Responsibilities of Membership of the Western District Cricket Club Inc

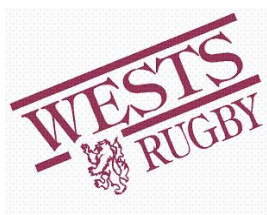
In addition to the requirements to pay fees on time, membership of the Western District Cricket Club carries with it other responsibilities.

As a player, you should endeavour to be available for all matches as membership carries with it a commitment to the Club. Part of that commitment includes working cooperatively with the captain, team members and officials to ensure your side achieves its optimum performance.

While there is no requirement to undertake administrative duties, members should be aware that the workload in conducting all aspects of the Club's activities is considerable and should not be left to a select few. Your contribution to assist in making the Club work harmoniously and efficiently is encouraged.

<p>Western District and University of Canberra Cricket Club Presidents Report 2004 – 2005</p>

A new era

The 2004-2005 season heralded the beginning of a new era for the Club.

It began with an affiliation with the University of Canberra Cricket Club. The extra players, although not as many as expected, enabled us to field 6 teams in the ACTCA Grade competition, with two in 5th Grade.

A second innovation was in obtaining the services of Terry Bayly, a quick bowler from the Northern Territory. Terry proved to be an invaluable addition to the 1st Grade team and also became a member of the ACT Comets.

A further addition to the strength of the 1st Grade was Danny Byrne, another quick bowler, who came to us from the ANU.

For a number of years the Club has sought to make Jamison Oval a 1st Grade ground. In season 2003-2004 the ground was available for a few matches towards the end of the season. This season it was available from the beginning of the competition. With the assistance of the WDRUC and advice from Cityscape, Graeme Death, doubling as Club Coach and Curator, was able to prepare pitches from the commencement of the season. There were a number of problems, only to be expected in the first full year, such as sprinklers coming on even when in the off position, and a lack of couch grass.

With the experience gained from a full season, it is expected that there will be further improvements next season.

Yohan Ramasandara, University of Canberra Cricket Club President, became a member of the Executive, as the UCUCR Representative and created a Club website.

A new fee structure was introduced this year. There was a registration fee and a playing fee. The advantage, from a players point of view, was that the playing fee was only paid on the days that they played. There have been a few problems with the system, not least being in collecting the fees on match days, and it is suggested that the incoming Committee look at improving the system for next year.

The Committee also featured in changes to the way in which the Club operated. This year, instead of one person being responsible for looking after grounds and equipment, there were two: Daniel King, grounds, and David Kidd equipment. As in the previous year, the appointed Secretary, this year Ben Keens, had to resign after the first Executive committee meeting due to work commitments and returning to the First Grade. The Club was very fortunate to obtain the services of Rachel Miller. Rachel and her husband Andrew have given an inordinate amount of time to Western District Cricket Club; indeed, their Saturdays are devoted to cricket. Being secretary of any organisation is not easy, as Rachel soon discovered. Taking minutes, arranging dates for meetings and chasing members for agenda items are only small parts. Then comes the hard parts: preparing documents, getting to know procedures and attending Discipline Committee meetings of the ACTCA. As well as this, Rachel also assisted in various fundraising activities, such as selling tickets at the PM's match and at Wests Kaleen Club. On behalf of the Management committee and club members, I express sincere gratitude for the work that Rachel has done during the past year.

Finance.

Tom Colebatch took on the job of Honorary Treasurer. It has, once again, not been an easy task. The collection of fees is never easy and this year proved to be no exception, with a number still outstanding towards the end of the financial year. Fundraising is another area of concern. The WDRUC gave us a grant of \$12,000, which was much appreciated. Apart from this, the general Club fundraising activities did not yield the expected amount.

It was planned to run an ongoing raffle, with tickets to be purchased at the beginning of the season and cash prizes awarded each month. For a number of reasons this did not take place, the main one being a lack of communication at the beginning of the year. The bat raffle yielded \$2 700, not nearly as much as was planned. A number of other activities failed to achieve targets and, indeed one - the trivia night - did not take place at all.

The Club was given the opportunity to sell raffle tickets at Wests Kaleen on Friday night for a small remuneration, \$30 per night, or about \$1,400 per year, not an insignificant amount given our financial circumstances. Matthew Veitch, our social director, had the job of trying to organise members to do the selling. It proved to be very difficult to get members to donate two hours on a Friday night and it was left to a small number of members - around six members out of nearly 100 registered players - to fulfil this task. The result was that on some nights we were, as a Club, unable to make this commitment

It costs in the vicinity of \$50 000 per season for our Club to play cricket and unless members are prepared to give a lot more support to the various functions of both the club, the WDRUC and the ACTCA, then the fees will have to be set at around \$500 per player.

On field activities

Despite the problems enumerated above the Club had a good season on the field. In the one-day competition, five of the six teams, including the two 5th Grade teams, made the semi-finals. Unfortunately, one of the 5th Grade teams had to forfeit due to the unavailability of players. The club made a request to the Grade Cricket Administrator for permission to include a couple of players. Permission was withheld, despite extenuating circumstances.

The grand finals of this competition saw the Club win both 3rd and 5th Grade. Congratulations to both teams. The two-day competition also saw the Club with five of the six teams in the semi-finals. 3rd Grade was our only winner in this form of the Grade Competition and thus completed a great double.

The Barry Andrews Memorial Shield was, for a number of years, played annually between ANU and WDCC to commemorate the late Barry Andrews who played for both the ANU and WDCC as well as for the ACTCA. This year, with the agreement of both clubs, it was reinstated and resulted in a win to Wests. A convivial evening was spent at WDRUC with about fifty players, a mix of both clubs, being present. It is hoped that this will once again become fixture of the season.

Graeme Death took over from Darryle McDonald as Club Coach. Due to the difficulty in obtaining a net co-ordinator, the Tuesday and Thursday training sessions were not run as Graeme would have wished. He had to spend too much time arranging who was going to bat and ensuring that there were sufficient bowlers in each net rather than concentrating on coaching. For players to reap the greatest benefits from Graeme as coaching it is vital to ensure that there is an appointed net co-ordinator in the future. This will allow the club coach to get on with the job of coaching.

In summary, season 2004-05 was a good one for WDUCCC from a playing perspective but left a lot to be desired in off-field activities. The incoming committee will need to work hard, together with the members, to ensure that the club has good facilities and adequate finances to enable the club to go forward in the coming years.

1st Grade Captains Report
2004 – 2005

A disappointing season in 2003/04, the loss of a few senior players during the winter & the potential to take out the 2-Day wooden spoon (as widely touted by the press & other clubs); ensured there was an underlying motivation to improve this season. Improving team atmosphere & culture were identified as key controllable aspects that needed adherence. This was exemplified in our pre-season fitness sessions. The degree of commitment, enthusiasm & motivation to perform as individuals & as a team, was more evident than I have experienced at the Club.

The 1-Day competition was split into 2 segments. A few games at the start of the season & the remainder after the Christmas/New Year break. Our inability to put all 3 facets together in the same game became our Achilles heel. A loss to Ginninderra first game & a washed out result second game against the weakest team Goulburn, all but ended our chances in this competition. The resumption of this competition in the New Year provided us an opportunity to blood some new players & reward those performing at the time in 2nd Grade. Aaron Coddington, Nick Brady, Luke Jorgensen & Anuradha Edirisooriya made their 1st Grade debut. All performed admirably & showed great potential in being a major contributing force in 1st Grade for many more years to come. 1 win from 4 games with a washed out result, pretty well summed up our poor season in the Konica. There were some Individual Konica highlights. Nick Brady's 3/11 off 6 overs v City & Suburban on debut, Nick Janzen's 4/35 v Tuggeranong, Ben Phillips (63) & I (67) putting on 123 for the opening partnership against Eastlake & Kingy's 57n/o v City & Suburban, after being smacked in the mouth trying to sweep, got us to a match winning total.

The poor start in the Konica Competition shifted our focus to success in the 2-Dayers. 6 Victories, 1 Draw, 2 Washouts & 1 Loss, indicates a good season & a well deserving top 3 position. A far cry from the ubiquitous 6th Position predictions. It was a real credit to the entire 24 players who played 1s & embodied this new positive team approach. To finish 3rd was a true reflection of our standing in the Competition.

The 2 washed out games were against the top 2 teams, even though we were well poised in both games, our general playing standard & depth was realistically a level below. To improve & be a genuine title contender we need to overcome some inadequacies. Batsmen need to set higher expectations & push for bigger scores. Grafting or good-looking 20 & 30s just don't cut it at this level. Bowlers need to develop control & maintain their 'areas' for prolonged periods & have the ability to bowl slight variations. On good wickets we really struggled to bowl teams out, reflected in our draw against Norths defending 391 & our record lost to Weston Creek who chased 405. Whilst in the field, catches win matches. When the standard increases so too should the intensity in our fielding. Converting those half chances could be the change in momentum the team requires, particularly during games where the bat dominates the ball. Players wanting to play 1st grade need to allocate a lot more specific time to fielding practice.

There were times throughout the season where our skills were obviously deficient. However as Captain, I could never question our fighting spirit & willingness to stick together as a team when under pressure. This was most evident in our semi-final loss. Eastlake had outplayed us on the first 2 days, though due to our team cohesion & spirit, we made them earn every wicket & run on Day 3. This determination & commitment was typically present in all our matches throughout the season. Not being evident in a west 1st Grade team for a long time.

During this season we also witnessed some notable achievements & milestones.

- *Our dec9/405 V Weston Creek & 391 V Norths are the 2nd & 5th highest 1st Grade inning totals in the History of the Club.*
- *Ben Keens being the 1st player to past 350 grade wickets for the club. He currently has 368 Grade wickets. Keensy also played his 200th Game for Wests (a feat only 5 other players have achieved in the history of the club). The guy is a Club Legend! You only have to hear him lead our victory song to witness his passion for the club.*

- *A club record 165 run partnership for the 7th Wicket between Daniel King & Danny Byrne against Weston Creek. Helping us to our total of 9/405.*
- *Danny Byrne (107 V Weston Creek) & Lachlan Funnell (105 V Norths) attaining their maiden 1st Grade tons. Well done guys.*
- *Danny Byrne's Hat Trick V Tuggeranong – His first 1st Grade Hat Trick.*
- *Danny Byrne 8/28 is the best figures for a Wests 1st Grade Bowler in any 1 innings of the ACTCA Competition. What a season!*
- *Nick Janzen's 5 for 27 V Queanbeyan. Nick's first "Michelle" in 1st Grade.*
- *Team Nerds beating Team Julios in the Ten Pin Bowling Challenge. Go NERDS!!*

2004 – 2005

Third Grade had a very successful 2004/2005, taking out both the one day and two day premierships.

Over 40 players contributed to the success this season, with some outstanding individual achievements, many personal bests and noticeable improvement in younger players highlights of the journey.

In the first half of the season there were some good victories as well as some disappointing losses, but by Christmas we were well cemented in the top four. This was a great achievement for the club as numbers fluctuated throughout these early months, to the extent we played with only 10 players on one occasion (one of those being club coach Graeme Death who dusted off the whites for a game), and in the last game before Christmas we only managed to make it on to the field because we had two Radford First XI players step in for the game. The last game before Christmas was particularly enjoyable as we recovered from 5 for 4 overnight to chase down 160 – odd with a couple of wickets in hand.

After Christmas we had less success, losing the first couple of one dayers. Having eased back into cricket in fours after spending the first half of the season doing his best Scott Cam impersonation Shawn Jones returned to three's against ANU. Batting at five Jonesy started carefully, notched up his 50, then went absolutely berserk, blasting the boffins to all parts of the ground and notching his maiden century for the club, finishing up with 122.

We then batted out the day with a couple of other players getting the chance to find some form going into the grand final, Will Witheridge and Shane Bartle both among the runs.

The Grand final was at Kingston against Tuggeranong who had finished the minor rounds way in front of everyone else. We had only managed to take five of their wickets all season so we would have to be at our best to beat them.

They won the toss and decided to bat on what looked a great deck by third grade standards but turned out to have more juice in it than expected. Damien Whitelum and Luke Jorgensen got into them early and before long they were five down. Tom Colebatch continued to improve, bowling a great spell and Robert Maggs also bowled well before lunch, taking a wicket in his first over, to see us go to the break with the opposition struggling at 7/95.

Tuggers made a bit of a fist of it through there lower order after lunch but were eventually all out for 150. We then got off to a good start with Anu taking it to the bowling early, before Shawn Jones and Raj Singh kept things going to edge us close to the target.

As we moved toward stumps we were 6 wickets down and unfortunately we went to stumps 4 runs short of a first innings lead, with Sticky and Maggsy at the crease.

Next morning was a near disaster as we edged to the lead but then lost 4 quick wickets to see us all out with 10 runs in our favour. By then it was a matter of defending and seeing if a very noisy Tuggeranong side, rocked by the looming defeat and playing every card in the book to try and get in front, could set us a total and then leave themselves enough time to bowl us out. In the end we had about 3 hours to survive and 158 runs to get.

We lost an early wicket but then Raj Singh put on an awesome display of hitting, one pull shot seeing the ball disappear down a drain half way to Manuka Oval. When Raj departed Shawn Jones guided us to victory, easily passing the Tuggeranong score with plenty of wickets in hand.

It was a superbly successful season for the three's, with over 40 players making their way through the grade during the season.

Over the years the majority of Wests players have come from three main sources -Wests juniors, Radford boys and Uni of Canberra students – and the threes were the perfect example of that mix.

Some of the older players, including, Matty Broers, Robert Maggs, Shawn Jones and Simon Ustick all produced some of their best cricket ever for the club. Youngsters such as Shubhung Mehta, Shane Bartle, Tad Lamb, Luke Jorgensen and Will Witheridge also improved tremendously and recent Radford recruits Tom Colebatch and Rohan Singleton made strong contributions.

I would like to thank Clarky, Keensy and Graeme Death for their suggestions throughout the year, Raj Singh for guiding the team to two solid wins early on when I was out injured, all the other captains for the selection meetings, Rachel Miller all of her assistance and Dave Kidd for his work with the equipment.

If Season 2003/04 was Annus Horribilus, I don't know the Latin translation, but 2004/05 was the Season of lost opportunity. Pre-season the Club merged with the University of Canberra bringing many new players. Thank you to the Committee for their efforts throughout the year. Local Club admin really is a pain the arse, and we need more people to put their hands up to help in an official capacity next Season and for Seasons to come. Special thanks to Clarky for his work as Chairman of Selectors.

Finally, a heartfelt thank you to my wife Rachel and my boys Sean and Ben. Without their support I would not be able to play cricket at all. Special thanks to Rachel who stepped in as Club Secretary and has done a wonderful job in an often thankless task.

As long as I'm able I'll continue to play this stupid game, and I look forward to seeing you all next Season.
