Training Facilities

Financial Position

Western District and University of Canberra Cricket Club Coaches Report 2014 – 2015

Season 2014/15 saw WDUCCC continue to establish itself as a successful club in the ACTCA framework. The hard work conducted by the committee and playing members has allowed for the club to develop into a dominant force.

WDUCCC was able to achieve great individual and team success again, and continue to build the depth throughout the grades.

WDUCCC secured 5 premierships in 14/15. First Grade won their first one day premiership since 1998/99, 2nd grade secured both the one day and two day premierships, 4th grade won the one day competition and 5th grade, led by stalwart, Jeff Clark, secured a brilliant final ball win in their competition. WDUCCC were again able to secure the Club Championship, for the 3rd consecutive year, a truly proud moment for the coaches, and great reward for the efforts of all parties. We made finals in almost every format. Disappointingly, after having all 4 teams in T20 semis, we unfortunately did not have any reach the final.

Through the off season, WDUCCC farewelled two star first grade players, Matt Condon and Beau McClintock to Sydney clubs. Both players were prolific performers in first grade in the previous season, and presented a challenge for us to fill those spots. We were fortunate to see the development of many juniors, who were all given opportunities in first grade this past season. Blake MacDonald, Sam Skelly, Tom Engelbrecht, Lachie Skelly and later in the season, Matt Gilkes, all made appearances and contributions in first grade.

The coaching staff and committee continued to develop relationships with regional centres through the off season, taking teams to both Griffith and returned to Batemans Bay. These relationships have allowed the club to continue to provide young players from the surrounding regions with opportunities to develop their games and expose them to quality cricket. We are collectively appreciative of the parents and families of these young players in travelling to Canberra, and spreading the word of mouth to other young players, that WDUCCC is a haven for developing new talent. The more active we are in regional areas, the more exposure the club can achieve, and the more players we can attract. Currently we have players from Wagga, Griffith, Crookwell, Goulburn, Batemans Bay, Ulladulla and Bowral (amongst others) in our playing group. Other clubs are envious of the relationships we have been able to develop with these areas, and we have seen other clubs make attempts and replicating our structure to develop their own player lists.

Statistically, WDUCCC saw many great performances again this season. There were:

- 15 scores over 100 and 76 other scores above 50
- 14 players scored over 400 runs, (1 player with 800+, 4 more with 700+)
- 16 hauls of 5+ wickets (one 7 wicket haul)
- 19 players took over 20 wickets (3 players with 40+ wickets)

Season 2014/15 saw the clubs highest individual score also surpassed, the new record set by Theo Valeri in the third grade semi final. Theo's 211 was only the second time a WDUCCC member has scored a double hundred.

The coaching staff had intentions of 'mixing things up' through training this season, and early in the season, we made attempts to conduct some measurable testing. Unfortunately, through dwindling attendances at training, and some other off field issues, we were unable to sustain this testing through the season. The success we have had over the past few seasons is no accident, it has been a consequence of hard work, and for the success to continue to be achieved, the coaches require commitment across the club at training and on match days. This is an area we can target to continue to improve into season 15/16. Continuing to develop players skillsets, and match awareness is of focus for the coaches into season 15/16.

Season 15/16 poses many challenges for WDUCCC. The coaches are committed to developing [players, and pushing for improved access to facilities and equipment. We are committed to developing new captains, providing opportunities to young players and to continue to develop existing members to enable our club to continue this successful period. On reflection, the 2014-15 season was a pretty successful one as a club. Losing nearly a team's worth of players that had played 1s, 2s or 3s in the 13-14 season, we did a great job as a club to push almost every side into the top four of each of the competitions, with 5 of those becoming premiers. We also were able to secure a third consecutive Club Championship, which I think is most satisfying one that we as a club have won.

For 3rd Grade our depth was going to be tested, so it was important to have some experience in the side. Jimmy Harrison who had played in 4s in the previous season was a very handy addition for us, his nagging line were crucial to build pressure and he also narrowly missed out on the 3rd grade bowling award. Matt Veitch who hadn't played regularly for a few seasons got better with his off-spin every match. It was a pleasure to be there when he took his first 5-fa for Westies. Having these guys in the team made it easier for me, especially when I thought that we may need a leadership change at the Christmas break. Both re-assured me that we needed to stick solid with the leadership. In hindsight it was really the lack of personnel available which contributed to a poor run before the Christmas break. Marcus Cosgrave was another guy that was valuable to the team, he brought some lower order runs and more importantly the Saturday quiz, which made some of the longer days in the field a bit more enjoyable. You can't underestimate having characters in your side, it certainly can lighten the mood around the players.

This year the draw was a little different. There is normally a mix of formats to fit the draw together. However this season saw almost all of the limited over games finished by the end of November. The main problem I had with the draw was scheduling a two day game over the Saturday/Sunday just before Christmas. I'm sure most clubs had issues with this, but I think having two one dayers at that time of the season might have been a better fit. Otherwise it was easier to prepare for each of the formats. Our record in the one dayers was excellent leading into the two dayers. Out of the six games, we had 4 wins, 1 washout and one loss. Our one day batting was more consistent this season. We were able to get ourselves in a good position in most games to push on to bigger totals. The only blip was when we got rolled by Weston Creek. Every other one dayer we able to bat out our 45 overs or chase the target down.

The T20s were a mix of results. In the qualifiers we had two wins and two losses, which meant we had to rely on net run rate to sneak into the semi-finals. Our powerplay batting in the first 6 overs was great in each of these games. The plan was to attack and take on the bowling when the field was up inside the circle. Our lowest powerplay score was 1/49, which set up our innings nicely. In the semi-final against Queanbeyan they were able to put the brakes on which limited our score to 130, when we were looking at pushing 160 early on. A quick outfield and some great batting meant we weren't in the hunt. Momentum is a big factor in this format, when a team is on a roll it is hard to peg back.

The two day campaign started pretty slowly results wise. Our first match against Queanbeyan was a tough lesson. Short on numbers, we only had ten on the field for the last hour on the first day, but our effort defending was encouraging. Queanbeyan

batted on for another half hour in the second week to set an imposing 310. We were in a decent spot to hold on for a draw at the last drinks break with 6 wickets in hand, but we fell in a heap to lose our last wicket with ten minutes left of play. Disappointing loss first up. We bounced back with a good win against Tuggeranong in a rain affected match that was rescheduled to be played as a one dayer. The last game before Christmas was played over Saturday/Sunday. I like the idea of a two day game being played over a weekend, but I think the timing of a full weekend game can be better placed elsewhere in the season. Our batting wasn't up to scratch in this fixture leaving us only 100 to defend, our bowlers were able to restrict ANU to 130, but there wasn't enough time left in the game for a second innings result. This left us at 1 win and 2 losses and outside of the top four leading to the mid-season break.

After Christmas, we had our last one day game washed out against Queanbeyan. The washout meant that we would finish 3rd and miss out on a home semi-final. We came up against Weston Creek, who in last year's one day semi, rolled us for 50odd. Our toughness with the bat started to show in this game. I was able to hang around for most of the innings to get 46, Jaffry batted really well through the middle overs to get 33 and leave us with plenty of batting going into the last 8 overs. Marcus Cosgrave got a handy 36 not out to get us up to 7/184. On a slow outfield it was going to be hard to chase down. Our bowlers were fantastic. Lachie O'Sullivan fresh from knee surgery only a couple of days earlier led the way with 5 wickets. Matt Veitch picked up 3 wickets, and the middle over economical efforts of Jimmy Harrison and Harley Peachey each got 1 wicket. Restricting them to 149 was our most complete performance of the season to date.

Queanbeyan won the toss and batted first in the final at Freebody. We jagged a run out in the first over, but it was tough work for our bowlers. Queanbeyan were cruising at 1/79, before Sam Wightman and Jimmy were able to brakes on a bit. We recovered to have them 7/161, but some late order hitting got them to 9/231. Sam taking 4/40 off 9 and Veitchy 1/27 off 9 the pick of our bowlers. On a flat pitch with a very fast outfield we were definitely a big chance. In the innings break the storm clouds were building. Jasyon Bush and I opened the batting and we got to 0/46 off 11 before a rain delay was to halt our progress. A long wait and plenty of convincing of the umpires to let us back out. We ended up getting back on the field with a revised target of 108 off 20 overs. Very gettable with all 10 wickets in hand. Bushy, after some refreshments in the rain delay came back out with a bang. We were able to add 31 in only 4 overs before Queanbeyan's rain dance worked, the rain halting our charge for the last time, needing only 31 from 30 balls with 9 wickets in hand. We got to play a replay the next weekend, but our under the radar approach was exposed.

In the replay Queanbeyan batted first again, Eddie Marshall picked up an early wicket but the rest of the powerplay was a disaster for us, a dropped catch early gave Michael Frost to big a chance and he set up their innings with 81 off only 54 balls. To our credit we fought back really well in the middle overs again to have them 4/178 off 30 overs, the only problem was only having 45 minutes to bowl the last 15 overs, or we could lose overs in our run chase. Luckily we got through the overs in time, we were able to take another 5 wickets and keep them to 9/266. Sam got 4 wickets again, Lachie and Jimmy got 2 each. Once again Bushy and I opened. We had a cautious start and were going okay at 1/46 off 11, then later 2/93 off 21, but we really needed to increase the scoring. Jaffry and I were able to do this and we ended up getting to

3/152 off 29 overs when Jaffry perished, still needing 115 of 16 overs for the win. As long as I was in we were going to be a great chance, but I ended up going out at 6/190 in 36 overs for 117. My first century for the club. Unfortunately I left too much work still to be done as we got bowled out in the 43rd over for 231. I would trade the hundred for a duck, if it meant we got the win that day. I'm still spewing I couldn't get us over the line.

In between the one day finals we resumed two day cricket with matches against Norths and Weston Creek. Against Norths, we ruined a good start, being at 3/150, all out for 170. They chased it down with 4 wickets in hand, leaving our two day comp on life support. Against Creek, who were at the top of the table at the time, we bowled great to have them all out for 91. Eddie Marshall took 4/28 and Jimmy again in the wickets with 3/16. At stumps we worked our way into a great position, being 2/42 with an entire day to chase down another 50 runs. That night the club had 20 year celebrations for the 1st grade premierships won. Talking to club legend Darryle MacDonald that night, he suggested we should declare as we passed their score to try and catch them on the jump a little. The explanation being, that you can bat too long to build a lead and not leave yourself enough time to bowl them out a second time. It entices the opposition to make the running as they would have to take unnecessary risks to try to gain points. Plus if you should bowl the opposition out a second time, you are able to plan the run chase better. It was an interesting insight and if it wasn't pointed out to me, I probably would have tried to get to a 50 or 60 lead. As it happened Jaffry and Jack Matthews batted faster than expected and we chased down the first innings target in 10 overs. We declared with an 8 run lead, mainly to make sure the scorebooks added up. In the second innings we were able to bowl Creek out again for 111, thanks largely to Veitchy's 5/47. That left us a target of 104 off 32 overs. The run chase was paced nicely again by Jaffry, getting his second 30odd for the match, guiding us home inside the last 10 minutes of the day with 7 wickets in hand. This was the turning point of our two day season.

With 2 matches to go, we were still in the hunt to make it to the top 4. Against Eastlake we had a washed out draw. We batted first and Jaffry continued his great form scoring 100, well supported by Dean Wickham who scored 69 to help get us to 6/258 declared. When a freak shower came down Eastlake were 4/121. Leaving us with a must win in the last round against Ginninderra. They sent us in on a slow track at Radford. We declared at 5/201 to give ourselves 12 overs at them, having them 5/45 at stumps vindicated the decision to declare. In week two, there was a bit more resistance. We bowled them out for 86 in the 45th over and were able to enforce the follow on. But the resistance continued, they got through to stumps at 5/147. The first innings win meant that we finished 3rd on the table. We were to play Norths in the semi-final, the team who beat us by ladder position in last year's washed out two day final. The wicket out at Harrison was a batsman's paradise. Norths won the toss and batted first. We were up against it pretty much the first 2 sessions. Norths being 0/104 at Lunch and then 3/233 at Tea. We had to fight hard in the last session or the game was going to be taken further away from us. Fight we did, not only were we able to dry up the scoring, but we also got rewarded for tight bowling by taking wickets. Veitchy taking his 3rd wicket started a collapse from being 3/265 to being 8/317 at stumps. All of the bowlers really toiled hard coming back for the third session. It was a great fightback, when it looked like we could be staring at 360 plus. Day two the key was to try and get their last 2 wickets as quickly as possible. We

were able to do this within 9 overs, leaving us an epic chase of 344 to win in 85 overs. Theo Valeri and I opened up and we got off to a great start, getting through to lunch none down for 60. When I perished, we were well on our way at 1/139 off 38 overs with Theo on 71. Dean was out shortly after to have us 2/156 off 45 overs with Theo on 81. After a scare when Theo was dropped in the 80s, he and Jaffry built an excellent partnership to get us up to 3/298 off 69 overs with Theo on 185 not out. Theo and Jordan went on to finish the job, in the process Theo brought up 200. It was an amazing performance, and he didn't lose sight of the finish line when he brought up the massive milestone, he made sure to make it a big celebration when the job was done. But to execute a big run chase you need someone at the other end. I thought Jaffry and Jordon were awesome on the day as well. It was an unbelievable feeling to have about 40 or 50 members of the club jammed into the small rooms at Harrison to belt out the song.

Unfortunately, the week that followed was my toughest week being involved with the club. Norths had lodged an appeal with the GCC about Theo's eligibility to play 3rd grade and it was upheld, and we were disqualified from the Grand Final. It was extremely tough to watch Mathew McGann break the news to the team at training on the Tuesday, but he also explained that we had plans to appeal the decision. It was a weird training session, and it was a big ask to for the guys to be motivated to train as if we were playing. Instead of celebrating the win it was a really empty feeling, nervous, not knowing the outcome of the appeal.

Our appeal led by Jamie Ronald and Bob Taylor was successful on the Wednesday night. We were reinstated. Special mention to Mathew and Allan McGann and the rest of the board for their hard work to get us back into the Grand Final.

Up against Queanbeyan again, at Freebody again. We were massive underdogs going into the game, Queanbeyan hadn't lost a match all season. We on the other hand, had just chased down a massive score, so it would be nice to knock them off in the big one. It all went wrong for us unfortunately. In the warmup, I accidently hit a ball into Mick Earl's leg causing massive bruising on his calf and also prevented him opening the batting. A forced change was to have Dean and I open up. Mick came in at first drop, but was clearly struggling with his calf. He battled on for 15, to get us to 2/51. Soon after Jaffry went out at 3/75, then I went shortly after bringing up 50 to be 4/88. Not an ideal start being 4/98 at lunch after winning the toss. In the second session Jake Boyle led the way getting 63, but there was not enough other support with the next highest score being 17. All out 221. We were upbeat about defending the score, but Queanbeyan had other plans. We toiled hard for the rest of the day, but they were chanceless in getting to $0/\overline{110}$ at stumps. Day 2 we threw everything at them, were unlucky to miss a couple of chances though. They ended up chasing the score none down. Comprehensively out batted. I feel as though our momentum got stolen a bit with the appeal.

It's tough to swallow with how hard it is to make a Grand Final, but this season has been one of my most enjoyable.

There was a lot to enjoy this season, most memorable would be out two semi-final wins. Against the odds we were able to stand up.
