we were very keen and most importantly, we pulled up very short in the experience stakes when it came to finals. We were playing the defending premiers, a side that had only lost one game all season, a side who had won the one day competition and a side that finished 11 points clear at the top of the table. There was one thing I was sure of coming into the final, that no matter what happened during those two

days we had to force the pace and we had to be the ones controlling whatever went on in that game.

We won the toss and bowled knowing that if we could knock them over early for a cheap total, our batsmen were in good enough form to score the required runs. Unfortunately our inability to bowl a "Slogger" showed with W.C.C.C. being 82 before they lost their first wicket. From that point on the game turned for the better for us as we took their remaining 9 wickets for 107. Once again Paul Broadbent showed why he was without doubt our best bowler by returning the figures of 6 for 34 from 25 overs. I would say that towards the end of the day Paul was bowling by memory but since I've noticed that he's not very good when it comes to thinking, I'd say that he was bowling on shear guts. To dismiss the defending premiers for less than 200 not only gave me great delight but I also thought it would perhaps give us a slight psychological advantage. But alas this was not to be as W.C.C.C. showed why they had been the team to beat all year as they persisted with a nagging line and length that would prove to be too constant for our batsmen. They in fact won the psychological war in the fact that whenever a loose ball did present itself to them it was inevitably hit to a W.C.C.C. fielder. We battled valiantly to make 147 but unfortunately were not good enough on the day. I scratched out an unimpressive 45 with Steve Matthews again showing his worth with a crowd pleasing 39.

I wish to thank everyone who played 4th Grade with Wests in the 1991-92 season for making it by far the best season of cricket I have enjoyed for a long time. With the old heads of Pud and Gary Lacey, the knowledge of Jeff Clark and the enthusiasm of such players as Crazy Proebstel and Trevor Clark my job as captain was not as harder task as people might have thought. With the Shaun Jones', the Justin Kennedys' and obviously the Paul Broadbents of Wests cricket, we are in for a very bright future. From here we can only go up. No longer do we have the excuse that we are too young or

lack the necessary experience, we now have that experience so all that is left is for us to show our worth. Again thanks to all involved with Wests 4th Grade and here's hoping that the seasons to come are just as rewarding, if not more so than the one just gone.
