REPORT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

It is with great pleasure that we present the twenty-first annual report of the Western District Cricket Club.

The 1989/90 season was one of transition. The departure of a significant number of long serving players and several dedicated contributors from the committee of the previous season. This provided many opportunities and learning experiences for management and players alike, and hopefully will bear fruit over the next couple of years.

While the seniors could only manage the Fourth Grade team competing in the semi finals, the Womens side claimed another premiership and four Junior teams won their competitions.

The season commenced with improvements done to training facilities at Aranda Oval through several working bees. (Notable contributions from the Giffard brothers). Completion of the upgrading will be effected before next season.

Coaching clinics for the club's Junior players were well co-ordinated by Eddie Wheeler and Darryle Macdonald, with encouraging participation from both Junior and Senior players.

Club playing jumpers were purchased and worn for the first time, which certainly did add to the appearance of players parading the jumpers.

Again the demeanour of all the Club's players was exemplary throughout the year.

The thankless task of selecting teams was undertaken by Jon Fuller. Alas problems were encountered with late withdrawals on several occasions but were resourcefully overcome. Jon's enthusiasm and resolve were admired and appreciated by the committee.

Well done to those players who took out awards for club performances. Special mention and congratulations to the following players who won A.C.T.C.A. awards: Steve Broadbent, First Grade bowling average; Ian Garrity, Under 17 player of the year. Also, the Seniors were well represented in A.C.T. sides: Senior - Darryle Macdonald, Colts - Mark Murphy, Under 19 - Dave Thornton and Luke Healy, Under 17 - Ian Garrity, Mark Thomas and Damien Whitelum.

Unfortunately, the quality of pitches prepared by the Club was variable despite the exhaustive efforts of Tony Williams. This is an area to improve on for next season.

The Junior teams were at the forefront for their willing and fair competitiveness, winning premierships and gaining very good representation in A.C.T. sides. Thanks to Eddie Wheeler and his band of tireless helpers who provided great support to all.

Congratulations go to the Womens teams - the Seniors with their continued overwhelming success and the Juniors who finished in second place. Well done to Brian Hall for his efforts which were acknowledged by his receipt of the "Club Sticker" Award.

The social activities were founded upon the reviving of the "Player-of-the-day" award and occasional functions. Dave Burge provided much needed assistance mid-season in co-ordinating functions and presenting several Club newsletters. The highlight of the social calendar was the festive presentation night - at which "Sullo" again excelled.

The collection of annual subscriptions was readily met by members and effectively carried out by Geoff McKinnon. Monies for selling tickets at the licensed Club also assisted to cover some of the costs from the upgrading of training facilities.

Finally the Committee expresses its appreciation to the following people and organisations for their efforts and assistance during the course of the season:

- Office Bearers and staff of the A.C.T.C.A. for their management and promotion of cricket at all levels
- Western District Rugby Union Club Inc., office bearers and staff for their continued support, provision of facilities for meetings and social functions, as well as refreshments for the latter

- Junior Coaches and Managers for providing the service in allowing the junior members to play
- Umpires for a job well done
- Judy Andrews for her typing and formatting of this report.

HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT

It is with pleasure that I present the 1989/90 financial statements for the Western District Cricket Club.

The Club's financial affairs for the year resulted in a net loss of \$2642. The juniors contributed a small loss of \$61 whilst the women operated with a profit of \$341.

The resulting loss for the seniors is therefore \$2922 which of course is reason for some concern. However the statements reveal two "one-off" items of \$3436 and \$1697 respectively for a new practice wicket and 2 sets of artificial turf. A grant of \$2000 from the ACT CDF assisted with the cost of the new wicket so the net cost of these two items was \$3135. Thus the club has in effect been able to meet its costs from its operating revenue.

The Club in the coming season will probably have further "one-off" expenses in the form of urgently needed wicket covers for O'Connor Oval and a further set of artificial turf. The Club's financial operations will therefore need to meet its expenses as well as finding means to finance these items.

On behalf of the Club I extend our appreciation to the management of Wests Rugby for their continued support particularly with the opportunity to earn the \$50 a week selling the Friday Night raffle tickets. It is gratefully acknowledged for the payment by Wests Rugby of our insurance expenses.

Our appreciation is also extended to Aquafield ACT Pty Ltd for supporting Charlie Giffard with a donation to the Club of \$300.

As the Club enters the 1990/91 season it is in a reasonably sound financial position. However the Club will need to be cognisant of the need to maintain its income at least at the levels for this season just passed.

After 4 years as Treasurer I have decided that I will not be standing for re-election. I would like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation for the support of all the committee members and to those members who never needed to be reminded of their financial obligations to the Club. I would also like to thank Jeff Mackinnon for assisting me in the collection of subs over this past season.

In conclusion I wish the Club every success in the coming season.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS  
AS AT 30TH APRIL 1990

NOTE 1 : EQUIPMENT

Conservative values are placed on used equipment. These values are determined to approximate the write-off of the cost of the equipment over its expected life. The value for Juniors equipment included in the accounts is an estimate based on the value as at the end of the previous year.

NOTE 2 : GRANT

During the year the Club incurred expenditure of \$3,437 on the construction of an additional practice wicket at Aranda oval. It is estimated by Club officials that an additional amount of \$1,040 was provided in voluntary labour. A grant of \$2,000 was received by the Club to offset these costs.

JUNIOR CRICKET REPORT

The 1989/90 season was noteworthy for several reasons. Firstly, thirteen teams competed in ages from Under 10 to Under 16/17 - an increase of one team over the previous season. A pleasing aspect was the high retention rate of players between 15 and 17, many of whom have been with the Club since Under 10s.

Four teams took out premierships, which represent possibly our best ever season. The following teams achieved success:

Under 16/17 - Division 2 - Coached by Graham Bonnett

Under 14 - Division 1 - Coached by Ross Williams

Under 14 - Division 2 - Coached by Peter Voros

Under 12 - Division 1 - Coached by John Kent and Brian Higgins

Congratulations to those teams and to all the others from Under 12 upwards who competed for premierships also. While they may not have experienced the ultimate success, they did Wests proud with their achievements.

The Under 10s and 11s had their first taste of the modified rules, which the Junior Council introduced and from all reports enjoyed themselves. The new rules are aimed to providing greater opportunities for participation by players and were hailed as a great success by all concerned.

Kanga Cricket continued its success story at Canberra High oval under the expert guidance of Robert Scott. Some eighty children between the ages of 7-9 played every Saturday morning and the involvement of parents was excellent. Our junior cricket ranks will flourish as long as this nursery of future players continues so successfully.

An end of season presentation was held following the last game on 17 March, and players and coaches were presented with certificates of participation and appreciation respectively. This was a great innovation by Rob Scott and was greatly appreciated by all.

On the representative scene Wests again had significant success. Damian Whitelum represented the ACT at the Australian Under 17 Championships in Adelaide. We were well represented at the other age levels also

The strong link between the senior and junior club continued to be strengthened during the season. Two very successful coaching clinics were held on Sunday mornings and this involvement of senior players was greatly appreciated by the Junior Committee. We look forward to strengthening these links and increasing the involvement of seniors next season.

I should not let this occasion pass without thanking all the coaches, managers, scorers and other helpers who made it possible for the players to have a game each week.

Finally, I would like to pay tribute to the hard working committee comprising Fred Gill, Pauline and John Armstrong, Graham Bonnett and Rob Scott. They were a great support to me throughout the season and enabled the administrative side of the juniors to run smoothly.

DIRECTOR CRICKET MANAGEMENT REPORT

In what was a reasonably steady year administratively for Wests, we managed to achieve progress in certain areas. The laying of two new synthetic surfaces at the Aranda nets helped improve facilities somewhat, with the new fourth net to be covered in September. Also, our association with Wests' juniors was enhanced with the U/17s training with the seniors for half of the season on Tuesdays, and the scheduling of two junior coaching clinics for the younger age divisions. Thanks to Eddie Wheeler for a fine job with the juniors again.

Clearly what was lacking at Wests' practice sessions this year was a coach to structure and organise activities for the plyers. Still it was disappointing, not to mention frustrating, to continually lob at training to witness a crowd of ten or more guys standing around catching gently hit balls. Must initiative remain the obligation of only a few?!

Attendance at training was very much in line with past years, with good numbers early in the season although dwindling after Christmas. It is a pity that most of the enthusiasm and dedication at training is displayed by the lower grade players. Remember: reward for effort.

In order to regain ascendancy in the competition, steps are being taken to raise finances to pay a coach for the coming season. This will help to foster our younger players, as well as maintaining the interest of senior players, by not being so stereotyped with our training routines. I feel confident the 1990/91 season will see Wests with a paid coach, obliged to fulfil his/her commitment to the club.

It would be remiss of me to neglect the tireless efforts of Jonny Fuller, and congratulate him in his role as Chairman of Selectors. Jonny proved what a valuable asset he is to this club, putting more energy into his task than many of the players did in taking the field. Considering the number of unavailabilities from week to week, it was a credit to Jonny and the lower grade captains to field the full complement of teams.

Finally, I would like to thank "Brades" for taking on the arduous role of President, and compliment him on a few initiatives e.g. post-game awards, player's snacks at the club. One would hope 1990/91 will see greater interest in the administration of the club shown by seasoned members of the club.

GROUND MANAGEMENT REPORT - 1989/90

The O'Connor and Aranda grounds both had their problems this year with equipment breakdown proving to be a major obstacle to the preparation of good wickets. Unfortunately it seems that while this equipment is supplied and serviced by a third party little can be done to improve the situation. There were also problems with the length of the outfield in the early part of the season, as there was with grass in the A.C.T. generally at the time. Later in the year this problem was rectified to some extent by a couple of weeks of hot weather combined with the breakdown of the watering systems at both grounds. At Aranda the water was finally restored after about 10 days when workmen were seen on the neighbouring ground on Friday 26 January - The Australia Day PUBLIC HOLIDAY. A long term problem which will need to be attacked with more zest next year is Aranda's match problem. In its present state no amount of rolling is going to make it hard and bouncy, it just springs back up like a mattress.

Looking forward to next season at least some of these problems will be eliminated with installation of a new watering system at Aranda. The improvements include a meter which the curator can set to allow the pitch to be watered in advance of his arrival. The new system has been heralded as the catalyst to providing a smooth and even playing surface, however there has been no mention of removing the oiled football field lines which would be necessary to totally achieve this goal.

Away from the playing fields improvements have been steadily made to the practice nets with the aid of several working bees. New synthetic turf was laid in two of the existing nets and a new practice wicket completed to the stage where only its turf needs to be laid, meaning it should be available for use from the beginning of next season. These improvements allowed the nets to be hired by outside groups for a good return while Aranda and O'Connor also proved popular from Mid-December onwards for use in social games.

In conclusion I, and everyone on the committee, would like to thank all those who participated in working bees, particularly Charlie Giffard and Graeme Bushell for their willing providence of their own equipment for the club's benefit, and those who assisted the curators during the season.

## WOMEN'S REPORT AND STATISTICS

Season 1989/90 proved to be one of the most successful for the senior team - one in which they matured as a team, showing confidence in each others play and seeing the younger members take a leading role in many of the games.

There were some disruptions in team composition throughout the season. Firstly Heather Drew and Glenda Hall missed a couple of matches when they were selected to tour New Zealand with the I.C.F. Australian Indoor Cricket Team, in which Glenda was named vice-captain. Then we had the absences caused by representative duties, with both practice matches and the National Championships making demands on the team. In all, Wests contributed six to the A.C.T. representative team, five as players (Glenda Hall, Leanne Pepper, Heather Drew, Sarah-Jane Moore, and Karen Hitchcock), and Marianne Spire as Manager.

Despite this the remaining players held the fort with distinction, and ensured that the team went through the season undefeated. In fact, one of the most comprehensive outright wins was achieved by the team when the top players were absent at the National Championships in Brisbane.

Two players also represented at the National Under 18 Championships in Sydney. They were Rebecca Heddle and Kathy Holmes. Rebecca had a great tournament featuring strongly with the bat. Kathy showed the benefit of the trip with some solidly improved batting performances for Wests towards the end of the season.

Wests' Senior Women's team has now won four ACTWCA premierships on the trot, a record which should stand for quite a while in the Women's Association; and in the 10 years that Wests have fielded a women's team, they have won 5 premierships.

We must congratulate team members Leanne Pepper and Karen Hitchcock who, following their performances at the National Championships, were named in the Australian Development Squad.

THIRD GRADE REPORT

Season 1989/90 saw a cavalcade of players through thirds with every grade from 1sts to 5ths providing at least 2 players for thirds at some time of the season. This wide experience of players wasn't enough to get us to the finals however and this made an otherwise satisfying season quite frustrating. Only one team defeated us twice (the eventual premiers), yet we could only finish 5th with the knowledge that we were capable of defeating the other teams in the finals. A slow start to the season with one win from the first four games was our probable downfall, in contrast to our performances after Christmas where we lost only two games.

The season was highlighted by the emergence of a promising group of young players who have the potential to form the core of Wests 1st and 2nd grade sides for the next few years. All that they require is the right encouragement and that in return they exhibit the right attitude to what is a team game. Other half centuries during the season were scored by Damien Whitelum, Stu Miller, Andy Wilson and Mick Brady. Glen O'Sullivan also showed during his appearances in the latter part of the season a commitment and maturity which was lacking in some other players, perhaps his age is beginning to show. The bulk of the bowling and wickets were shared among Mark Thomas, Robbie Walker, Paul Roberts, Ben Healy, Richard Johns and myself. It was particularly pleasing to see the progress of Leg Spinner Richard Johns during the season because when he is in action you can feel that usually something is going to happen, and that helps to

make the game exciting.

Like Glen O'Sullivan, Dave Burge was 100% committed throughout the season and hopefully next season he will get the rewards his efforts deserve. My thanks go to him for his assistance throughout the season by putting out boundary markers etc., his general reliability and his commitment to the team and club as a whole. Mark Thomas also impressed with his attitude during the time he was in 3rd grade.

With the number of players who went through 3rds during the season it is impossible to mention them all in some way, however I would like to thank all those who assisted and supported me throughout the season both on and off the field. For those players whose season wasn't as successful as they would like, I take this opportunity to say that I hope you will be back next season to capture the form that was so elusive in 1989/90. 1990/91 will be a new season, make it "your" season.

### FIFTH GRADE REPORT

The 1989-90 season was a difficult one for fifth grade. The loss of a number of regular first grade cricketers from last season placed a great strain on the club as a whole and whilst many new players came into the club, it is not an easy task to replace the collective experience and skills of the players who departed. The need to establish a new first grade team whilst maintaining competitive teams throughout the rest of the grades must have been a daunting task for the Club Committee in general and John Fuller (as Chairman of Selectors) in particular. The fact that four out of five grades were in the hunt for the finals right up until the last round is testimony to their success and efforts and I would like to take this opportunity to thank both the Committee and John Fuller for all their help and co-operation throughout the season.

Fifth grade was less able to cope with the demands of what was, in effect a formative season for the club. I think the reasons for this are twofold:

- (a) there was insufficient depth to cover players moving up the grades when other players dropped out, and
- (b) for the first time fifth grade played on turf wickets and many players were unaccustomed to the differences between synthetic and turf pitches.

Coupled with (a) above, the high turnover of players meant that a reasonably stable team could not be maintained. However, most other grades also had to cope with this problem to a certain extent as well.

However, I have to say that our position was not helped by the general lack of application in batting displayed by some of those players who were regulars throughout the season. In playing two day cricket we have to realise that unless we bat for at least the whole of one day we will not win games. Tight situations demand a thoughtful approach to batting instead of just "swinging and hoping".

The season was not all gloom and doom for fives. We had a couple of good wins in the one day games, inspired by Stuart White and Richard Johns who both went onto bigger and better things in the higher grades. I was particularly pleased with the fact that a number of "original" fifth grade players made their mark in the higher grades. We also had a number of young players in the side who showed they have plenty of ability. Robin Reich is one of these young players, very good with both bat and ball. Another young player I would especially like to mention is Tony Bailey. Tony generally batted very well (although he may not have scored a lot of runs) in terms of technique, and his fielding was outstanding. He is an

extremely enthusiastic cricketer who trains hard and consistently, and a captain could not wish for a better team man. Thanks for your efforts, Tony.

There were a number of other good efforts from various players, including Jason Dowling, Mark Bradley, Peter Wyche, Mick Osborne and Cory Shannon. No one in fives figured prominently in either batting or bowling averages or aggregates, but everyone made big efforts, especially when we had to chase lots of leather.

In conclusion, I would like to thank the players who regularly trained and made themselves available to play, and the players who filled in for us when times were tough. I would also like to congratulate the Committee on a fine job under difficult circumstances. One of the challenges the club faces for the coming season is to try to attract new players whilst retaining current ones, in an attempt to improve the club's depth. As far as recruitment is concerned, I am available to provide whatever assistance I can during the off season and the early part of the coming season.

On the whole the team is to be congratulated on its efforts and again I am pleased to have been part of the team and to have had the opportunity to captain the side. I would like to thank all players for their efforts during the season and the Club's administration for making the Club run as well as it did under very difficult circumstances. Your efforts and hard work are very much appreciated.

I think the Club can look forward with enthusiasm to the 1990-91 season.
