MEMBERS CODE OF CONDUCT

This is an area the Club has been poor at in recent times and the standard has now been set for the future.

Further to this is Peter's contribution again with special thanks from Brendan Duffy for his work in gaining sponsorships, this really helped us build a solid foundation financially. Ajay's efforts here are also not to be over looked. Also I want to thank Dave Jess, Trent Matthew and Darren Richards for setting up the movie night. Alisa for all her work as the Social Director and having such a successful trivia night, and the efforts of Alisa and Ajay for organizing the Old Boys game.

This now allows the committee to focus on some off season targets with the bowling run ups and the shading of the Kaleen nets at the top of the list. The work of the committee continues to grow and become more complex – the more people who assist the better the chance that Wests will continue to grow.

Wests second tour of the United Kingdom also took place over the winter and was hopefully enjoyable for those who went – the win against Chipstead critical for those involved.

On the field as mentioned the Club's fortunes soared. Firstly the performances of Wests former players on the bigger stage has been outstanding, Nathan Lyon playing an important role in winning back the ashes and claiming over 100 test wickets still excites everyone at the club. Ryan Carters outstanding first class season finishing with him playing an important role in the Sheffield Shield final at Manuka and lifting the trophy with Nathan. The Club's first grade captain being part of the Adelaide Big Bash squad and also John Rogers playing for WA. Other former ACT players making it in state teams around the country show the strength of Cricket in the ACT is improving.

The success of the season was exceptional on both a team and an individual level. A total of 17 centuries was scored, far greater than anything previously attained, also the number of bowlers who stepped up when their team needed them. Fourth grade winning both the one and two day competitions proved they were the best team in the competition. Well done to Suman and his players for they're success.

Third grade winning the T20 at Manuka a highlight and we were all thrilled with the success and happy for Prunnie as one of the hardest working cricketers I have seen to lead a team. Threes having struggled in recent seasons took on their skippers persona and made themselves a very hard team to beat and went through the 2 day competition without a loss unfortunately the rain stopped them having a chance for the ultimate glory.

Second grade were the dominate two day side throughout the year and even though the final was washed out there is no doubt the most deserving team finished with the trophy – the only disappoint probably being the loss in the one day final but as we all know anything can happen on the day and making it there showed they are an excellent all round team.

The woman's team again figured in the finals and perhaps had the hardest of losses by one run – this team cannot be far away from repeating the premiership of 2 years ago and their efforts around the club have been outstanding.

All clubs ultimately are judged by the success of their first grade side. Back to back two day premiers lets everyone know where we stand and also the T20 just to again show the flexibility of this side. Even missing the captain for large parts of the year, and several injuries, allowed others to step up which meant they were always in the mix. So when the full side was together when it mattered the best team again held the trophy.

So I would again like to thank all the sponsors, committee members, coaches, players and their families for contributing to this wonderful season.
