I extend my appreciation to the members of the Management Committee who contributed their time and effort so generously to the administration of Western District Cricket Club over the past years. Special mention must be given to Secretary David Hunt and Treasurer Greg Besomo not only for their efforts this year, but also for those of the past years. I applaud the selection of Greg Besomo as "Club Sticker" it is a richly deserved acknowledgement of his contribution to West's Cricket over many years, as a player and administrator.

I would like to convey the Club's appreciation to the Board and staff of West's Rugby Union Club for their support and co-operation during the year.

I congratulate our award winners for their achievements this year and also to our players who represented the A.C.T. at both senior and junior level.

I have enjoyed my association with West's Cricket Club, however due to work commitments, I do not intend to nominate for any Management Committee position in 1989/90. I am sure that with a greater commitment and involvement by the players the forthcoming 1989/90 season will be a successful one for West's Cricket Club.

#### REPORT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Once again it is my pleasure, as Secretary, to bring before you the Management Committee report for season 1988/89. This is our 20th Annual Report a significant milestone in the Club's history.

I have noted in last year's report that mention was made of the negotiations which were taking place at that time to ensure the long term future of the Northside Clubs. It was said at the time that one of the important outcomes would be a proposal addressing the distribution of Junior resources and the responsibility for Junior development by District Clubs.

At a recent meeting of the ACTCA Executive a motion was passed reducing the number of District Clubs from ten to eight. This is to be achieved by the merger of four clubs, Northern District/City Daramalan and Easts/Woden. This Club did receive some attention during those deliberations and I would suggest that if it wasn't for the strength of our Junior's, we could well have been one of the Clubs being asked to join forces with another. This decision will have a significant impact on the balance of the competition and it goes to show that difficult decisions are being made to secure the long term future of ACT cricket with the Junior base as its long term foundation. The nett result to West's is that the zone for the recruitment of Junior teams has been extended. We now have an opportunity to take the initiative and make the best of the Club restructure which has taken place. It is also likely that the Club might attract some additional players as a result.

We have seen this year a situation where some members of the Committee have found difficulty in keeping up with the work of their respective positions due to employment and family commitments with the result that there has not been members of the Committee regularly at training sessions. What we have learnt from this is that whilst there are distinct advantages of having non-playing members on the Management Committee there can be disadvantages if these people are able to maintain a high level of exposure among players. All Clubs are faced with these difficulties to varying degrees, and I guess this will always be the case when the Administration of Clubs such as ours depends so much on the goodwill of a few who are committed contributing their time to this endeavour. Despite these difficulties your Committee has been able to maintain a sound and effective administration of the Club's affairs during the year. A good example of this was the Club Sticker award to our Treasurer, Greg Besomo; an award which is usually won by players on the field.

It is gratifying to see the excellent work which has been carried out by the sub-committee led by Mick Brady and Darryl Macdonald to develop a sound administrative base for next year. Please give them your support.

The Club is actively looking at a proposal to move our operating base to the Jamison Oval with a view to bringing our teams much closer together. It is possible of course that there will also be a redistribution of some grounds as a result of the changes to the District competition, however the extent of any such changes is unknown at this time. Work has commenced on the upgrade of our practice facilities at Aranda and we expect to be in good shape for the commencement of the coming season.

The work of our Junior Teams and Womens Team representatives on the Committee has been outstanding with some excellent results from the teams that they have been able to place on the field. We will never forget the performance of our womens team to gain their third premiership.

Again this year I have not been able to enjoy the privilege of being able to attend your practice sessions due to heavy work commitments. This will not change in the near future and I now find myself with very little time to devote to the important task of providing secretarial responsibilites for the Club. Having come from a Junior competition in Melbourne I have found the challenge of the Canberra Club structure very rewarding. It has been an experience that I will not forget. During my brief exposure to the position I have made many friends from the membership of the Club and I thank you for your support.

I am particularly grateful for the excellent work which has been carried out by Judith Andrews with the assistance and support of Mr G. Garrity to produce this Annual Report.

The Executive members of the ACT Cricket Association and the Cricket Committee have also been very helpful to our Club during the season and I would like to record the appreciation of the Management Committee for their efforts to administer cricket in the ACT.

Thank you also to the Management and staff of the Western District Rugby Union Club for their assistance and support throughout the season.

In closing and on behalf of the Management Committee I would like to extend to all members our sincere appreciation of your support and we look forward to seeing you again next season.

It is with pleasure that I present the 1988/89 financial statements for the Western District Cricket Club.

The club's financial activities for the year are quite disappointing. We have incurred an operating loss of over \$1300 compared to a profit of \$1250 for the previous year. To fund this loss the club has had to surrender one of its two term investments. This of course will significantly affect our financial operations for the coming years.

Perusal of the Income & Expenditure statement shows a drop in senior subscriptions of over \$1300. The cause for this reduction is chiefly caused by lower player numbers although there are several incidents of players just not bothering to pay their subscriptions. One can ask just so many times.

The club's expenses, of course will continue to grow in the coming year so it is hoped that our financial fortunes will improve. Of course if they continue to deteriorate then the club will really be facing a serious situation. Any improvement however will need a concerted effort from all members of the club.

I would like to extend the club's appreciation to WDRUFC for their continued support and also to those persons who were most generous in providing us with donations.

In conclusion I would like to express my appreciation to the members of the management committee for their assistance throughout the year.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT 30TH APRIL 1989

#### EQUIPMENT

Conservative values are placed on used equipment. These values are determined to approximate write-off of the cost of the equipment over its expected life. The value for the Juniors equipment included in the accounts ia an estimate based on the value at the end of the previous year.

#### GRANT

Towards the end of the previous financial tear the Club applied for and had approved a grant of \$2000 to assist in the construction of a new practice wicket. As at the end of this financial year the grant has been received but no expenditure had been incurred on this facility. It is expected that the total cost of this project will be in the vicinity of \$4000 including labour costs which are expected to be provided on a voluntary basis.

#### JUNIOR CRICKET REPORT

The 1988/89 season was very successful from all viewpoints. Twelve teams competed in each age group from U10's to U17's. Two of these teams, the U17 Division 3 and the Under 13 Division 1, won premierships and did themselves and their coaches Graham Bonnet and Graham Evans respectively proud. All the other teams thoroughly enjoyed themsevles, playing the game in the right spirit and bringing much credit to themselves and their Club.

Our Club joined with Ginninderra in forming a composite team in the Under 15 Division 4. The ACT Junior Council welcomed this initiative by our respective Clubs in making it possible for eleven boys to have a season of cricket which they may not have otherwise had.

Five boys from the Under 13's made the ACT representative team with Swee Tin Pang being the Captain. Two boys made the Under 14's while four boys made the ACT Under 16 representative team.

Tom Armstrong one of our Under 14 ACT representatives was presented with his Prime Ministers Scholarship award during the season. Tom was the first Wests player to receive this prestigious award and the Club is very proud of him.

The end of season Barbecue and pennant presentation was held at Western Districts Rugby Union Club for the first time. The occasion was also used to present special awards to the junior representative players. A special presentation was held on Sunday 24 April 1989 at Wests for our two premiership winning teams. We were honoured to have Col Rowe from the senior club make the presentations one of which was to Ian Garrity for being a member of the ACT U17 team which played in the Australian Championships in Sydney.

The strong link between the junior and senior components of the Club continued. One area which needs strengthening is the involvement of senior players in junior development and we expect improvement on this matter next season.

Our Kanga Cricket, under the expert guidance of Ian White, was as successful as ever with eighty youngsters under 10 enjoying themselves at Canberra High every Saturday morning. The players coming through into the junior teams from Kanga augers well for the future of Wests Juniors.

It would be remiss of me not to thank all the coaches, managers, scorers and other helpers who made it possible for the players to have a game each week.

Finally, I would like to pay tribute to the hard working committee comprising Fred Gill, Pauline and John Armstrong, Graham Bonnet and Ian White. They were a great support to me throughout the season and enabled the administrative side of the juniors to run smoothly.

#### COACHING REPORT

The season seemed to have been one of some successes and some disappointments. From a club viewpoint, we certainly didn't perform up to our abilities. On an individual basis, a number of players showed excellent improvement and many consolidated on previous years work.

If there was one aspect of our cricket that fell well short of the mark, it was commitment. Lack of commitment was constantly evident in all areas, and needs to be addressed urgently by the incoming committee and all individuals.

Other clubs are better organised and receive better support from players, which translates into a personal commitment to the club, the team and to individual performances.

Problems with practice facilities are obvious, however they should not prevent the attendance at practice that was evident towards the end of the season. Poor attendances by 1st and 2nd grade players, rostered for Practice Captain and Fielding Organiser duties, does little to inspire lower grade players to practice hard and seek improvement.

There was a core of players who practiced well and consistantly, and I believe they benefitted. I cannot list them all but John Fuller, Ben Healy, Rock Rezo, Steve Broadbent, Chris Barnes, Jeff Clark, Brett Kelly, Dave Middleton, Andrew Ratcliffe, Richard Toomey, Owen Swift, Andy Wilson and Luke Healy (when fit), certainly did their part in supporting practices. My thanks to John Fuller in particular for his assistance.

A coach can do little with a player who has no interest in improvement nor an open mind about his game. No player in this club should be satisfied with his performances and yet I did not see the desire to improve that I would have liked. Players either don't care or they have set limitations on themselves that restricts performances.

Not only did I try to improve technique, but I also tried to emphasise the psychological aspects of the game. Too many players have negative attitudes that reflect in their performances. I often heard statements like "I can't play spinners", "I can't drive properly", "I can't bowl outswingers", etc. If you believe you can't, I guarantee you can't. If you believe you can, you stand a good chance. The negative attitude at practice transferred to matches, where I'm

sure some players were beaten before they walked onto the ground.

Following the basics and approaching cricket with a positive attitude should be two goals that are at the forefront of everyone's mind for next season.

There were players who tried, who did work hard and did attempt to improve. This is all a coach can ask for and my thanks go to those players who made coaching worthwhile.

#### DIRECTOR CRICKET MANAGEMENT REPORT

Season 1988/89 for Western Districts did not prove to be a season many of us will look back on with a great deal of pride and satisfaction. In many ways it was a rebuilding year, with a host of new players to the club trying to establish themselves in the grades, whilst the committee itself had a few new faces. I take this opportunity in acknowledging David Matthews and Ken Norris for their efforts prior to this season and also assiting wherever possible in 1988/89.

I will endeavour to cover the major components of the cricket management portfolio:

#### Team Selection

A new selection process was adopted in that the Chairman's role was shared. Whilst this meant the workload for the individual was eased, it also meant that guys acted in a dual capacity as captain and chairman, in addition to having the first grade captain occupying the "club coach's" position. With all this doubling up, and at times dissatisfaction among players with the selection process, the importance in obtaining a non-playing selector appears paramount. A disappointing aspect of 1988/89 was the week to week withdrawal of players which at times left us with more than a full side unavailable. Awareness of the commitment made at the beginning of the season would not only improve club spirit, it would also increase the club's competitiveness on the paddock. On a more positive note, it was encouraging to see a number of our younger players progressing through the ranks and being rewarded for their efforts at training.

#### Club Practice

The season saw the introduction of the "practice captain" at training, providing the club coach with the time needed to exercise his duty. Unfortunately, this role was predominantly neglected by those rostered on and the majority of the organising once again fell back on the same few people. This area needs to be addressed so we can improve the quality of training, utilising the coaching resources available.

Another major contributing factor to the low standard of training was the condition of the Aranda practice nets. For season 1989/90 a fourth net is being erected and the upgrading of the other three is receiving strong consideration,

however, money may prove the determining factor. Clearly, if Wests are to remain a force in the A.C.T. cricket and be able to attract new players to the club, the facilities need a dramatic face-lift.

#### Kit Management

Season 1989/90 will see very little, if any, new cricket equipment purchased in an attempt to reduce the costs to the club, and ultimately the individual. As most players supply their own gear, the club feels it is time to cater for the masses rather than the few. The current equipment will continue to be provided, and hopefully will receive added respect because it will not be replaced.

#### Forward Planning

In the past season Wests experienced what might be described in economic terms as a recession. A steering committee has been formed prior to the Annual General Meeting in an effort to formulate ideas and provide direction for the future of the club. It is envisaged, with added personnel willing to assist the management committee, the Director's role will take on more of a coordinating task, overseeing various sub-committees. Areas to be addressed by the incoming committee include:- improving the junior development within the club; the proposed change of location from O'Connor to Jamison Oval as the number one ground; and the opportunities available for obtaining club sponsorship.

On behalf of the club's members, I would like to express sincere appreciation for the work of the tireless senior members of the WDCC Management Committee. I especially want to pass on my thanks to our outgoing President and Secretary, Messrs Alan Rapley and David Hunt, who as non-playing members displayed great dedication and support to the club despite demanding work commitments. Their presence within the club will be sorely missed.

Finally, with the introduction of new blood on the committee for the 1989/90 season imminent, we need to pool together our resources and progress from here.

But credit must be given to Leanne who took over the captaincy with such success and to the 3 juniors who stood in to replace injured players so eagerly. With the performance the juniors put in, it looks as though the seniors will have to be careful to retain their places in the team. It should also be pointed out that Wests were not defeated prior to Christmas under Leanne's captaincy - our only defeat of the season being after Glenda's return to the leadership. Makes one think, doesn't it!

The season turned out to be an all round team performance. Even though we took out the premiership, and were only defeated once in the season, no Wests players made the ACTWCA awards qualification levels. This was because the honours were widely spread throughout the team and there was not one star dominating as in other teams. This spread of ability gave us the edge throughout the season.

This win puts Wests to the forefront of the ACTWCA competition. No other Club since the start of Women's Cricket in the ACT has won 3 premierships in a row, and in the 9 years since Wests joined the competition, we have won 4 premierships, compared with South Woden 2, Forsevin XI 2 and Queanbeyan 1. My thanks to all team members for the effort and commitment displayed throughout the season.

A successful innovation this season was the entry of a Wests Junior Team into the ACTWCA Sunday morning Junior Competition. We managed to get a very enthusasistic group to play in this modified rules "average cricket" competition. Even though many of the team had not played cricket previously, the practices with the Seniors seemed to pay off as all players showed considerable improvement as the season progressed. In the home and away games they suffered only one defeat and that was in their very first match when, I feel, nerves got the better of the novices. But as the team learnt more about the skills required for this type of cricket, some incredible performances were posted, resulting in the team finishing these preliminary games as Minor Premiers. The battle of the final was closely fought with Holder High, who had been together for a couple of seasons winning in a very tight finish. A very good effort in your first season, girls - the Seniors who turned out to cheer for you each Sunday were very proud of their Junior partners.

I hope everyone enjoyed their season, and I hope to see everyone back next season to see if we can take out the double next time.

#### FIRST GRADE REPORT

We again made it into the top four and again missed out on a premiership. First grade definitely had the talent required to win a premiership, but fell short on a number of fronts.

In true Wests tradition, we did not value our wickets enough. The exasperation of having the talent but not performing, continues to dog us. Almost invariably we had some form of batting collapse during an innings, due mainly to the lack of awareness of the team to consolidate after losing a wicket or two.

A perusal of the batting figures indicates that, too often players did the hard work of getting to 20 or 30 only to get themselves out. Ambitious batting against steady bowling and good fielding doesn't make for innings building.

It was chiefly due to Ashley Weston's solidity in the middle order that enabled us to put good scores on the board.

Problems with settling on an opening pair and a regular number 3, was the main problem. Poor starts put enormous pressure on the middle and late order who were mostly natural stroke players, who didn't adapt well to the role of consolidation. Numerous changes to the batting order, in an attempt to find the solution, probably caused more harm than good.

All the batsmen showed what they were capable of on some occasions, with Ashley and Graham Bush making the most of their opportunities. Runs almost always came at an excellent rate and we were nothing, if not entertaining.

We usually scored enough runs to keep us in the match, however, particularly early in the season, our bowling did not have the capacity to bowl the opposition out.

By the end of the season our bowling looked strong, when we possessed the best balanced attack in the competition. Unfortunately due to unavailability or injury we never took the field with our best attack. Although we didn't bowl sides out with the assurance we may have, the batting only got on top of us twice.

Had John Buchanan and Dave Quayle been available throughout the season, I am sure we would have finished higher in the minor premiership and then entered into the semi-final in a far more confident frame of mind.

As with the batsmen, none of our bowlers had an outstanding season, with all of them showing match winning form only on one or two occasions.

In the final analysis it was our team effort with bat and ball, with no one player dominating, that enabled us to reach the semi-final.

If there was one particularly disappointing aspect of our game it was the outfielding. Both on the ground and in the air we missed far too many opportunities. Poor outfield catching off the spinners became almost epidemic and it became difficult to set fields to best use the fielding talent we had.

Missed run out opportunities at critical times also cost us dearly. Good opposition does not give you that many opportunities and even half chances must be taken regularly to beat strong teams.

With one notable exception our performances in the one-day competition were heartening. We contested the semi-final with distinction, losing a very close and exciting cricket match. The one day game suited our batting approach and our bowling was generally very good with plenty of options available. Ground fielding and catching was fair only with a few brilliant exceptions showing what we were really capable of.

Our performance in the two day competition was tinged with bad luck, exasperated by lack of application to the task. Two early losses, when we had the better of conditions made our late charge more difficult. Late season form culminated in a sensational outright win against ANU to let us scrape into the four.

Every player showed glimpses of his true ability. The challenge for each player is to make the personal commitment to change those glimpses into regular performances and to have greater pride in his cricket.

The team was generally a happy one and easy to captain. The support I received was most appreciated, especially Daryle MacDonald, Graham Bush and Ashley Weston deserve my thanks for their assistance and knowledge.

#### FIFTH GRADE REPORT

As a newcomer to the Club during the 1988-89 season, it was an unexpected pleasure to be asked to captain the fifth grade side in the absence of the regular skipper. I found it to be an enjoyable task generally, since the players were willing and responsive, and never at any stage gave the game away, even when we were chasing leather all over the ball park.

The side proved itself to be very competitive throughout the season, although a little inconsistent at times, and really only missed the finals of the two day competition on the strength of a forfeit to Tuggeranong in the first third of the season. This was especially disappointing since a number of players who had committed themselves to playing the game did not turn up until it was far too late. In the final analysis it was Tuggeranong who beat us to fourth position at the end of the season, but even prior to the last game we still had a mathematical chance of sneaking into the finals.

The nature of fifth grade cricket is such that it is not possible to maintain much semblance of a constant team, due to the fact that the higher grades must draw on those below when players drop out. This is an accepted part of the game and I am a firm believer in the existence of fifth grade to provide players for the higher grades, particularly the younger ones, and to provide these young players with a transition from junior cricket and synthetic pitches to senior ranks with turf wickets.

I am of the opinion that, given the reserve of players the Club had at its disposal for the five senior teams, fifth grade performed its function admirably, with two original fifth grade players being consistently selected in the fourth grade team during the latter part of the season, and two or three other young players performing consistently and improving as the season progressed. These players were prepared to commit themselves to playing virtually every weekend and also trained regularly which is to their credit. I will be very surprised if they are not playing in the higher grades next season.

As far as our performance during the season is concerned, I offer the following more detailed comments:

#### The Two Day Competition

Over the course of the season we finished up breaking even. We took two or three hammerings (on one of these occasions we only had nine players on the field for a substantial part of the day) and forfeited one game, but by the same token we had a number of victories including an outright win and a couple of other near misses. Our batting was generally a bit brittle and I think this can be attributed to a combination of inexperience and perhaps a certain lack of application. Our bowling was sometimes a little undermanned but every bowler always did his best and stuck to his guns. Our fielding was, in my opinion, generally of a very high standard. Players were prepared to do the hard things and a few spectacular outfield catches will remain in my memory for a long time. On the whole the team performed very well under, on certain occasions, some very difficult circumstances.

### The One Day Competition

The side reached the semi-finals of the one day competition, only to run into the powerful Easts combination, who eventually won both the one and two day competitions. We had some excellent wins, including knocking off Queanbeyan at the start of the competition, and defeating Tuggeranong after all seemed to be lost.

In fact the side nearly repeated that performance in the game against Norths and in the end victory eluded us only via an edge through the slips.

These two games are a good example of the team's generally tenacious fielding and never say die attitude.

In conclusion, I think that the core of players who regularly made themselves available, and trained can be pleased with their efforts, even if statistics do not reveal high averages or aggregates. The single biggest factor in our lack of consistency was the occasional difficulty in finding replacements for players called up to the higher grades. I must emphasise however that this is not a criticism of the functioning of the Club since, as I have stated previously, the fifth grade team must provide the higher grades with players as and when required. Rather, this comment reflects a problem common to a lot of other sporting bodies and that is it is sometimes difficult to find the number of players required to make the selection process work the way we would all like

it to operate in terms of attendance at training, performance, etc.

There is one other point that should be emphasised in this report on the fifth grade season, and that is the on-field behaviour of the team. At all times the team behaved in an exemplary manner and accepted the umpire's decision gracefully. The on-field demeanor of some other teams we played was not so laudable and on certain occasions their behaviour could be described as nothing short of absolutely disgraceful. In the face of some occasionally severe provovation our players kept their cool and maintained decorum. This is very much to their credit.

On the whole the team is to be congratulated on its efforts throughout the season. I am very pleased to have been part of the team and have enjoyed the friendly atmosphere around the Club. I believe that some of our current fifth grade players are destined for bigger and better things and I am sure that, given some stability, fifth grade has the basis of another very competitive outfit next season. I would like to thank all the players for their efforts during the season, and the Club's administration for making the Club run so smoothly. I look forward with enthusiasm to the 1989-90 season.
