MEMBERS CODE OF CONDUCT

Responsibilities of Membership of the Western District and University of Canberra Cricket Club Inc

In addition to the requirements to pay fees on time, membership of the Western District and University of Canberra Cricket Club carries with it other responsibilities.

While there is no requirement to undertake administrative duties, members should be aware that the workload in conducting all aspects of the Club's activities is considerable and should not be left to a select few. Your contribution to assist in making the Club work harmoniously and efficiently is encouraged.

President Report
2010 – 2011

Welcome to this, the 2010/11 annual report.

Services to Cricket

Before the season started two members of our club received prestigious awards.

The Management committee nominated Alan McGann for an ACT Government Volunteers award. The ACT Cricket Association supported this nomination and shortly before the cricket season started Alan was presented with the award at a ceremony hosted by the Minister for Sport Andrew Barr .

The International Cricket Committee [ICC] allocated one medal to each of the States and Territories for services to cricket.

At the ACTCA's AGM in September your President was presented with this medal. There were present in the Bradman Stand at least 12 other people who, in my opinion, had as much claim as I did .I therefore consider it a great honour to have received such a medal.

Players

Our Captain of 2009/10. Nathan Lyon left Canberra for Adelaide and at the time of writing this report has played in his first Sheffield Shield Match, taking 4 for 41 after having taken 9 wickets in the T20 competition.

We also lost out wicket keeper Mark Hall who left Canberra for Queensland.

We were fortunate in that the club obtained the services of Stuart Poyntor a young wicket keeper/batsman, a member of the Irish U19 team as well as of the Middlesex Club in England.

Major disappointment

About 10 months ago Bob Taylor and myself attended a meeting at Manuka Oval with members from the Department of Sport and Recreation.

We were told that they had a sum of around \$150,000 to spend and that it could be used to upgrade Jamison oval and to put in some training facilities. We even saw some plans. We were also told that it was hoped that the training facilities would be available by the start of the 2010/11 season.

A few weeks later we were told that an engineer had looked at the place and said that it could not happen as it would take more than that amount just for a retaining wall. The emphasis then shifted to Kaleen. I had received a telephone call to say that Kaleen was the next oval for upgrading. There was to be a new pavilion, and a new shed for the rollers. For the second time we had great hopes of something being done. So far I think that the equipment shed has been started but nothing else. As far as the \$150,000 is concerned that was all transferred to the upgrading of the Baseball area at Narrabundah. Once again cricket and our club in particular has been let down by the department.

At the beginning of April we did hear some encouraging news concerning Kaleen. We have been told that Kaleen is the first on the list for re-furbishment which should be commenced around August of this year.

The other area of disappointment concerns the sightscreens at Jamison. Two years ago the department carried out some repairs, using angle iron. This made for a very heavy set of sightscreens. We have continually asked for some new wheels. Back comes the answer, 'No money available'.

Hope for the future

Around late October early November Stuart Hook and myself attended a meeting at Manuka Oval to meet with the new person in sport and Recreation, Shane O'Leary. He had recently arrived from Tasmania and was keen to meet with the stakeholders of ACT Cricket. He began by saying that not every problem could be fixed overnight but he wanted to hear from the clubs about problems concerning Ovals, equipment etc. a number of points were raised with him ranging from the payment to hire training facilities, ground hire and of various matters concerning repairs to equipment. I think most of us were staggered to learn that there was no budget for repairs. If repair work was needed then the department would have to find the money from somewhere.

Shane said that one of his priorities would be to establish a budget for this area.

He also indicated that the ACT was working on a plan that was around 20 years out-of-date. Shane told the meeting that he will be organising a further meeting before the beginning of the 2011/12 season to find out what is required from the clubs.

Let us hope that we will see a new approach to the numerous problems that have faced ACT Cricket for at least the length of time that I have been in Canberra. That is 40 years.

Season review.

For a number of reasons 2010/2011 has been a disappointing season from the playing point of view. To begin with the amount of rain that fell during the cricket season saw at least 3 first grade matches cancelled and various interruptions to a number of others. For our Women's team I understand that they only managed to play 6 matches. This aspect alone does not help in the development of players.

We still have problems in producing a pitch for the first match at Jamison due to the Rugby matches being played across most of the pitch area.

The training facilities at Aranda are well below a standard that is conducive to good training practices. For example because the area is not flat it is difficult to carry out fielding drills. We do not have a centre wicket area on which to train. The Management Committee is hopeful that some work may be carried out during the winter months, especially since we have received a grant from the University of Canberra sports union.

The Management committee began making overtures to bring the junior arm of the club back into the fold.

With Terry and Bob working in this area a good start has been made. This bodes well for the future of the Club as we develop a pathway for juniors to progress into the senior ranks.

It also opens up further avenues for opportunities for improvement in other areas with the expertise and knowledge that may come from the parents of our juniors.

Committee Members

Ben Oakley, as well as being 1st grade captain also continued as Social Director. He introduced two raffles, one limited to 150 tickets at \$50, the other a \$2 per ticket raffle. Although we made a reasonable profit from both raffles we should have made a lot more.

I have made this comment in previous reports. If every member made an effort to support the various functions and raffles we would be able to keep the fees at a reasonable level. As an example for the \$50 raffle around 75 tickets out of 150 were sold. This, despite at least 6 people selling 3.

Where were the rest of you?

The Trivia night was a success both from a fund raising activity as well as being a fun night.

Ajay Mehta continued as Club captain and also did a lot of work with the social side of club events. In his role of club Captain he was involved with team selection. This is an onerous task with many players pulling out of matches at the last minute thereby involving Ajay and various captains in a number of frantic telephone calls and the re arranging of teams.

Steve Luby took on the role of director of equipment. This sounds as though it is an easy task but there is a lot of work involved, especially at the beginning of the season to ensure that the Club has the right type and quantity of cricket balls, enough stumps and bails with extras, boundary markers, score sheets as well as other items which may be required, if not at the beginning of the season, certainly during it.

The job does not finish when the cricket season ends. There is then a requirement to carry out a stocktake of the equipment, ensure that it is kept secure and also to begin the job of identifying what will be required to start the next season.

Stuart Hook took over as Vice-President. Stuart brought a fresh outlook to the deliberations of your Management Committee and although some of his ideas were not practical I believe that Stuart will prove to be a great asset to the future running of our club.

Bob Taylor continued as Director of Cricket but undertook a lot more than this role involves. Apart from his director duties Bob also continued to curate Aranda, run the lunches at Jamison, look after the BBQ's as well as continue to update 'Mycricket'.

Terry Bowditch was our Secretary and gradually took on the Mycricket tasks as well as the normal secretary duties. If Terry continues in the position it is expected that he will take over the Mycricket completely next year.

Shawn Jones continued as Director of Grounds whilst his father, Ross, continued to curate Kaleen. From reports received from other clubs it would appear that the pitch preparation was in good hands.

Alex Fyfe was again our Treasurer but did not contribute much to the year. Alex is now living and working in the Tuggeranong area. This has made it difficult in both visibility and communication. Much of the financial affairs were carried out by Bob Taylor and myself. This is obviously not satisfactory and we will be looking for a new Treasurer for next season.

Finance

The club had a good chance of making a profit this year with two good raffles, extra grant from ACTCA, and some \$4500 from University of Canberra. Unfortunately we were unable to sell many raffle tickets, for example the \$2 per ticket raffle had the opportunity of making a profit of nearly \$6,000. In reality we made about \$1,000. There was a similar response to the \$50 per ticket raffle, with only around 70 tickets out of 150 being sold.

Fees are another area that needs to be resolved. As at the time of this report there are some \$10,000 fees outstanding. Those of you that have not paid your fees will be on a defaulters list which has been sent to the ACTCA. This list is circulated around the states and any of you on this list will be ineligible to play in Australia until such time as the outstanding amount is paid.

The Management committee are always looking for ways to increase our sponsorship and to look for other means of raising income but if the Club is to maintain its viability it behoves all of us to take part in the various activities of the club to purchase raffle tickets and to pay fees as and when they become due.

It's been my great privilege to work alongside Derek Gould and Bob Taylor. Both men do a tremendous job for the club, many of it behind the scenes which most of the time goes unseen. It's due to their hard work that we can post a club in the ACTCA competition. The attending of countless ACTCA meetings, the attending of grade committee meetings, liaising with planners and developers and the list goes on and on. It is to be specially mentioned that Derek was very unwell for the majority of the season and still managed to work tirelessly for the club.

If more people roll up their sleeves and chip in it could mean that we can run additional functions which could lead to more revenue being raised which would help run the club.

This season saw 3 members inducted as Life members with this club. They were Al McGann, Ben Keens and Ajay Mehta.

It has been a privilege and an honour to represent WDUCCC on the committee for the year 10/11 and I hope to do it again successfully in 11/12.

WDUCCC 3rd Grade Report

Firstly I'd like to congratulate our premiers, the 3rd Division T20 side, and the 2nd & 4th Grade 1 day sides as well. Great season guys!

This season was a great challenge as a club. At the start of the season we lost around 15 players that were an integral part of our top 3 grades. This tested our depth a fair bit at the start of the season, but at the end of the season to have all 5 grades having a taste of finals action in the 1 day, 2 day or T20 formats, we should all be proud of our efforts.

Our season started pretty well. Against ANU in our first game we batted out the entire 80 overs on the first day (something we weren't able to achieve in any of the 2 day games in the 09-10 season). We also got as many 50s as last season on day one, with Sudha & Tony Bailey both passing 50. Bails' innings included plenty of sledging of the opposition. Defending 210, I was confident of picking up the points but, unfortunately week 2, like most of the season was washed out.

In round two we ventured to the deep south of Chisholm to have what was what I thought our most complete day of the season. Winning the toss, we sent Tuggies in. Bailey opening the bowling had one clanged early, but new recruit Tim Westphal (on debut) took advantage of the conditions with an almost unplayable spell. He finished with outstanding figures of 8 for 27. Earlier in the spell he had 6 for 1 before their lower order showed some resistance. In the end we rolled them for 53. Sudha and Hargraves went out to finish the job, as we passed 50, Sudha raised his bat (thinking he'd scored all of the runs off his own bat). Simmo timed one too well to a fielder well positioned on the straight boundary. Sudha after passing 50 then cranked up the run rate a bit more adding some valuable partnerships with the middle order. In no time he was approaching the 90s, giving a masterclass to the Tuggeranong side. Sensing he was one shot away from the 100, he pulled out his favoured reverse sweep. A couple of seasons ago he played a reverse pull that landed only a couple of metres inside the boundary to reach 100 at Aranda. So no fluke there! At the end of the first day we had already amassed a lead of about 150.

With rain clearly visible on the Brindys, we declared before the start of play. Westy was able to get the 2 wickets required for an impressive 10 for on debut. Ganny and Jimmy chipped in with 3 wickets each and Baden took his first wicket in 3s to roll them for 82 and a massive outright win. It should also be noted that we were down to only 10 fielders on day 2 as Stu Hook got the late call up for the Coles shift, which makes it an even more impressive team effort.

Round 3 was a tough game against the previous season's premiers Norths. Batting first at Reid, Norths made just over 100, thanks to an inspired 5 fa from Melvo. On a deck that was turning square, we struggled to be 6 for 70 at stumps, but another determined knock from Bails got us over the line on day 2 chasing the target 6 down.

Our first loss of the season was to come at the hands of Eastlake in the next 2 day game. Batting first we got to 180 after being 6 for 78, thanks largely to Manuk's fighting 59 not out and Pruun's stonewalling for 29. We bowled really well, but were unable to capitalise on our good start. We had them 4 for 22, but they were able to knuckle down for a big partnership and in the end chased the score 5 down. Westy picking up 4 for 40 was the only highlight. Rain halted our progress until the new year with the 3 one day games all being washed out.

After the Christmas break we started with a bang with 1 day wins over ANU and Tuggies. Veitchy was great at the top of the order batting through the innings against ANU and only falling in the hot pursuit of runs in the last few overs against Tuggies. His innings helped to set a platform for our middle to late order to capitalise on in the later overs. A pair of losses against Norths and Eastlake ended our 1 day season with us only missing the top 4 by only 1 bonus point. Looking back it wasn't a bad effort considering the personnel missing after Christmas.

More rain was to disrupt our charge to the two day finals, with the first day against Ginninderra washed out and the game eventually reduced to a 39 over a side one dayer. This ended in what we thought was a tie, but the result was controversially overturned to a 1 wicket win to Ginninderra after a missing leg bye was added to the score after the final ball was bowled. After this set back our commitment was outstanding and we finished the regular season really well. In the penultimate round we had a rain affected win against Creek chasing a small total only 4 wickets down. Without the rain and our bowling attack, I think we could have set a real challenge for outright points. In the last round we travelled over the border. Queanbeyan needed an outright win to make the finals. They won the toss and sent us in. After 50 minutes their gamble was paying off as we were struggling at 4 for 39, but Sudha kept the runs ticking over and Rahul Pruundog stonewalled the Queanbeyan attack until tea to get Wests to 4 for 92. Rahul fell shortly after tea for a defensive 27 off 118 balls in what I can say now was a tactical ploy to get Ben Phillips in when Queanbeyan's aging attack was tired. Batting at 7, Folds started uncharacteristically with some solid defence blocking the spinners back down the pitch, and at one stage he even left a ball through to the keeper! As we were starting to think Folds was batting for time, then something snapped! Sudha then took a back seat to watch Folds unleash the fury. He moved from 15 to 50 fairly briskly. Sudha soon perished for 95, but Folds just started to hit it longer. Taking 26 off one over, including a dot ball, after this over he was well within range of a hundred. Only few overs later he had made his first hundred for the club, coming off 65 balls, with the last 50 coming off about 20 balls. John Boland continued our onslaught to be 49 not out at the end of the day to help us up to a massive 7 for 301 by stumps.

Once again week 2 was washed out and we were relegated to 3rd spot, due to Norths picking up first innings points on day 1. So we missed our home semi final.

We were sent to Reid to take on Norths. They won the toss and batted first on a pitch that didn't have any life in it for our bowling attack. Knowing that they only had to draw the match they set about batting out for time. Unfortunately we had no luck at all, with edges and chipped shots falling into gaps all day. On the first day we bowled 112 overs to have them 6 for 240. Our bowlers have to take the credit for keeping us in the contest. Norths unsurprisingly batted on, but in true Lion spirit kept throwing

everything we had at them, eventually dismissing them for 291 off 137 overs. Sudha showed his all-round class in taking 5 for 85, CT (getting reverse swang) bowled well to take two wickets and everyone else was plain unlucky not to get more wickets. We only had 67 overs minimum to make the runs. On a slow outfield we were always against it and it got worse when we were 4 for 30 odd just after lunch, but with Folds still to come anything could happen. Folds and Sudha, probably the most laid back pair for Wests Cricket had a good partnership of 70. They sent a scare though the Norths camp as we quickly moved over 100. Folds fell to a deflected stumping to continue our bad luck for the match for 48 off only 30 balls. As the run rate required increased so did the wicket tally, and we were soon out swinging to only get 140. It was a disappointing way to go out of the competition, but the most pleasing thing was we didn't drop our heads at any stage and backed our ability to the end.

We had a much better season than last season where we scraped through games, this season we were much more dominant. Last season our bats were only able to contribute 2 x 50s, this season our bats made 7 x 50s and 2 hundreds in less games. It is great to have genuine bats all of the way down the order. Our bowlers were excellent through the season, many great bowling partnerships were formed with Chris Turner, Bails, Melvo, Jimmy and Westy earlier in the season and John Boland coming on after the Christmas break. Luke Gryzwacz and Baden West showed some great potential as spinners and our All-rounders in Folds, Dave Robson and Sudha bowled some very useful spells. Manuk was excellent in leading the side from behind the stumps, his energy and barking at our fielders really fired up our unit at the most crucial time. Cossie's humour was great and took the pressure off the young blokes in side.

I want to thank the following:

Bob, Derek and the committee for their support through the season.

Richo & Ganny for our many cricket related discussions. It's great to have a chat about anything with you guys.

Ajay with the selections, we really got the balance of the side right this season!

Cossie your on field advice really helped our charge, and Cheesing is a classic topic only beaten by snarkling.

Tony Bailey running the warm-ups after our tough trot through the season, and our many email discussions we had genuinely improved the side. Without your help we could have crashed and burned out of the race for the finals.

It's frustrating to not come away with at least a spot in the either of the grand finals, so next season we need to lift another notch when it comes to finals.
