FROM THE PRESIDENT

Gentlemen,

I am pleased to be able to preface this, our Eighth Annual Report, with a few thoughts on the Club's efforts over the 1976/77 season and what might await us "around the next corner", together with my thoughts on how I believe we should be "gearing" ourselves towards a situation of continuing viability.

Firstly, what a pleasure it was to again be President during a First Grade Premiership season. My sincerest congratulations are again extended to Dene Moore and the First Grade side for again, under somewhat difficult circumstances, "doing the Club proud" by retaining the Premiership first won in 1975/76. On this point, when-oh-when will common sense and a little thought prevail and satisfactory "covers" be purchased for our ostensibly, premier cricket ground, Manuka Oval. How on earth we can hope to reach "Statehood" in the cricketing sense if the ACTCA does not re-direct its thinking towards investment proposals most beneficial towards encouraging improved standards in the game in the ACT.

Now that I have "got that off my chest", let me move to several more parochial matters. What of the 1976/77 season! I would venture to say that most, if not all of you would agree that in the overall sense, the results achieved last season were not really those you would hastily "rush off to Mum with"! Let me sum up the situation by offering the view that what was missing last season was, simply, a concerted Club effort on everyone's part to ensure that the "spirit" derived during the previous season was maintained. It really boils down to "too much responsibility shared by too few members". This can quite easily be overcome if we all share a common view - and that is to commit ourselves to keeping Wests at the top of the ACTCA District scene, both on and off the field. If we all acquire and retain this desire, I am confident we can master the difficulties before us and prove that we are, in all respects, the PREMIER CLUB in ACT Cricket. Within the Club, I know we have sufficient expertise to "bat on" with vigour and it is just a question of "putting it together", in the interests of a continuation of the memorable times we have shared together on and off the field. I trust you will all take this little "verbal nudge" in the right spirit and rally together next season to ensure we continue to make progress towards a more permanent degree of viability.

I was most encouraged with the response to the imposition of the recent \$15 levy on those of you who had played in more than seven matches last season. This was necessary to enable the Club to overcome a short-term liquidity problem, and this it did. I think you will agree that, given the relatively significant program of "asset building" we undertook

during the season, our limited resources were well-directed, even though our bank balance is a little "thin". We acquired a refrigerator for Aranda, rubber mats for "bowling aids" at practice, coir practice mats, etc. We were unfortunate that our enterprising move to bring Tony Greig to Canberra was not a financial success because of a lack of support from cricket-lovers in the ACT. Our major raffle was also a financial disappointment, due to lack of support. We just cannot afford to continue to sustain losses in our social activities, and I feel we can overcome this next season with a thoughtful attitude to fund-raising.

A most important development in the Club's history occurred in June 1977, when the Club was officially admitted as an affiliated Club of the Western District Rugby Union Club Inc. This will mean, inter alia, that we will benefit financially each year, in the form of a percentage of the gross membership receipts of the Licensed Club. It is therefore in our interests for as many cricketers as possible to become members of the Licensed Club, thus increasing our subsidy and enabling us to keep our subscriptions and other levies on members at reasonable levels. Despite rumours being spread last season about "West's subs being \$80", our actual subscription of \$45 was in fact one of the more attractive in the ACT District Club context.

Where do we go from here? I am optimistic that we can move ahead with some success in the future. Given that the Club has a strong junior network, and a promising one at that, and that it is likely that eight district clubs will be the "norm" for the next few years, I think we can look forward to some real growth in the Club, despite the deleterious effects on our playing strength of the sub-district club "creation" that took place with considerable intensity all around our hinterland. I believe it is a pity that too many cricketers in Canberra would rather play in the sub-district competition week after week, without aspiring to move into the more competitive arena of district cricket and perhaps to representative honours. I am sure we are not the only district club to feel the pinch (or poach!) from player "departures" to sub-district clubs.

The 1976/77 recipients of the Peter Rudge Trophy and C.B.C. Bank Trophy for the Best Club "Sticker" and Most Improved Player, respectively, were Mal Marshall and Bruce Willett, both very worthy winners. Mal was always "thinking Wests" during the season while I am sure Bruce has a big future ahead of him in cricket.

I would like to congratulate Gerry Garrity and his Junior Committee for all that was achieved in the Junior side of the Club during the season.

The Club won the Junior Club Championship during the year and was represented in several matches arranged by the junior element of the ACTCA. Congratulations are also extended to Bruce Willett, David Reed and Alistair Meek, who were selected in the ACT Schoolboy team which visited Hobart for the Australian Championships.

My thanks go to those club members who assisted in the running of the club during the season. It was unfortunate that the club was forced to operate without the benefit of the services of an Honorary Secretary for half the season and this really taxed our remaining resources. At this point, I would like to thank Alan Casey for the diligent contribution he made towards the running of the club during his term as Honorary Secretary. I also thank the captains of club teams for their efforts during the year. We should not forget the fine contribution made by the evergreen Vic Cristofani in providing an unselfish and learned coaching facility to all those junior and senior members who found that much benefit could be derived from Vic's counselling - the video-replay tells no lie!

During the season many of us acquired a greater appreciation of the subtleties of turf pitch preparation. I think our experience with Aranda and O'Connor during the year was most beneficial. Apart from the revenue aspects that accrued from Sunday hiring thereof, I believe the standard of wicket-preparation maintained by the club did us proud. I, for one, actually began to enjoy lugging and roller and chasing the 'mower', after the initial stiffness had left! With the greater co-operation of more members, the wicket-preparation duties next season should be "a piece of cake". I wish to thank, particularly, Mal Marshall, Alan Casey, Frank Eade, Steve Marshall, Dene Moore and Doug Osborne for "taking the brunt" of the responsibilities in this regard. I am sure "Uncle" Frank was tempted to again don his "creams" after his distinguished service "on the wickets" during the season!

While I am delivering platitudinous asides, it would be remiss of me if I did not thank Wests' Rugby Union Club for their valued assistance during the season. We are fortunate that Secretary/Manager, Burnie Ashmore is such a stoic sports-lover and the Club - both of them in fact - is fortunate to have the benefit of his services. It is to be hoped that his degree of senility can be arrested to enable us to get another 20 years out of him! (there goes our subsidy!)

Finally, I would direct your attention to our parent body - the ACT Cricket Association. I have always believed that the ACTCA is only as strong and effective as the clubs allow it to be. We must remember that, while aspiring to "Statehood", the ACTCA is still very much a "Cinderella" and it is up to the district clubs, in particular, to ensure the Association

does not become moribund and "die on the vine". For this reason, I believe a more professional approach is necessary in this regard, as is epitomised in other quarters of the cricketing world. Far too much burden is placed on "amateur" administrators in parent Associations these days and the lack of appropriate financial remuneration is a contributing factor - given that in this commercial day and age, people are becoming more reluctant to "sell themselves short" in the marketplace. I hope this aspect is given more thought in ACTCA and club circles.

Let us not forget our "better halves" for agreeing with us that cricket not only "maketh the man" but also "maketh the woman"! It was good to note that the club benefitted, in the pictorial as well as intellectual sense, through the acquisition of further feminine "pulchritudinousness" during the season. I am sure we can "more than hold our own" in the femininity stakes and thank you girls for your support.

Well, it is almost "goodnight from him" so I will conclude this epistle by thanking the outgoing Management Committee for another "slack year's work" and wish the incoming Committee all the best for next season - why don't we all try to make it's job that much easier by each assisting whenever we are asked to. Cricket will be the winner in the long run.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

Gentlemen,

On behalf of the Management Committee, I submit this Eighth Annual Report and Financial Statement of the Western District Cricket Club for your information and adoption.

Following the Annual General Meeting of 26 July 1976, the Committee met formally on eight occasions during the 1976/77 season. During the season, the Committee accepted with regret the resignation of the Honorary Secretary, Alan Casey. Details of the changes that were effected during the year are reflected earlier in the Report.

The Committee took on a "new look" compared with the previous season and, generally speaking, performed its functions in accordance with the degree of expertise available to it. It is to be hoped that some continuity of representation will be maintained for the season ahead to enable further development of policies and procedures.

On the field, the First Grade side again took the honours, by taking out the premiership for the second year in a row. The Seconds and Thirds performed well to reach the semi-finals but were unable to "take the matter further" as did the Firsts, who were able to retain the premiership after finishing in fourth position at the end of the home-and-away competition. Our two sub-district sides met with fluctuating fortunes during the season. It was with much regret that the club was forced to withdraw from the sub-district B competition during the year, due to what it is hoped will prove to be only a temporary player shortage. It is of interest to note that since 1969/70, the Club's initial season in ACTCA competition, this is the first occasion the club has had to withdraw from a competition in any grade due to player shortage. No doubt cost factors, and the introduction of the sub-district competitions, together with the removal of the Fourth and Fifth Grade competitions, were major factors contributing to this position. It is a fact of life that district clubs, for cost reasons, will find it increasingly difficult to compete for the available sub-district cricketing talent - this could lead to district clubs "opting out" of the sub-district scene in the future.

The club had a highly successful season in the Junior Competition, winning the Junior Club Championship. Further details on this aspect are set out later in this Report. It is most encouraging to witness the development of the Club's Junior element, which augers well for the future success of the Club. Our thanks are extended to those who performed coaching and managerial duties in this regard during the season.

The 1976/77 season was not a memorable one for the club in the financial sense. At the commencement of the season, it was possible to retain a fee structure of reasonable proportion, due ostensibly to the

expected revenue to be derived from ground hire. However, losses incurred on the Tony Greig visit and the recent club raffle, together with the ever-increasing costs facing district clubs in making it possible for us to play cricket, contributed to funds "run-down" during the season. However, it should be noted that the Club was able to acquire certain additional assets, which should bring benefits to members in the seasons ahead.

Compared with last season, the Club's 1976/77 social calendar was extremely dismal. Many ideas have been advanced on ways of overcoming this situation in the forthcoming season and the Committee is confident that the club will quickly return to the brisk social scene of 1975/76. Like all facets of "life's vast rich tapestry", cyclical changes occur and early indications point to a social revival next season.

sharing in the prize money. The club also reached the semi-final of the East Canberra C.C./Roneo Vickers knock-out twilight competition.

The Committee congratulates the above two clubs on their enterprise in the running of these two innovative competitions.

During the season, the club undertook the preparation of the turf centre wicket at the O'Connor Oval and the turf centre and practice wickets at Aranda Oval. While the task of wicket preparation was spread over a small band of willing workers, it was agreed that the club should apply to undertake the same task next season. Apart from the cost aspects, the club benefitted considerably from the experience and better wickets that were derived in this regard.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The 1976/77 season brought a number of changes to the Club, but perhaps the most significant was the leasing by the club of O'Connor and Aranda Ovals. This had influences across many aspects of club activity not the least being the financial side.

By leasing these ovals, the Committee was able to keep subscriptions at the 1975/76 level of \$45, but in doing this the Committee anticipated that members would assist the club in other ways, such as wicket preparation and the raising of funds through traditional measures such as raffles. Unfortunately, the Committee received only isolated support.

On the issue of finance, our success at fund-raising by raffles, etc. was ludicrous. Activities which were intended to raise funds, or at least break even, recorded a combined LOSS of nearly \$450! Such a performance can arise only from complete apathy on the part of the average club member, and will give the incoming Committee little confidence for fund-raising in 1977/78.

During the season, in anticipation of some support for the raffle conducted in the latter half of the season, the Committee purchased items such as mats for practice wickets, a refrigerator for the Aranda pavilion and a significant supply of gear, thus converting our liquid assets to assets of a more substantial nature. In retrospect, this seems to have been rather cavalier since the raffle's unexpected failure resulted in a "liquidity crisis" which made it necessary for a levy to be imposed on members who had played most of the season. The proceeds of the levy have gone a considerable way to overcoming our difficulties but we still have some way to go.

The coming season is likely to find our financial burdens increased. In these circumstances, members will have to accept that cricket is going to cost in dollars and other forms of support of the club. If members don't accept this and co-operate better than in 1976/77 Wests have a dismal future.

I would however like to make the following comments

- (1) There were a number of payments made during the year which have not been approved by the Committee. However, I am satisfied that this was merely an oversight. The expenditure was on essential items and was generally for small amounts.
- (2) The values shown for the fixed assets are those of the Treasurer. I have accepted his estimate of their worth and so I have not sighted the articles.
- (3) The estimate for the provision for doubtful debts is that of the Treasurer.
- (4) Insufficient records of the raffles and fund raising activities were kept. This does not allow me to fully investigate these activities.

### JUNIOR COMMITTEE'S REPORT

Thirteen sides represented the club in the past season. There was a poor response on registration day - in fact in some age groups there were insufficient players to justify a team. In the Under 11 group, for example, only 6 players registered. The Junior Committee took the initiative and entered a team and within six weeks of the commencement of the commencement of the competition, 17 players were participating. This number would have increased further except that boys had to be turned away as it would have been unfair to those who had registered by the required date. In the lowest age group, Under 10, 25 registered and 3 teams were entered. Within weeks, 48 were in the squads. This pattern occurred in other age groups though not to the same extent and most teams had 14/15 in their squads which made rostering of players difficult particularly in two day matches. By the time the season had got under way another four teams could have been entered. The Committee has recommended that next season, boys who played the previous year be approached before registration day to determine their availability. This should ensure that squads will be kept to workable numbers and the optimum number of sides entered into the competitions. It is considered preferable to play one short occasionally rather than have 7/8 players per age division rostered off each Saturday.

The perennial lack of coaches was again in evidence but fortunately within a few weeks of the competition starting all teams had the necessary assistance. Our appreciation is extended to all managers and coaches particularly those who helped overcome our earlier difficulties.

Unfortunately the ACT Cricket Association did not conduct the Rothman's Cricket Coaching Classes during the season. Those who had participated the previous season believed them to be extremely useful and it is felt that it was no mere coincidence that within one year of having many of our coaches complete the Course that our Club won the Junior Club Championship for the first time in the Club's history. It is emphasised that the winning of competitions and championships is secondary to the playing of the game in the right spirit and in the development of ability but it is still quite satisfying to see our boys play so well. In addition to the club championship, we won the two competitions at the top of the scale, viz Under 16 and Under 15 while the club was runner-up in both top divisions of the Under 14 and Division 1 of the Under 10. In all, ten of our thirteen sides made the semi-finals, five of them being minor premiers. We can thus state that from a competitive view this was our most successful season.

The Committee considers however, that there is not sufficient cricket for its junior players and believes that the Association should investigate ways of remedying this. To this end the Committee has recommended that a

knock-out competition be played in each age division with eight teams competing. It is suggested that not only should winners proceed to the next round but losers should play off for places and this would provide each team with three days additional cricket. The recommendation is that matches be of 3/4 hours duration on a divided over basis and it may be possible and even desirable to play all games in each age group in January on the same ground, e.g. Southwell Park. It is suggested that this would also serve as a guide to representative selectors.

The Committee's appreciation is extended to all those who offered assistance in many and varied ways such as managers, coaches, and transport officers. Special thanks go to Pat Wilson who had stood down from the position of Secretary/Treasurer but came to the rescue when we were unable to fill the position. Pat's contribution was quite significant and we as a club are indebted to him.

### FIRST GRADE

Another flag! Wests second successive grand final victory highlighted a somewhat patchy season and proved the depth of ability and fighting spirit existing in the side.

In a season often marred by adverse weather the side started confidently, suffered a mid-season slump but finished strongly despite a poor match preparation before the finals. Compared with last season the turnover of players, for various reasons, was high, 20 as against 15. Batting positions particularly were keenly fought and the selectors were faced with some difficult decisions.

First the bad news! The fielding generally was weak. Not only did we drop too many catches but we were slow, and arms were at a premium. Too often we failed to exert pressure in the field when it was needed. Also there appeared at times to be a general air of apathy - perhaps a reaction to the previous season's premiership. Attendance and enthusiasm displayed at practice were not good enough. Given the ability present, our inconsistency was worrying, particularly mid-season, when we suffered three first innings losses in four games with respective scores of 114, 106 and 120. Thus we only managed fourth place.

Yet overall the side was very, very strong. In fact I thought that on paper at least it was clearly superior to any other in the competition. Wests had a great team spirit and possessed depth and variety. We were particularly fortunate in gaining such gifted players as Russell Rogers and Tony Irvine although we missed the steadiness of Sid Smith from the previous season. Our openers, Barry Andrews and David Munt finished with almost identical averages in the eighteens and their opening partnerships in the finals set us up for respectable scores. Down the list Russell Rogers with 396 runs at 30.5 and Col Rowe with 394 runs at 32.8 led the run-getters. Despite a mid-season slump Russ finished the season superbly and deserved his "Man of the Match" award in the Grand Final with scores of 42 and 58. These followed a 70 not out in the semi-final. Col proved himself to be possibly the best stroke player in Canberra and bowlers have not yet been able to tie him down. The 83 partnership of these two in the semi-final was top class batting and a delight to watch.

Doug Osborne had another good year with 325 runs at 21. He was a model of consistency and is now showing the necessary patience for Canberra conditions. A batting highlight was the form of Greg Beacroft whose 81 not out in his debut in first grade in Round 11 and subsequent 57 not out in Round 13 earned him a place in the finals side. Greg is an exciting prospect possessing plenty of shots and a good temperament. He also proved a strong out-fielder. In a season interrupted by an overseas trip, Tony Irvine showed glimpses of his real ability and will obviously do better

next season. Vic Cristofani knocked up 200 runs at 18 apiece and was stiff not to hold a place in the finals team. There were obviously many others who contributed with the bat during the season and the batting depth was a notable factor in our success.

The bowling once again revolved around pace with Andy MacDonald, Mal Hall and Dene Moore, all taking over twenty wickets each. Andy really hit his straps in the finals and provided the fire-power necessary on the placid Manuka wicket. His first over on the second morning of the semi-final was a gem and swung the whole game back in our favour. Wayne Mathews played eight first grade matches and was a consistent performer with 15 wickets at 12.5. We were less settled in the spin department. David Munt with more opportunities this season took 21 wickets at 13.0 and although erratic at times he has an undeniable wicket-taking capacity and should continue to improve. A highlight was his 3/19 and 6/34 on the same day against Norths in Round 6 when he bowled some unplayables! Gerry Garrity came into the side in Round 12 and added depth and variety with his left-armers.

Any report of the season's activities would be remiss if it did not note the contribution made by those who prepared our wickets. Thanks particularly to Doug Osborne, Russell Rogers and Geoff Gelding and also to Steve and Mal Marshall for their efforts at O'Connor during the season. Doug especially was a tireless worker and I'm sure that not everyone appreciates the amount of time given each week.

On behalf of the side thank you also to Keith Hill for his help as scorer and manager when he wasn't away honeymooning and to the reliable band of wives who assisted with afternoon teas.

My thanks to all team members for your support during another very enjoyable season and let's work that bit harder next year and make it three in a row.

#### SUB-DISTRICT A GRADE

This side had a very disappointing season on the field finishing 9th in the 12 team competition, only 3 wins with another game, against A.N.U., resulting in a first innings tie.

However, there were several games lost by small margins and with a little more luck the side could have finished further up the ladder.

It was impossible to consolidate a regular combination and in fact 42 players represented the Club in this grade during the season. The fact that there were four different captains of the side also made it difficult to settle a team. Bruce Dockrill captained the side in 7 matches, Garry Beauchamp in 4, Mick Hromow twice and Warwick Pierce on one occasion.

The batting was generally poor with the side being dismissed cheaply several times. Only 4 batsmen (Garry Beauchamp 246, John Thomas 132, Alan Grigg 115 and Bruce Dockrill 112) managed to top 100 runs. The best individual efforts with the bat included a fine 80 by Alan Grigg and 55 by Alan Goodman, who shared a partnership of 123, enabled the side to reach a total of 6/216 declared against Easts in the first match of the season. Rain on the second day prevented a certain victory in this game with Easts 1/5 in reply at stumps on the first day. Other good scores were 64 by John Thomas and 53 by Greg Wilson against Weston Creek. These two shared a 99 run partnership and helped the side gain victory in that match. Alistair Meek with an unbeaten 55 against Ginninderra and Garry Beauchamp who scored 62 against Queanbeyan were the only other batsmen to top the half century mark during the season.

Wickets were fairly evenly shared among the bowlers with the leading wicket takers being Bruce Dockrill with 18, Simon Heggen 16, Phil Mitchell 14, Max Wilson 13 and Mal Marshall 12. The best individual bowling performances were Mal Marshall's well controlled spell which earned him 6/26 against Queanbeyan and a hostile effort on a wet track by Phil Mitchell to take 6/31 against A.N.U. Max Wilson with 5/36 against Woden and Bruce Dockrill with 5/40 against Weston Creek were the only others to take 5 or more wickets in an innings.

In recent seasons the Club has had several excellent juniors start in this team and work their way up the grades. The past season was no exception with a number of boys showing promise. Some should move onto higher grades whilst the younger ones will benefit from their experience and prove useful players next season. Some of these juniors are Robert Bradley who did in fact finish the season in the thirds after good early performances, his young brother Peter who although not standing much above stump height at the crease, displayed an excellent temperament and great ability with the bat, Greg Wilson, a very solid batsman who showed he is

capable of big scores but must develop consistency in his batting, Simon Heggen, who should develop into a top leg spinner as well as being a useful batsman, Phil Mitchell who possesses a lot of speed and fire with the ball but needs to concentrate more to improve his control and Tim Driscoll who returned to the Club after Christmas and showed outstanding form and potential as a wicketkeeper.

With these boys and others from the Club's strong junior ranks, some who have already gained senior experience on odd occasions, this team should enjoy more success next season and contribute towards continued success for the club as a whole.
