PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dear Members,

I am pleased to present the President's report for the Club's twenty-second Annual Report detailing the events of the 1990/91 season.

Upon reflection the season provided peaks and troughs in our endeavours, however, the Club made encouraging progress in some important areas. Whilst the Club was not overindulgent in its on the field successes there were several outstanding achievements. Firstly, the Senior Women's team won its fifth consecutive premiership which is a credit to all involved with their activities. Secondly, the development of the junior base was most pleasing, with a good number of under-age players making a competent start to life in the Senior ranks.

The season also provided continuing opportunities to all players to participate at higher levels. It is hoped that after two seasons of re-building, and with the return of many players next season, that the experience gained in that time can start to reap some rewards. However, those rewards will not eventuate unless there is continued application and a desire to learn and improve.

The area that needs to be addressed seriously by all members is the administration of the Club. It has been evident through the activities and responsibilities the Club co-ordinates that there needs to be an increase in the number of participants in helping the future development of the Club. There is a real need to acquire the services of people prepared to alleviate the pressure being placed on a few dedicated members. If this occurs, the improvement and expansion of the Club's role, strategies and ambitions can be more easily achieved.

If the Club wishes to expand its current agenda, there will have to be a concerted effort to broaden the income base. This should include the attraction of sponsorship, varied revenue raising activities as well as a more budgetary approach to expenditure. Also significant measures must be taken to align all the Club's groups to help promote a greater Club identity. This can be achieved through both playing and social development.

It would be remiss if some significant contributors to the season 1990/91 activities were not mentioned:

- the hard-working committee of the Juniors and Kanga Cricket for their tireless efforts in co-ordinating another large number of participants
- Brian Hall for his wide sweeping role in the Women's Cricket domain
- Jon Fuller for his indefatigable resolve and application in the roles Social Director and Chairman of Selectors
- Darryle Macdonald for his role in generating cricketing development in the Club, which was truncated due to his appointment with the Association
- Dave Matthews and Graham Bushell for their sagely advice and taking on the important roles
- All Grade Captains whose responsibilities seemed to be innumberable, yet performed unbegrudgingly.

Finally, there will be a number of opportunities available for people to provide their services to administering the Club's functions. As there is plenty of scope to make a contribution, of any proportion, it is wished that Club involvement will be viewed by all members as one of their own particular goals for the oncoming season.

REPORT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

It is with great pleasure that I prepare this twenty-second report of the Management Committee of the Western District Cricket Club.

Season 1990/91 was one of mixed fortunes for Wests. Performances did not reflect the talent, once again, and the 1991/92 Committee must endeavour to overcome this problem.

A successful club is always one well managed. Perhaps part of the lack of success on the field stems from the lack of participation by members in activities other than the actual Saturday in the field. A few years back now a framework was put in place to ensure the club is well managed. Unfortunately the reluctance of many to assist has left all to be done by too few, with one member of the Committee also heavily committed outside. In addition two positions were unfilled following the AGM of last year. The two vacancies were subsequently filled, but it is a sad indictment to see vacancies for any period.

The Committee met on nine occasions during the year, attendance was generally good. Much time was taken up discussing cricket matters, with our representative on the ACTCA Cricket Committee, Peter Wyche, attending most meetings.

As early as the first Committee meeting the importance of integrating juniors into the senior structure was emphasised. It is most pleasing to report positively in this regard and it augers well for the future.

A plan of social activities was agreed early in the season and Jon Fuller worked hard to maintain the program. Unfortunately lack of enthusiasm by members was the only dampener to his efforts.

The Cricket Management portfolio was vacant for a time, a most disappointing situation. Members expect much in this sphere, it is the "bread and butter" portfolio and probably the most important of all. Despite the vacancy the Committee proceeded with plans to employ a coach, with Darryle Macdonald being appointed. Subsequently Darryle became an employee of the ACTCA and had to vacate the position. The concept must continue.

One early disappointment was the club's inability to field a sixth team. In future an extra week will be provided for team nominations outside the first

five grades.

Difficulties were again experienced in preparation of wickets at O'Connor and Aranda with the club being criticised on occasions. It is our responsibility whether we want it or not and there can be no excuses. Similarly it was disappointing to incur several fines for improper, or lack of, match/umpires reports. Again, there can be no excuses. Changes to rules for next year may arrest this problem.

Late in the year the Committee considered several changes proposed by the ACTCA for the next season. Plans are in train to improve grounds throughout the district, and Wests may be involved.

All clubs will be required to provide a manager for first grade teams. A system of points deduction rather than fines is to be introduced for some misdemeanours, such as poor or no match reports, or lack of preparation of pitches. An Inspector of pitches is to be appointed for the latter.

The deeds of all teams will be detailed by others in this Annual Report, but particular congratulations must be conveyed to our Senior Women's team and to the Under 15 team, both Premiers in 1990/91.

Finally the Committee expresses appreciation to the following for their efforts and assistance during the course of the season:

Office Bearers and staff of the ACTCA for their management and promotion of cricket at all levels.

Western District Rugby Union Club Inc. for its continued support.

Peter Wyche for his Cricket Committee activities, in particular his election to Secretary of that Committee.

Junior Managers and Coaches for their devoted service to the future of the club.

ACTCA Umpires for a job well done.

Members of West's Veterans team for donation of trophies.

JUNIOR CRICKET REPORT

Ten junior teams from Under 10's to Under 16/17's represented Wests during 1990/91 with the under 15 Division team taking out the premiership. This particular team, which had been premiers the previous year, showed outstanding team spirit and commitment to lead the competition all season despite the transfer to Brisbane of their coach Ross Williams at Christmas. The contribution to the team's performance by parents Phil Higgs, Dennis McDermott and Christine and Fred Keens, particularly following Ross's transfer, cannot be overstated.

While other teams may not have experienced the ultimate success of being premiers, they nonetheless did themselves and Wests proud. All teams finished well up on their respective ladders and the Under 10's and 11's, who do not compete for premiership only lost a handful of games between them. An outstanding performance which augers well for future seasons.

The Under 13 Division I team reached the finals of the Twilight competition, which was a very commendable achievement.

Three boys won Cricketer-of-the-Week awards. Ben Keens - Under 15 I's, Jason Voros - Under 15 II's, and Nicholas Spencer - Under 13 I's. Congratulations go to these three players for their fine performances.

Wests maintained its usual high representation in ACT cricket teams during the season. Representation was as follows:-

Games were played against Sydney, Tasmania and Melbourne metropolitan teams, as well as Albury, Camden, Illawarra and Western NSW areas.

The number of ex-juniors playing senior cricket this season was very heartening and the senior club deserves considerable praise for making these players of the future feel so welcome. If a smooth transition from juniors to seniors can be firmly established, then the future strength of Wests will be guaranteed.

Kanga cricket was a resounding success again this season. Conducted under the excellent organising skills of club stalwart Robert Scott, five teams of ten players played games each week at Canberra High School on such famous grounds as the SCG, the WACA and the MCG. A coaching session was conducted for the team having the bye each week and this proved both popular and beneficial. This will hopefully become a regular feature of our Kanga cricket scene. Our junior ranks will flourish as long as this nursery of future players continues so successfully.

While on the subject of coaching, the senior club ran very successful coaching sessions on a Tuesday evening, before senior practice. After Christmas each team attended one of these practice sessions and it is hoped these can become a regular feature next season. A special thanks goes to Darryle Macdonald for organising these sessions.

The end of season barbecue and parent presentation was held at Western Districts Rugby Union Club on 23 March 1991, which was the last playing day for most teams. The occasion was also used to present special awards to the junior representative players. We were honoured to have Mick Brady, Senior Club President present, as well as, Graeme Evans from the ACT Cricket Association.

I should not let this occasion pass without thanking all the coaches, managers, scorers and other helpers who made it all possible for the players to have a game each weekend.

Finally, I would like to pay particular tribute to the hard working junior committee comprising Pauline and John Armstrong, Graham Bonnett and Rob Scott. They were a great support to me throughout the season and enabled the administrative side of the juniors to run smoothly.

GROUND MANAGEMENT REPORT

Firstly, the committee and I would like to thank all those who worked hard and helped in the preparation and general care of the grounds. Special thanks must go to Mick Brady, Geoff McKinnon, Charlie Gifford, Jeff Clark, Graham Bushell, Ian Garrity and Luke Healy, along with all those who assisted throughout the season.

The 1990/91 season was, however, a difficult one in terms of ground management. There were, unfortunately, the usual problems with the break-down of equipment which started almost immediately the season commenced, making pitch preparation both difficult and frustrating. These problems were particularly bad at Aranda where, for a large part of the season, a small roller had to be used, due to the large one breaking down and not being repaired. This proved to be unsatisfactory.

Both Aranda and O'Connor had problems concerning water, either too little or too much, and this was also partly responsible for the poor state of the outfields at both grounds. It would be nice to think that these problems could be alleviated next season but unfortunately this seems unlikely.

Although the above problems are largely out of the control of the club, a serious problem which is within the club's control is the lack of curators willing to prepare wickets. For the whole season the Aranda pitch had to be prepared by the team playing on it. Not only does this place a heavy burden on the captains to organise this but it also generally leads to poorer wickets as no-one acquires a large degree of preparation experience. Having top quality pitches is crucial for succeeding within the competition, for developing younger players, and for fully enjoying our cricket.

Therefore, in my view, the club must seriously consider increasing the amount of money it is willing to offer to attract a suitable person/s to prepare the wickets. As well, club members need to be appreciative of the time and effort put in by curators in the preparation of the wickets to encourage club members to take on the job.

On a different note, the Association has decided that for the 1992/93 season, Wests first grade and second grade ground will be moved from O'Connor to Kaleen, with Aranda remaining our 3rd and 4th grade ground. At present, the

Kaleen pitch is in a poor state, but during next season it will be relaid and hopefully it should be of a high quality when we come to use it. This will also provide us with an enclosed ground and the club could take this opportunity to acquire some new pitch covers. The 1991/92 season should also see the laying of the turf for the fourth practice wicket.

Finally, I would like to, once again, thank all those who helped in the preparation and general care of the grounds.

WOMEN'S REPORT AND STATISTICS

West's women cricketers have continued to write the record books for the ACT Women's Cricket Association with another win in the Premiership. Wests have now played in the ACTWCA Premiership for 11 years; they have played in the Final on 9 of those 11 years, and have now won the Premiership 6 times, the last 5 consecutively.

Season 1990/91 was one of contrasts for the Senior team. While they began the season well, they had a shock reversal early in November when in the one week they were shocked with the death of one of their part-time players, and a traffic accident which caused a severe fracture in the wrist of one of their in-form batsmen. As one would expect, they lost the match at the end of that week (one of the 2 losses suffered during the season), and were without the batting services of Leanne Pepper for over half the season.

The feature which assisted in keeping their performances up was the marked improvement in some of the younger players. Making a fairly bold captaincy decision, Glenda thrust responsibility on them by opening the batting with Kathy Holmes and Penny Brown, and put Rebecca Heddle in at No. 3. That allowed the 4 older, experienced bats to go in at 4, 5, 6 and 7 after the shine had been taken off the ball to consolidate the innings (when they were needed). Our new No. 1, 2 and 3 bats can feel well satisfied with their season as they showed that they could rise to the occasion and make some handy contributions each week to the batting total.

Our bowlers never let us down, either, as with a wide variety of pace and spin to call on, the opposition was usually dismissed for a reasonably obtainable score.

The fielding in the semi-final was out of character for the team, with 9 catches put down, an easy stumping and a couple of runouts missed, almost allowing Weston Creek to take the game. But fortunately, the batting carried the day, and saw us through into the Final. This year's final was a triumph as a team effort, with very tight bowling, some spectacular catching and fielding, and some determined batting to defeat Canberra North Daramalan.

The Junior team tried hard to copy their Senior sisters. Fielding a predominantly new team (with only 2 from the previous season playing), they also

finished second on their premiership ladder, and won their way into the Final for the third consecutive year - and for the third time finished as runner's-up in the premiership.

After 3 of our seniors withdrew from the ACT Representative Team which competed at the Australian Open Age Championships in Melbourne for financial reasons, Wests were represented by Glenda Hall (who captained the ACT) and opening bowler Karen Hitchcock. Congratulations to Karen for her selection in the Australian Development Squad. West's players were also to the fore in the history making match on Manuka Oval when the ACT defeated the touring Indian Team, with Karen Hitchcock winning the bowling award, and Glenda Hall being named Player of the Match.

From the Juniors, Jodie Young and Kathleen Rolfe were selected in the ACT Schoolgirl's Team which competed in Sydney in December against the NSW Schoolgirls. Both performed well and gained a lot of experience. Kathleen must be congratulated for winning the Bob McMullan Trophy as the Most Promising Junior in the ACTWCA Junior Competition.

My thanks to all players, both senior and junior, for the way they applied themselves this season. They all did Wests proud.

SECOND GRADE REPORT

1990/91 was the season that never was. A reasonably talented group of cricketers assembled for a season that should have been far more successful than it turned out to be. The side performed well against several strong sides and won exciting games against the highly placed Queanbeyan and Weston Creek. However, throughout the season we continually let ourselves down in struggling to beat poor sides and even losing to them on several occasions.

Batting was the major problem, with the side continually failing to build a score over the full six hours. Cricket is a game of concentration and, unfortunately, the side could not cope. Continued failure at the top of the order put too much pressure on those further down the line. There were players in the side capable of big scores, however they simply found themselves coming in too early too often.

The only batsman who could be entirely happy with his season was David Cook. Dave performed consistently and held the side together on many occasions. He was rewarded with a First Grade position late in the season but really shone in the Seconds with a top score in the 90's.

Others to impress were Tom Armstrong, in his first full season in grade cricket, Gerry Price and Greg Gill. Tom in particular should push for a position in First Grade in the very near future. He is technically correct and possesses a mature and determined attitude that is a fine example to all other players.

Gerry performed well on several occasions but needs to place a higher price on his wicket. Players of his ability and experience are very important to our young club and his contribution was highly regarded. Perhaps we can look to greater contributions with the bat from Pricey in the future, as I believe he is keen to shake off his all-rounder status and develop his role as a good batsman who fields a bit.

Finally, on the batting side of things, I was impressed by the maturity of Greg Gill once we were able to get him to the crease. On most occasions he batted sensibly and was a good example to the younger players of building an innings. Players who have played with Gilly before may think I'm taking a shot at him here, but I can assure you his efforts were mostly as mentioned. Greg's major concern was staying fit of mind and body but, hopefully he can return next season to pl;ay an important role. It is very important that players such as Greg pass on their experience to the younger players coming through the grades at present. We have all had a lot of fun over the years with the club and it is important that we are now aware of our responsibilities in ensuring its continuation in the future.

If our batting was poor, our bowling certainly made up for it. The bowlers either put us in a winning position or salvaged hopeless situations. Their concentration, line and length were extremely goodfor a Second Grade side. They were able to apply and maintain pressure against good batsmen which was particularly pleasing from a Captain's point of view.

Alan Glasby and Paul Roberts consistently performed above themselves and were a fine example to the young players who played in the side. Whenever we were in trouble I could rely on these blokes to produce something special to get us back on the rails.

Another bowler to perform well was leg spinner Richard Johns. He started the season in spectacular fashion, winning several games for the side by running through the top order of opposition teams. He is keen to learn and realises, to get more wickets in the higher grades he must build up a little more momentum at the crease and push the ball through a little quicker. He has gone on a off-season build up programme involving the consumption of 2 bottles of Guiness per day and is apparently bulking up and really throwing his weight around. I'm sure he will continue to improve and has the potential to become a First Grade cricketer if he can toughen up his mental attitude.

Will Allen performed very well and showed the type of improvement you can achieve by plain hard work on the training track. Others to show potential were youngsters Damien 'Omen' Whitelum and Bruce Hard. In addition, wicket-keeper Ray King showed he also has a big future with the club.

This was a season of mixed fortunes and disappointment, however it was both enjoyable and rewarding. We should all play to enjoy ourselves, but remember, we enjoy ourselves a lot more when we win. I thank all players for their support and wish them the best in the future.

THIRD GRADE REPORT

To say that 3rd Grade had a slow start to the 90/91 season would be an understatement. With a draw from a washout and then three losses to show from our first four games, it looked like it was going to be a long season. This sequence included a two run loss against Ginninderra which inevitably cost us, as we all knew it would, at the business end of the season. These games that really should have been won always come back to haunt you, particularly when the side that has won gets the 'wooden spoon' for the season. Another lesson learnt.

Round 5 was against Queanbeyan at Margaret Donoghue Oval. After bowling and fielding extremely well (Scotty Bailey 3/41), we restricted Queanbeyan to 7/174 off 45 overs in a rain interrupted match. We won in a canter thanks largely to a match-winning 121 run 4th-wicket partnership between Stu Miller (60) and Wayne Thornton (45).

We then tackled Tuggeranong at Aranda and handed out our biggest thrashing of the season. Having been 'inserted' by the opposition, we totalled 252 after batting into the second day (Damien Whitelum 55 no, Clappy 44, Steve Broadbent 42, McKinnon 29, Barnesy 25). Damien then gave a bowling performance that we all know he is capable of in obliterating Tuggers' batting 'strength' with straight and sustained fast bowling to earn 7/21 off 19.1 overs. Tuggers' reply was 114. Steve B also supported well to collect 2/38 off 17 overs in his only game in 3s.

Now more confident, we then played Souths at Forestry in a game we'd all rather forget. After getting rolled for 90 (Stu White 30 on debut, Matty McInnes 27), Souths declared at 7/197 overweek (Matty Dunn 5/71). Day 2, and on a good batting track, we again capitulated, this time for 97 (Barnesy 23, Clarky 21 no, King 21). Enough said.

Dave Burge then captained the side against CND. Winning a good toss and electing to field, CND totalled 69 on a damp wicket, with Scotty Bailey bowling three batsmen with yorkers to collect 7/28 and mug of the day (you sure that was Coke you were drinking that night Scotty?), and Will Allen 2/18. At stumps, we had secured first innings points but only a 16 run lead after being 'rolled' again for 85 (thanks largely to a captain's knock of 20 from Burgey). On day 2, CND were bowled out for 132 (Allen 3/7, Mick Barnes 3/37), and we limped home

with 9/77.

Dave Burge again led the side - a one-day game against Ginninderra. Batting first, we managed 9/155 off 47 overs (Rick Bushell 35, Ken 'Chuck' Norris 25, Murray Eastman 20). Sensible fielding and good bowling thankfully restricted Ginninderra to 139 in a close finish. Well bowled Chuck (3/38 off 10 overs), Paul Broadbent (2/25), Mick Barnes (2/14 off 8) and Tony Williams (1/22 off 9).

Against Weston Creek, we almost snatched a draw. They batted first and scored 263 after having batted into the second day (Peter Giffard 3/24, Tony Williams 3/46, Scotty Bailey 2/36), and with less than an hour to go, our innings was complete at 117 (Charlie Giffard 31, Stu White 30).

I'd like to relay here my thanks to Burgey and 'Giffo' for captaining the side around Chirstmas in what were tough times as far as club personnel went.

In a game we simply had to win, we then tackled ANU at ANU North. Thankfully, it was the match which ultimately swung the Barry Andrews Shield Wests' way. Giffo, batting at number 3 shared partnerships of 80 for the third wicket (with Stu White 49) and 73 for the fourth wicket (Chuck 49), to finish with 74. Giffo, with excellent support, showed us exactly how to bat in two-day games with his solid effort. Unfortunately for him however, and at 3/184, the side absolutely butchered its hard-earned ascendancy to collapse to be all out for 219. Day 2, after being 0/42 off 6 overs, ANU then found themselves 6/111, and then 6/181 - needing less than five runs an over and well on target. But with the seventh wicket falling at 181, they 'closed up shop'. In an amazing finish, and with nine fieldsmen around the bat, ANU lost their last four wickets for one run in the space of three overs - resulting in victory with just one over to spare. Bruce Hara provided the 'sorbent' job and a top effort to collect 6/33, and it would be totally remiss of me not to mention Chuck's bowling effort of 3/38 off 27 overs - rumour has it that he is still recovering!

Three games after Christmas, we now found ourselves in the top four with three rounds to play, Queanbeyan being our next opponents at Mawson Oval. Having put them in to bat, they were 4/157 off 80 overs at stumps Day 1 in a frustrating performance. Day 2 however, and on a pitch spinning like a top, they collapsed to be allout for 212 (Dunn 4/65, Barnesy 3/40, and Matty McInnes

bowling very well and with little luck to collect 2/46 off 30 overs). Having had 99.5 overs to score 212, we had 57 overs to achieve the target, and did it in 50 with six wickets to spare. Stu White, capable of exploding a game to pieces, did just that in scoring 88 in about an hour of amazing stroke-play. Giving support were yours truly, who managed to get off the mark and go 49 better, and the ever-reliable Stu Miller who contributed 44 no.

Next game was against Tuggeranong in a one-day game at Chisholm Oval. Losing the toss and batting first, we found ourselves in grave trouble at 8/149 (Miller 44, White 42, Clappy 24) in the 40th over. The sight of the next batsman walking in didn't exactly provide the skipper (umpiring at the time) with an overwhelming sense of security either. Richard Johns however, this amazing little bloke they call 'Doogie Howser' (and I know you're going to kill me for this Johnsy) had other ideas. He simply went absolutely berserk to score 53 runs in about 30 minutes off I reckon about 25 balls (adding 77 for the 9th wicket with Bruce Hara 25 no). I will never forget standing there watching Johnsy, blinking through his spectacles as the opening bowler came in to bowl, proceed to smash the ball for a huge six over square. It wasn't his first six, nor his last. Johnsy, you are truly a legend. Tuggeranong, now shell-shocked and chasing 232, could only muster 178 with 4.1 overs remaining (Hara 5/48).

The last round matched us against South Canberra who now stood between us and a semi-final position. Batting first, I'd have to say that we made them look extremely good in totalling 66. They declared overweek at 2/150 and we replied with 177 (Barnesy 42, Eastman 39, Hara 29) after at one stage being 5/25. They got the necessary runs to gain outright points for the loss of three wickets (Dunn 3/12).

To win seven games out of nine between rounds 5 to 13, particularly after three straight losses, was immensely satisfying and I believe a truer indication of our ability than finishing equal fourth (losing on a countback for semi-final position) for the season. I know there are plenty of 'ifs' and 'buts' in cricket but the two run loss to Ginninderra simply provided the difference between 3rd position and 5th.

In conclusion, I'd like to congratulate Bruce Hara, Matty McInnes and Rick Bushell for their representative selections, and Stu White and Scotty Bailey for their respective batting and bowling awards. In addition, congrats to Stu White for collecting the club's Most Improved Award. Well done fellas.

I'd also like to thank Jonny Fuller for his outstanding efforts as Chairman of Selectors for the last two years. There was a high level of stability to sides last season (no "chocolate wheel"!) and full credit should be given to Jonny for that. It is a thankless task, and one that I believe Jonny isn't seeking reappointment to next season. His experience and diligence will be missed.

The 90/91 season was a steep learning curve for the guys who played 3rd Grade this season, indeed as it is for any player. Blokes like Matty McInnes, Bruce Hara, Rick Bushell (all just 15 years old), and Scotty Bailey (16) really are the future of the club. Throw in 'veteran' Chris Barnes, Matty Dunn, Murray Eastman (all 18), Stu White (in his 2nd season ever), and the 'old heads' and you have a solid foundation for success in the future.

I know that we all realised (and proved) that we were competitive against the better sides once we started playing to our true potential, and that is one thing that shouldn't be forgotten come next season - looking forward to it.

FOURTH GRADE REPORT

For the fifth season in succession four's season ended in the semi-finals. This was probably the toughest of all because we were not defeated. The match ended in a tie with Weston Creek bowled out for 222 in reply to our 6 dec. for 222. Being eliminated without losing the match is a tough way to bow out. But despite this everyone involved in this match or who played during the season had plenty to be proud of. The innings of Rick Bushell and Swee Ti-Pang during the semi showed great maturity in young players and set it up for Steve Matthews fine 65. The bowling was wonderfully led by Damien Whitelum with 5/51 off 28 overs.
