MEMBERS CODE OF CONDUCT

Responsibilities of Membership of the Western District and University of Canberra Cricket Club Inc

In addition to the requirements to pay fees on time, membership of the Western District and University of Canberra Cricket Club carries with it other responsibilities.

President and Secretaries Report
2009 – 2010

Welcome to this the 2009/2010 report.

In 2002-03 Cricket Australia asked all associations to increase their participation by five per cent every year until 2013.

For the last three seasons we have been doing just that but this season saw a drop of around 20 players.

I understand that some other clubs have had a similar problem. One of the reasons, I suspect, is that we as an association do not have the resources to give all players regular matches. We have one team in each of five grades, a team in City & Suburban and a women's team.

Under the current structure each club is allowed only one team per grade, whilst City & Suburban are restricted by the number of grounds available. There is still scope for increasing the number of teams in the women's competition but it is difficult to attract large numbers of women to the sport, at least in the grade structure. With the introduction of T20 perhaps it is time to think outside the square.

Back to the season just ended. Before the season started we looked as though we would have sufficient numbers to field two teams in the City & Suburban competition. It soon became apparent that we would not have the numbers and indeed at times we had difficulties in fielding one team.

From the early training sessions it could be seen that although we had a good number of bowlers we were short on batsmen. This is reflected in the fact that a number of bowlers have taken at least five wickets in an innings and there are also a couple of them who have taken seven, one on three occasions. On the batting ledger, there have been four centuries and a few scores over 50 but no batsman has been consistent throughout the season.

Despite this lack of consistency from our batsmen, four of the five grade teams made the two-day semi-finals, although only two teams, those from 4th and 5th grade, made the finals with 1st grade missing out by nine runs. Our 4th grade team went on to record their first two-day win in the history of the club. Congratulations are due to all players that contributed over the season.

At this year's D.B.Robin Night the club has some good results in the area of individual awards.

Ben Oakley took out the D.B.Robin medal and David Roberts the 2nd grade Player of the Year, whilst Adam Collins took out the 3rd Grade player of the season. Our women players also did well, with Zoe Cooke taking out the batting award and Alisa Clarke the bowling award. They were also jointly named as the best players of the competition. Ben Oakley and Nathan Lyon were included in the grade Team of the Year.

Ajay Mehta and Alex Taylor received volunteer awards for their contribution to the administration of the club

Once again our club was fortunate in that there were a number of members willing to take on various aspects of the administration that is necessary to enable seven teams to take the field almost every Saturday and /or Sunday.

Allan McGann had work and health problems that prevented him from taking as active a role as in the previous couple of seasons, although he could often be seen assisting with the scoring at 1st Grade matches.

Since I became involved with the club in 2002, Allan has assisted in almost every aspect of administration, from club coach to coach driver to selector to curator to assisting at BBQs and various other activities without which it would be difficult for the club to operate. Allan has given, and hopefully will continue to give, a lot of his time to coaching the younger members of the club to ensure that the future of the club is in good hands.

As a result of this enormous effort by Allan it was decided to rename 'The most improved' award to 'The Allan McGann Medal'

Obviously with Allan having to step back a bit we needed someone to step into the void.

Bob Taylor was appointed as club coach at the beginning of the season but he was involved in more than just coaching. There were problems in trying to obtain the services of a curator for Aranda. Bob volunteered to carry out this onerous task for a short time. In fact the 'short time' became the whole season. At various times a number of items of equipment required small maintenance jobs. Bob attended to these matters. Bob also assisted me with the preparation and serving of lunches at all matches played at Jamison, sometimes arriving just before the lunch break was due as he was at another ground watching his son Alex. During the course of the day he could often be seen doing the job of scorer.

During the course of the season there were many discussions concerning training facilities and the possibility of having them established at Jamison. Bob went to work on this idea and, as a result, I attended a meeting with Bob, Mark Vergano and members of the Department of Sport & Recreation. More on this later.

The other major task that Bob undertook was keeping <http://mycricket.cricket.com.au/> up-to-date. A number of clubs reported that they had difficulty with this task, but again Bob took it in his stride and for most of the time our records were kept up-to-date.

Ajay Mehta, a former first grade player, returned to the club this year in an administrative capacity. At the beginning of the year he was successful in organising sponsorship that brought some well-needed funds to the club. He was appointed as Club Captain and also Chairman of Selectors. During the season he was responsible for organising a number of social and fundraising events.

These included: the Xmas Cup, the trivia night and a six-a-side club competition that included a side from the former greats of the club. Throughout the season he organised a number of BBQ's and, last but by no means least, he has organised the end of season trip, which will see some 25 club members leaving town for a QUIET sojourn somewhere up north.

Ben Oakley was another newcomer to the ranks of the administrators. Ben took on the position of Director of Social Events. The Xmas Cup, a type of horse racing event, was one of the most successful events. This is certainly one event that will become a standard in the club's social calendar. Ben even got his mother assisting in the kiosk for most of the night. Trivia night was a joint effort between Ben and Ajay and throughout the evening Ben could be seen checking the answer sheets and tallying the scores.

Dean Turner began the season as Secretary but due to his work commitments and some disagreement with the way some of the administrative matters were dealt with he resigned in November. Before his resignation Dean had been very active in assisting with the continuing task of maintaining <http://mycricket.cricket.com.au/>, the IT system set up by Cricket Australia to keep records of players, matches and the various statistics involved.

Graeme Lawson was once again the lynch pin for the women's team. For most of the season Graeme continued to be frustrated by what he perceived to be a lack of commitment from the ACT Cricket Association to the second group of women cricketers who do not aspire to play at the state level. Towards the end of the Season Graeme announced that he would not be undertaking the task of representing our women at the Women's Council. I take this opportunity to thank Graeme for his work over the last seven years, which included coaching, administration, recruitment and representative duties for our women's team. It will be difficult to find someone to take over all of these varied tasks.

Clinton Lillipruun continued as director of equipment. This is an onerous job involving a number of small tasks such as chasing up shirts, ensuring that there are sufficient cricket balls of various types for the various grades and finding first aid kits, stumps and the myriad of other items that are necessary for the running of cricket. There are very few thankyou's but a number of criticisms towards any person involved in this job and I must say that Clinton seemed to take it all in his stride. If occasionally things went wrong—and they did—Clinton did not appear flustered or annoyed. He simply got on with the job. The club needs a few more of his ilk. Clinton has decided not to nominate for this position next year and I therefore take this opportunity to thank him for the work and the effort that he has put in over the last three years.

Shawn Jones was once more our director of grounds. With Manuka taking over the curator duties at Jamison, this left Kaleen and Aranda needing curator staff. Shawn's father Ross looked after Kaleen and the ranking of 5th place proves how good a job he did. I take this opportunity to thank Ross for giving us such a good ground to play on.

Towards the end of the season we were fortunate to have Terry Bowditch volunteer to take on the role of secretary. Coming in at such a late stage and not knowing many of the committee and what was happening must have been difficult. Thanks Terry for coming on board.

Earlier in this report I mentioned the possibility of some training facilities being established. The original intention was for them to be built at Jamison. Unfortunately, once the full costs became known it was realised that this was out of the question. Kaleen was the alternative venue and plans have been approved for this project to go ahead.

The pavilion refurbishment will be at no cost to the club and at the time of writing the indication is that there will be no cost to the club for the training facilities. It was hoped that at least the pavilion would be ready by the beginning of the 2010-11 season but that is now not going to be achieved. We understand that the sport and recreation department has had a more pressing call for its money.

In September 2009 the ACTCA commissioned a review of cricket. This review was wide ranging and covered all aspects of cricket. Since the completion of the review a number of meetings have taken place involving the various stakeholders. As a result of these meetings a number of changes will take place over the coming months. These include: a change to the make-up of the ACT Board, abolishing the position of President, some changes in the ACTCA office and a new strategic plan. Further, changes are still being thought through, including possible changes to club structures and to cricket competitions.

Treasurers Financial Report
2009 – 2010

Season 2009/2010 saw an overall loss of \$4,527 (audited).

It is important to note that on a cash basis the loss was higher as the balance sheet will show a substantially lower cash and cash equivalent balance. The reason for this was that in June 2009 the ground hire was yet to be paid and was paid in July 2009. The cash balance as at 30 June 2010 was \$23,363 compared to \$40,617 as at 30 June 2009. Total income was \$63,856 compared with \$63,883 in 2008/2009. Increased fund raising income offset lower subscriptions. The increased fund raising was due to higher sponsorship income. Subscriptions, were in part lower due to a restructure on fees where match fees are now no longer payable, instead subscription income was generated by registration fees alone. Grant income from the ACTCA, the Belconnen Soccer Club and the Canberra Southern Cross Club was steady. Other income fell whilst interest received from investment accounts was steady due to interest rates on term deposits being steady throughout the year.

Expenditure increased slightly to \$68,383 from \$67,732. The increase in expenditure is due to a couple of major one off expenses. The major reason expenses increased was due to substantially higher ground hire costs. ACTCA Expenditure totaled \$29,138 compared to \$18,124. The major portion of ACTCA expenses was ground hire. Also, minor equipment expenses increased due to the purchase of covers last season. Other expenses (repairs, training, functions and fundraising) were either lower or steady. Training and development expenses were lower in 2009/2010, but are likely to increase with a paid coach this year.

It is the goal of the club in the coming financial year to monitor expenses against budget as our main costs such as curating, hire of training facilities, and ground hire will continue to rise. Also, it is unlikely that sponsorship income will be as high last year.

2009 – 2010

My goal at the start of the season was to make the finals in both One day and Two day competitions. Wests Third Grade had not competed in a finals match of either format for 4 seasons. We were very close to sneaking into the finals in the Two day comp the previous season, so it was important to continue our great finish to 08-09.

Once again we used around 40 different players throughout the season. In the first half of the season it was a difficult task to keep a consistent side together.

Our season started later than usual, due to rain washing out the T20 knockout competition and our first One day game against Queanbeyan. We finally got on the field against Tuggeranong at the postage stamp sized Chisholm 2. I lost the toss and they had no hesitation in batting first. I thought that we did a great job in restricting them to 182 off their 50 overs. Chris Turner bowled a tight spell to finish with 3 for 29 and new recruit Adam Collins took 2/30. Unfortunately our run chase started badly being 4 for 43, before some resistance from our lower order got us up to only 138, conceding the bonus point. Not the desired start to the season.

Our ability to bounce back was immediately tested at Kippax 1 against Ginninderra. We batted first after a short delay from overnight showers. Dave Spare and Rob Blood got us off to a good start after we lost an early wicket. Both bats narrowly missed their 50s. A middle order collapse left us at 7/147 before some lusty hitting from Hopkinson and Collins, and a sensible 31 not out from Duhigg got us to 210. Ginninderra were always behind the run rate after a great bowling performance from Collins, Duhigg and Lynam taking 2 wickets each. We kept Ginninderra to 9 for 141, earning a bonus point.

We continued our form in the double header weekend. The Saturday game against ANU showed that we could win tight games. Sent in at ANU South, Spare was the only bat to get over 30, but some valuable starts by Selmes and Taylor got us up to a competitive 166. We let ANU off the hook a little bit after having them 8 for 86, but we managed to finish them off all out for 146. Treloar was outstanding in taking 5 for 25, he was backed up by a spell of raw pace by Lynam and some economical spells by Duhigg and Hopkinson.

Sunday's game was another away game at Phillip. Bowling first we kept Weston Creek to 153, with Collins stepping off a plane to take 3 for 21 and Mace juggling the ball around the Phillip deck taking 4 for 46 (including 16 wides). Hargraves had a great debut in the field, taking 3 catches. A shaky start had us 2 for 31. Treloar and Selmes steadied the ship and got us to the second drinks break getting us in reach of a possible bonus point win. After the break Treloar unselfishly threw away his wicket after bringing up his 50, ending a 95 run stand. Collins was sent out as a pinch hitter, but fell for a third ball duck. In the process of Collins' cameo, a number of the fielders were dropped back. Selmes and Taylor were able to exploit the gaps and get us to the target in the 39th over with Selmes finishing on 56 not out. After this win we were in a pretty good position in the One day competition with 3 wins, with 2 bonus points and a washout out of 5 games.

The Two day competition started well against Eastlake at Deakin. A dominant bowling performance kept them to 136. Treloar continued his form taking 4 for 22. Duhigg 2 for 6 off 7 overs, Mace 2 for 16 off 12 overs and Lynam 1 for 19 off 13 overs supported well. We had about 50 minutes to bat on day 1. Nic Harvey (who was unavailable for week 2) got us off to a flyer targeting the short square boundary with some elegant drives and glides to score 38 in about 40 minutes. In the second week, the Deakin wicket was a bit more difficult, but we were able to pass Eastlakes score courtesy of Taylor's quickfire 37. We were 8 for 127, before Collins spanked his way past Eastlakes total in 3 balls, with his 25 he got us up to 160 all out. There was still a fair bit of time, so we had another crack at them. We ended up rolling them for 103. Collins 3 for 33, Duhigg 2 for 19 and Treloar 2 for 26 tore them apart, but their number 7's resistance in his 60 odd not out left us with only 20 minutes to chase about 80 runs, so sensibly we moved our celebrations back to Wests.

Our form came to a crashing halt against Creek. Winning my first toss of the season we batted first on a belter of a Phillip deck. We weren't able to capitalise on the conditions and only had two double figure scores in our 117. We put up better resistance with the ball especially Collins in taking his first "Michelle" for the club with 5 for 57. Mace, Hopkinson and Mann also dug deep when we were short a bowler due to an injury to our representative sub Tony Bailey. They ended up 6 for 158 at tea before both captains agreed to call the game.

We finally had our first home game of the season against Norths. Again batting first after winning the toss, we were off to a pretty good start being 2 for 120 about 20 minutes before tea. Unfortunately no-one kicked on to make the most of a start. We had 5 guys get above 20, but no-one above 35. We only made 207 on what was probably a 270-280 wicket. Luckily for us we were still in the game by some handy bowling in the short session before stumps, with Collins and Turner taking a wicket each, and having Norths struggling a bit at 2 for 40 odd. We started day 2 very well with Mace taking an early wicket. After the early wicket no luck went our way, all of the bowlers were consistently beating the edge. Despite our tight bowling Norths were able to get on the front foot with a 85 run stand for the 4th wicket and a 70 run partnership for the 5th wicket. We must have beaten the bat around 80 or 90 times throughout the day, but we just couldn't get the wickets. Norths ended up passing us 5 down. Collins' 2 for 58 was a great performance considering how swollen his face was after he had his wisdom teeth taken out only a couple of days before the second day of the match. The loss left us in a difficult position in the Two day competition, only having 1 win from 3 games.

After the Christmas break we got destroyed by Norths in the One day game, batting first at Kaleen we got rolled for 45. Some inspired bowling by Tony Bailey and Dyllon Mackie took 5 of their wickets in the run chase, but we had nowhere near enough runs on the board. This left our last game against Eastlake essentially a Quarter Final as we were both fighting for the last spot in the top 4. Batting first on a tough Deakin wicket we were in early trouble at 2 for 21, before Boyle 38 and Hargraves 29 combined to set our innings up. Looking to increase the run rate we lost 3 wickets in 5 overs to leave us in trouble once again at 5 for 92. Kyle and I were able to get us to 6 for 134 whilst increasing the run rate. Dave Mann 20 not out & Manuk 15 finished the innings off, getting us up to a very competitive 198 all out in the last over. With the ball we got off to a flyer with Bailey doing it by himself taking the first

5 wickets, 2 LBW and 3 bowled (1 each stump). Eastlake fought back with a partnership getting them to 89 before Turner snuck one through their skippers defence. Collins then made it a double strike next over. Rain started to set in and their number 8 bat was looking dangerous. Eastlake only needed to be in front of our run rate to claim the points, with no official umpires to take us off the ground we had to fight hard with a wet ball. Mann was brought into the attack after the second drinks break, he was able to tie up the dangerous bat and even snuck one through his defence to make it 9 for 160. By this time the Eastlake players had the covers ready to take on the field as soon as they got in front of the run rate. With the ball being wet at this stage the bowlers were finding it hard to control. Turner got no balled a couple times for height before finishing the job off with a skied catch to have them all out 177. A solid performance after playing in the rain for probably an hour. Finally Wests 3rd Grade had sealed a finals spot!

We let Ginninderra off the hook after they were 7 for 59. They ended up posting 170 with Mace 3 for 29 and Collins 2 for 18. We were off to a great start in the run chase with Keens smashing 32 of 18 balls before holing out to a guy hiding in the shade on the cow corner boundary. On day two we struggled to 7 for 101 before Moore (30) and Duhigg (20) combined for a much needed 50 run partnership. A double strike left us needing 17 for the last wicket. Collins cleared the boundary to get us close, before Mackie squirted a square drive over point for the winning runs.

The one day semi against Norths at Majura was played on a tough wicket. Norths won the toss and batted first getting the better of the conditions. They raced away to 3 for 74 by the first drinks break after 16 overs. We done well to fight back taking the last 7 wickets for 45 to keep Norths to 153. Stefan Delhaize took 4 for 22 on debut, Collins 3 for 46 and Bailey 2 for 38. Our run chase started awfully with us being 4 for 32 at the lunch break. After the break Hook and Brown got us up to 73 for the 5th wicket. No one got in on the tough deck that was shooting through and consistent wickets kept falling. Unfortunately we finished about 30 runs short.

The game against Queanbeyan ended as a washout, but we were able to get a full days play on day one. They sent us in on a wet deck at Kaleen and had us 5 for 57 before Smith (26) found some form. I was able to get some runs with 47 not out and in the process had some valuable partnerships with Brown (20), Duhigg (17) and Collins (24). We were able to get to 187 wit our late order fightback. There was enough time left in the day for us to have a few overs at them. Duhigg was able to nip out a couple of early wickets to have them 2 for 38 at stumps. Unfortunately there was no play on day 2.

We had a must win game against ANU to keep in touch with the top 4. At South oval a long outfield was waiting for us, but the pitch looked pretty good. We won the toss and batted first, we had some handy starts along the way. Lee Evans and Selmes both got 30s, but on a better outfield they could have easily been 50s or 60s. We ended up making 184. Once again we were able to get a couple of quick wickets before stumps to continue our trend of being able to pick up wickets before breaks in play. On day 2 we were able to reduce ANU to 7 for 55, before the deck flattened out. ANU fought hard for the 8th wicket and in the process prevented any chance of an outright victory. Moore took a stunning Caught and Bowled that would have probably taken his head off. We were able to take the last two wickets fairly quickly to keep our slim finals

chances alive. Collins again was impressive with 3 for 27 off 22 overs. Turner 2 for 26 and Moore 2 for 14 also did a great job with the ball.

We had a simple equation, win against the top placed Tuggeranong and we make it to the top 4. We were back at Kaleen again for only our 4th home game of the season. The first day was a washout across all fixtures in 3rd grade making the second day a 50 over a side one dayer. Tuggeranong sent us in on a tough wicket where the ball was moving around a lot off the deck and through the air. We were only able to get 100, but with the conditions as they were we were still confident. Collins' first over showed how much the ball was still moving in bowling 6 wides. He spelled himself as he couldn't control it. Turner at the other end picked up 2 early wickets. Moore was having trouble overstepping and the Tuggeranong bats were taking full advantage with the "free hit" rule. Tuggeranong were 2 for 64 in no time before I was thinking of taking Moore off. He had other ideas taking 2 wickets in 4 balls. Turner then chipped in with his 3rd of the innings to have them 5 for 64. Moore then made it 6 for 86 and in another 16 balls he had another 3 wickets to have them 9 for 89 and the momentum was with us. A forced change saw Collins back in the attack and with only 1 slip on the number 11 batsman. Luckily for us Mann caught my attention to suggest that we should probably have 2 slips instead of a mid-wicket. I agreed and two balls later the ball got edged to second slip. We had pulled off a remarkable comeback in taking their last 8 wickets for 29 runs. Moore finished with 6 for 33, Turner 3 for 42 and Collins the last wicket. It was great to get over the line for Steve Duhigg who was injured at the time, but still made the trip from Goulburn to cheer us on. The win against Tuggeranong had us finish 3rd on the table, with 4 wins and 1 washout.

Our semi final was against the second placed Queanbeyan at Phillip. We won the toss and batted, it was a disaster though with a steady progression of wickets seeing us fall to Queanbeyan's experienced attack. Our highest partnership was only 21 and we were all out for only 83. Queanbeyan then batted us out of the game, by lunch on day 2 they had about a 150 run lead with 5 wickets in hand. What was pleasing was that we as a team decided to go out and finish our season by taking all 10 wickets. In the end Queanbeyan made 310, which was a brutal way to end the season. Mackie finished with 3 for 45, Collins 3 for 71 and Moore got 2 for 38. Unfortunately we just weren't up to scratch in the game, but I feel we will be better for the experience and be a real force in years to come.

There were many highlights through the season which made it one of my most enjoyable at Wests. These were:

- Collo's commentary through every game whilst on the field.
- Collo breaking his phone on the field whilst waiting for calls from the PM.
- Dave Spare and Alex Taylor making their First Grade debuts.
- Our exceptional fielding throughout the season.
- Steve Duhigg's support at Kaleen in our must win last game of the regular season.
- Moorey's 6 fa to keep the finals dream alive.
- Matt Treloar's 5 fa against ANU
- Selmesy and Treloar's big partnership (with both getting 50s) against Creek to gain a bonus point.
- Macey's 16 wides in the same game against creek taking 4 fa.
- Delicious! and the other words of the day from Hoppa, Sparey and Selmesy.

- Emergence of Simon Hargraves, Kyle Brown and Stefan Delhaize, these kids are the future of the club!
- Tony Bailey's post wicket fire ups and teapot impersonations.
- Manny suggesting a second slip against Tuggeranong, for a catch to go there 2 balls later.
- Collo hitting a boundary off his first ball, how many times?
- 3rd Grade making their first finals appearance in both formats.
- 4th Grade finally breaking the duck to get their first premiership for the club.

I want to thank Derek, Bob and the committee for a great season. Ajay thanks for your help in selections and getting pretty close to the right balance in the side. Our club should be proud of their efforts even if we didn't bring home as much silverware as we wanted. Getting 5 sides through to finals is a great achievement.

2009 – 2010

Once again the 2009/10 season was another pretty good one which saw us fall at the final hurdle in the 1 day comp and then finally get the monkey off our back with the clubs first premiership in the 2 day format.
