Western District and University of Canberra Cricket Club Presidents Report 2008 – 2009

Welcome to the 2008/09 annual report.

The club had 6 men's teams as well as a women's team in the field this season.

Although we did not win any of the Grand finals we did have a very good season

Awards

It began with a new innovation. There was a pre season challenge match between North Canberra-Gungahlin Cricket Club and us. Geff Long, CEO of Belconnen Soccer Club McKellar, provided a cup.

The inaugural match was won by North Canberra.

At the beginning of the season there was a 20/20 competition between all clubs and all grades. We won the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} grade trophies.

December saw the annual Barry Andrews challenge match against ANU, which we successfully defended by winning 3 matches to 2.

February saw a new challenge match between Queanbeyan and us in which we were successful winning 3 to 2.

As for the grade competitions we had 4 teams, 1st, 2nd, 4th, and 5th make the semifinals of the two-day competition with 1st and 2nd grade going on to the finals. Unfortunately neither team managed to take out a trophy.

Players

A number of 1st Grade players either left the club or retired at the end of the 2007/08 season

Andrew Jones 1st Grade Captain, retired, Darren Richards decided to try his luck in Perth, Ben Phillips decided to have a rest although he did make a comeback towards the end of the season.

Simon Cusden, who has played for Kent and Derbyshire in the English County championships, joined the club at the beginning of the season and stayed until the semi-final. Unfortunately due to circumstances outside of his control he had to return to UK before the finals.

Coming, as he did, from the English county scene his training methods were something of a shock for most of the players. The level of intensity expected by Simon were slightly above what most of our players had been used to.

Representative Players

Nathan Lyons and Ryan Carters were in the Comets team

Zoe Cooke and Diane Wilson were in the ACT U15 women's team

Financial situation

The major concern for the club is finance. At the time of writing it would appear that we are set to make a loss of approximately \$6,000 for the financial year 2008/09. This makes it three years in a row that we have suffered a loss.

The main reasons for such a loss is: -

Two of our fundraising activities, the two BBQ's that had been estimated to make at least \$1,500 suffered through rain. The BBQ at Bunnings made less than \$300 whilst the one at Gungahlin made no profit at all.

The original budget proposed to award certificates instead of medallions. This was changed later in the year to medallions. Certificates would have cost around \$3 each. The medallions, including the engraving cost around \$20 each.

The executive

Dean Turner took over from Alan Copeland as secretary. Apart from the normal secretarial duties Dean was faced with implementing Mycricket, a new computerised system, introduced by Queensland and then taken up by Cricket Australia for recoding such things as, registrations, results and transfers as well as other aspects of administration. There were many hiccups in this, the first year and it must have been very frustrating for Dean to find, after inputting large amounts of data, that it had to be done again because of a problem with the system

Bob Taylor also came onto the Executive. He came on in a newly developed role, that of Junior Development Officer. The role of this position is to develop a better liaison with the junior arm of the Club. Bob began the process by inviting some of the older juniors, to attend training sessions on Tuesday and Thursday.

It is a slow process and it is hoped that further Junior Development officers will be appointed in the future.

Alan Copeland took over as Social Director from Michael Hodge. Due to work commitments and the arrival of a child Alan's involvement was minimal but there is one more event to go, the Trivia night and he has been working hard to make it the success that it has been in the past.

Matthew McGann remained as Club Captain and on most training nights his voice could be heard urging all players to take part in the various functions put on by the committee as well as making the training sessions as diverse as possible.

Allan McGann, whilst saying that he was unable to give the commitment that he has given in the past due to work commitments, nevertheless could be seen doing the same, if not more, than he has in the past. He could be seen at training, at BBQs,

usually cooking the sausages, driving the bus for the away Konica matches as well as other numerous events.

Jeff Clark, the club stalwart, remained as Vice President. With his knowledge of the club history and his close association with the players he is a great asset to the club and can frequently be seen either reminding me of something I have forgotten or did not know about or giving me advice on some new idea that I might have

Shawn Jones maintained his role as Director of Grounds and together with his father Ross Jones carried out the duties of curating the Jamison and Kaleen ovals. This was not an easy task with the many challenges facing them especially at Jamison. With the Western District Rugby Union club going out of business the ground was handed back to the ACT Government. This saw a gradual improvement in the state of both the ground and the surrounds but is will probably be another year before we will see something substantial n the way of improvement.

Towards the end of the season a complaint was lodged by Ginninderra regarding the preparation of the Jamison pitch the club was found guilty of inadequate pitch preparation. An appeal was lodged and with supporting evidence from the former Manuka Oval Curator the guilty verdict was overturned. This should prove that our curating staff does know its business.

Clinton Lillipruune continued as Director of Equipment. With the various changes to a number of items such as shirts, the extra team that played in the City & Suburban Competition and therefore the extra demand for balls and the added problem of suppliers running out of balls Clinton did not have an easy season.

As an executive we need to give our Directors of Equipment, Grounds and Curating sufficient time in which to plan their various activities.

Jamie Ronald remained as Director of Cricket. Despite the fact that he has a young family and is in the process of building a new house Jamie still managed to find time to assist the club in many ways.

Towards the end of the season saw us having to face a report from Ginninderra concerning the state of the pitch at Jamison. The GCC found us guilty of not preparing the pitch to an adequate standard. The result of this decision meant that our 1st Grade would not take part in the Grand final

Jamie spent nearly two days preparing an appeal. This went before the independent tribunal and the GCC finding was overturned.

The club owes a debt of gratitude to Jamie for his work on that one issue alone.

Alex Fyfe continued as Treasurer. The main problem facing Alex concerned the payment of fees. This is a constant problem and has been for almost the entire time that I have been associated with the club. Despite numerous emails and talking to players there were still a number that had not paid all of their fees by the end of May, two months after the end of the playing season.

This is an area that needs to be improved upon next season.

ACT Cricket Matters

During the later part of the previous year the club Presidents held some meetings to discuss the operations of the Board of the ACTCA and its relationship with the clubs. It was agreed that there were a number of problems that needed to be addressed. These discussions continued during the current financial year and have resulted in a number of decisions.

One of these is the setting up of a foundation called the John Gallop Foundation. The primary aim of the foundation is to raise money to assist the clubs in a number of ways, which include, curating, and equipment and any other areas in which a club or clubs are struggling.

The other major item concerns the make –up of the board. There is unanimous agreement that a review of the Board and the ACT Cricket Office is needed. There is also unanimous agreement that some members of the board need to be replaced. In the next few months, before the 2009 Annual General Meeting, the presidents will be looking at people, who they believe, will have the right knowledge and expertise for replacements.

Sponsors

During the winter months the Western District Rugby Union Club at Jamison was taken over by the Southern Cross Club.

We were owed \$7,000 at the time of the demise of the WDRUC but despite several emails and conversations with the receivers we were unable to convince them that this money was owed to us.

A new sponsorship deal was negotiated with Southern Cross that resulted in us receiving \$10,000 for the senior club and \$2,000 for the juniors.

This was less than we had hoped for but it is a start and it is hoped that we can increase this amount in the coming years.

Our other major sponsor was Isis. This saw a sum of \$5,000 added to our account.

Geoff Long, CEO of Belconnen Soccer Club at McKellar gave us \$1,000 for which we are grateful.

Clubs also received a grant from ACTC. Because we have a women's team our grant was \$7,500. It was in two parts. The first part was received early in the year, with the second part conditional on us submitting a SWOT analysis at the end of the season. This we did, expecting to receive the remaining \$3,750 of the grant within a few weeks of the submission.

Mark Vergano, CEO of ACT Cricket, queried our submission, stating that it appeared that it had not received input from senior players or other members of the Executive. This is untrue, as members of the Executive had seen the analysis as well as some senior players.

Some slight adjustments were made to the analysis, which was re-submitted. The money was received a couple of days later.

In Conclusion

The business of running any organization with part-time officials requires an enormous amount of commitment by those willing to serve.

Four members of our executive have young families as well as full-time jobs, others are just starting out on their careers whist others have jobs that are very demanding Given these factors I believe that the club has been well served during the last year. My thanks go to all who have given of their time to ensure the smooth running of the many administrative tasks that face all such organizations.

To the players I also say thank you for the commitment that they have given. You do not get 4 teams to the semi-finals without a lot of hard work in the nets and on the field.

Finally, I am grateful to all of our sponsors. Without their financial support it would be difficult for the Club to continue to operate.

To Mark Vergano and his staff. On behalf of the club I am grateful for the work and support that they have given.

Over the course of the year there have been occasions when we have not seen eye to eye on some issues and that is bound to happen in an organization comprised of both full-time and part-time officials. If you add to this the fact that ACT Cricket serves two masters, Cricket Australia and the Grade Cricket then it is not too difficult to understand that their will be problems.

Once again thanks to the Members of the Executive and the player for giving me another opportunity to share in your club.

I wish the incoming executive all the best for the coming season.

Well what in introduction to managing of a cricket club. The 2008-2009 season saw many ups and downs both on and off the field.

On the field we did a very good job, with four of five grade teams qualifying for the finals and two making it to the Grand Final, the girls winning games and a City-Suburban team winning and looking real contenders through the mid-point of the season.

I congratulate all teams for their performances overall as I believe as a club we achieved a continued improvement over past seasons.

My Role

- 1. Executive Meetings These meetings were conducted monthly with current issues being discussed and addressed. Action items were generated and pursued.
- 2. MyCricket this club and competition management system was rolled out across the ACT clubs and competitions immediately prior the to commencement of the 2008-09 season. As with all new processes and system tools, it did not come trouble free, but WDUCCC undertook the stated requirements and by the mid-season break we were the only club fully compliant with CricketACT requirements.

Unfortunately, not all competitions are captured in this system (i.e. Twenty20, Konica, SCG Cup, etc...) and therefore the club has had to maintain separate systems for statistical purposes.

One of the many teething issues was a failure within the system initially which required me to submit team lists and match results multiple times. A time consuming task which within this first season has not provided a significant return on investment.

- 3. General duties both Bob Taylor and I picked up the match day social duties including stocking the drinks at Jamison and turning our hands at cooking as required.
- 4. Collecting funds An area the will required remediation in the next season, with which I have proposed and will implement a new system which should provide team captains and the Treasurer with better records with regard to Player registration and match fee payments.

This first year was a challenge and I can say that by the end of March 2009 I was ready for a break from Cricket. I will happily reapply for this position in 2009-10 but will work more towards implementing club structures which have fallen out of use.

Finally the thank you list:

- 1. Matt McGann a true clubman, wears his heart on his sleeve and worked tirelessly, at time without proper recognition, to grow and develop a club culture. He gave his time freely and helped me to understand this role
- 2. Allan McGann For someone who was going to be around less this year he was certainly a constant at training and matches. Another who provided clear guidance and support, without asking for some return.
- 3. Bob Taylor we have survived junior cricket together and forged a strong cricketing relationship. We have worked closely this year and I thank him for his constant support and candour.
- 4. Alex Fyfe working through MyCricket and player supps was a challenge for us both
- 5. Jeff Clarke the one person I could turn to and ask any club question and he could provide the history and the direction.
- 6. The membership you all accepted me in the role and allowed me to feel like a true member of the WCUCCC team, thanks everyone.

The overall financial result for the Western District and University of Canberra Cricket Club was a loss of \$3,849 according to the draft financial statements.

As at 30 June 2009, cash in the bank and term deposit came to a total of \$40,617.

The draft income and expenses are as follows:

Income for 08/09 came to a total of \$63,883 compared to \$43,963 in 07/08.

Subscriptions \$20,481 Grant Income \$23,700 Fund Raising \$15,781 Other Income \$2,502 Interest Received \$1,329

The increase in income is mainly due to the full grant being paid by the Canberra Southern Cross Club and sponsorship income from Belconnen Soccer Club and ISIS. Subscriptions increased, as well as fund raising income. Expenses increased also thus causing the deficit for last financial year.

Expenses for 08/09 came to a total of \$67,732 compared to \$50,634 in 07/08.

The increase in expenses were to two main factors – the airfares and accommodation payable for Simon Cusden's playing stint and the increase in ground hire fees to around \$9,700 for 08/09. Expenses generally increased across the board – increases were also in repair and maintenance, and fundraising.

Retained profits as at 30 June 2009 is \$59,893 compared to \$63,742 as at 30 June 2008.

(a) Basis of Preparation

Season 08/09 saw the departure of two of the Clubs great players, both to separate avenues. Darren Richards departed west to try his hand at Grade Cricket in WA, and we also saw the retirement of premiership winning skipper, Andrew Jones. The challenge for the club was obvious, replacing such experience was never going to be easy, but nevertheless, a new challenge for a much younger list of players was to be the focus for the season.

Wests, for the first time since my involvement with the club, sought an International Player to join the club as a player/coach. Simon Cusden arrived from England with experience at First Class level, England under age sides, and a season with Tasmanian side South Hobart/Sandy Bay. Simon's enthusiasm was attractive to the clubs committee, and whilst his role varied through the course of his stay, his involvement with the younger players was very much appreciated. A change in circumstances saw him unfortunately leave Australia just prior to the commencement of finals. We wish Simon all the best for his future endeavours.

On a playing front, Wests again performed in 08/09, reaching a third consecutive First Grade 2 day Grand Final, this time against the old foe, 'Creek, dispatching Tuggeranong again in March, the third time in three years, this year in the Semi Final at Stirling. This win was a great achievement for the young group, winning by one wicket on the first innings, after a great display of patience by Adam Hewitt, with both bat and ball. Adam has a great future in the game, and look forward to his continuing rise.

The Grand Final itself was a taxing encounter, Creek are a great side, they show that each year, and with their experience, an unfortunate incident for our captain, Nathan Lyon, in which he split the webbing in his hand (meaning he was unable to bowl) and an ongoing elbow issue for strike bowler, Ben Oakley, we were a little thin in the bowling stocks on a belter at Manuka. Creek posted 470 odd, with Cade Brown scoring an unbeaten 220, essentially batting us out of the contest. The chase was brave, with Oaks and Hewitt again giving us a chance, before unfortunately, our season concluding with a brave skipper at the crease, in immense pain as each ball hit the bat. Nathan is about as tough as they come and the playing group should draw inspiration from him and his efforts.

Unusually, both Ones and Twos, made the Grand Final this year, second grade also contesting this with Creek, an heartbreakingly falling a few wickets short after amassing a substantial first innings lead, thanks mainly to Stu Hooks efforts with the bat. There was plenty of encouragement however to be taken from the fact we not only had Ones and Twos in the Grand Finals, but that we made finals in Fours and Fives also, and narrowly missed a birth in the finals in Third Grade.

So mixed results through the season saw moderate success again, and in spite of several issues, the club continues to press forward on the field. Many thanks can be directed at those responsible for the running of sessions enabling the success to continue. From a cricket perspective, Allan McGann, Nathan Lyon, Ben Oakley,

David Roberts, David Mann, Bob Taylor and Dean Turner are amongst those members whose off field efforts allowed for the rest of our club to experience the successful culture we have continued to develop over the past three years.

Season 08/09 also saw one of our favourite sons earn a rookie contract with a state squad. Ryan Carters has become the second Wests Cricketer to obtain such a contract in the last 3 seasons. Ryan has received a contract with Victoria and has now returned from a season in England to take on this opportunity. Congratulations to Ryan, his efforts with Wests will be remembered for many years, his first hundred to take Wests to the 07/08 title will be fondly remembered as an innings of maturity beyond his years. We wish Ryan all the best for the coming season in Victoria.

Wests also experienced sadness, with the loss of our first life member, Geoff Gelding in June. Geoff had a long involvement with both Wests and ACT Cricket and we would again like to pass on our condolences to his family and friends, on behalf of the club.

On a personal note, 08/09 was a very challenging season. From a playing perspective, it was great playing with a youthful and exuberant bunch of guys, and experiencing success with them at different stages was extremely satisfying.

The difficulties presented through the season however were the same or similar to past years, and it is something that we as a club must improve to remain successful and valid in the ACT Cricket framework. The Club cannot continue to run and develop without more involvement from other people. Six to ten volunteers each season is insufficient, we need more assistance from more people on a more regular basis to enable the club to become the force off the field that we are starting to become on it.

The importance of volunteers can never be understated, and quite often it is a thankless role, but for those members who are satisfied that their own contributions to the club only extend to playing, need to consider what happens to enable them to get a game each week. The club currently runs with major contributions from the minority of members, but a small turn around to a alter this to be a minimal contribution from a majority (or all members). This is not too much to ask, that players return to the club after each days play, to scheduled club functions, (particularly disappointing has been a reductions to our social income of over \$4000 in the past two seasons) and to pay fees on time every time. The work of the committee is undone when players claim to be unaware of social events, even presentation night when these messages are delivered through a number of avenues on a consistent basis, at training, over the website, by SMS and email and through Facebook. Excuses do not cut it anymore in this technological age, so for our club to continue to function, we need to get better, get bigger and make this historically successful club a force well into the future.

Personally, the last 3-4 years have been particularly draining and as a result I will be taking a break from all involvement with Wests for the coming season. What does not change however, is my love and respect for the club and the people within it. I just hope that this season brings further success and that off the field, Wests become a dominant, successful organisation.

The second day started late due to the overnight rain. We eventually got on the field to take 2 quick wickets before a short shower halted our progress. This shower also left a wet and muddy patch on the square. Later into the day it looked like we were going to be able to get back on the field to have another crack, before the heavens opened up again robbing us of a deserved win. Some impressive bowling figures, Steve Duhigg took 6/15 & Timmy Mann took 2/22.

The next Two day game was also rain affected, with the entire first day was washed out. Another 3rd Grade fixture got to play, so we still had to play Two day rules. Lee won the toss and batted we were able to set a daring declaration 6/214. Callaghs made 32 opening up, CT scored 59 and Duhigg made 49 not out. Eastlake paced their run chase well, chasing our target down with only 3 wickets in hand and about 10 minutes

left in the day. Sudha & Timmy both took 3 wickets. But we missed too many chances to increase the pressure.

Another day's cricket was washed out in the game before Christmas, this time the second day was played under One day rules. We bowled first restricting ANU to 187. Mat McGann taking 5/31, including a Hat Trick. We chased it down fairly easy, Leethal scoring 60 odd not out, as well as contributions from Shawn Jones and Cossie we got over the line with 3 or 4 overs to spare with heaps of wickets in hand.

Our first game back after Christmas was our first meeting with Weston Creek for the season. Because of the washout we were still an outside chance of making the One day finals. Batting first at Jamo we made 6/211, most of the top order making starts. Syed Jaffry made a composed 62, Irfan Yousuf displayed some power hitting at the end of our innings with 32 off only 18 balls. Our bowling was tight and never let Creek into the game. We bowled them out for 129 in 41 overs. Irfan backed up his batting with 3/27 & Andrew Day took 3/35.

It was a simple equation in the last One dayer, we win we make the finals. We bowled first keeping Ginninderra to 8/179, we let too many chances go in the field and probably let them get 50 or 60 runs more than they deserved. Our batting display matched our poor fielding and we bombed out to 144 all out. Only Cossie applied himself with the bat scoring 51. A poor finish to our One day campaign.

At this stage our season was still alive in the Two day competition, our next game against Creek was challenging. Due to availability of some players, I got a chance to skipper the side and Lee got an opportunity to play in 2s. A massive downpour the night before left Philip District pretty wet, but some play was eventually possible. I lost the toss and we got sent in on a wet deck. We were going well at 4/100, only to have yet another batting collapse to be 9/110. Some lusty hitting from Macey and composed support from Andrew Day got us to a slightly competitive 157 right on the close of play. We turned up on day 2 in 38 degree heat, the deck an absolute belter and with a Comets player (Jon Nicoll) in their lineup it was all against us. They were cruising at 4/130 at tea. First ball after tea we fought back with a wicket first ball, starting a collapse. Creek crumbled to be all out 152. We had the desire that was missing in the previous game against Ginninderra. All of the quicks bowled their guts in the searing heat. Duhigg 4/39, Macey 3/31, Timmy 2/16, Daysy 1/22. Bangers sub fielded the entire second day for us too. We showed some tremendous club spirit to win the game.

With our season well and truly alive, we played Norths at Kaleen. We bowled first, with our spinners doing a good job to keep Norths to 180 all out towards the end of the first day. Dave Mann 3/43 & John Cheadle 3/44. Unfortunately we couldn't string together any partnerships over 30 and fell all out for 130, leaving us relying on other results to keep our season alive.

The last two games needed some positive results against Queanbeyan and Ginninderra. John Cheadle dominated the game against Queanbeyan. We bowled first and kept them to 146. Cheadle taking 5/21 and then backing up that performance in the run chase scoring 100 not out, Lee declared with a lead of just over 100. Cheadle took the only 3 second innings wickets to finish with 8 wickets for the match.

Batting first in the last game against Ginninderra we made 249 (our highest score of the season). Lee continued some good form with 65. Alex Taylor got 48 & Matt Treloar scored 33. Ginninderra held off until the last hour of the second day being all out for 162. Pete McKell & Bangers taking 3 each and Timmy taking 2. We narrowly missed the finals though, as ANU had fought out a draw and finished only 2 points in front of us.

So a lot of what ifs come out of the Third Grade season. Our batsmen need to set higher goals. 20s and 30s aren't good enough to get into finals or push for a spot in Second Grade. We need to kick on to 50 and beyond. Our 60s & 70s also need to be converted into 100s. It's extremely hard work for our bowlers defending 120-150 every week. We need to be able make 200-250 consistently to be a real force. It was still an improvement on the two wins from last season. We got 6 wins along the way as well as two draws. We ran into some great form after Christmas winning 4 out of our last 6 games, to give an unlikely finals appearance a shake.

I would like to also thank Bob Taylor and Dean Turner for all of their hard work throughout the season. Bob & Dean put their hand up to score every game that they attended and set up every home game we played, no questions asked. Dean umpired an entire game from one end for us, you were so good that Tuggeranong wanted you to umpire their innings. Without these guys our club would be significantly weaker.

Vale Geoffrey Gelding

There's little doubt that not only can Geoff Gelding ("Geldo") be described as one of the best workers in the Club's history but he can also be labelled a "character".

Club President on nine occasions and Secretary for two years are ample evidence of his contribution to the administrative workload of the Club. He nurtured a happy association with the licenced Rugby Club and spent many hours representing the club at ACTCA meetings and activities. His voluntary efforts extended further to junior coaching, curating, constant fund raising and membership of various kit, social and selection committees over many years.

It was no surprise to those who knew him that he was elevated to the status of Life Member in 1981, the first such individual in the club's history. The following extract from the 1980/81 Annual Report confirms the importance of this appointment to the club:

"The Management Committee of the club unanimously supports the following motion to be moved by Mr. G. Garrity, seconded by Mr. R. Rogers, that Mr. G.W. Gelding be made a life member of this club. The adoption of this motion would mean, not merely that Geoff would be our first life member, but also a recognition that he would have done more for this club than any other member, either past or present."

Complimenting his significant administrative contributions to the club was Geoff's memorably humorous nature and quick, and sometimes ribald, wit that appealed to all. Even on solemn occasions he could break down the seriousness of the situation with a humorous quip and suddenly the scene would change. With Geoff in the chair, meetings were not only productive but also entertaining, a challenging outcome in any committee environment.

As a cricketer, Geoff played 154 matches for Wests, scoring 1,989 runs at 13.81 (HS 102*) and took 235 wickets at 15.85 (BB 7/66). A slow bowler with a wrist action – one hesitates to say spinner as many who played with him contend he did not spin and that was his ploy – and a powerful hitter, he proved a competent all-rounder. Originally a first grade opening bat he later found his way down-the-order and the grades where a quick-fire 30 or 40 often turned the game.

One memorable Geldo knock was witnessed on an unforgettably harsh day at O'Connor Oval. It was the last 2nd grade match of the season and on the second day both sides needed competition points – Wests to secure top placing and South Woden to make the semis. It started to rain, it continued to rain – in fact it didn't stop raining! Some of the players in the other grades whose matches had been called off came past O'Connor Oval and seeing the game continuing, called in. The scorers stuck to their task working not on the scorers' table but under it – and even then they got saturated. But the match continued – each side chasing those points. Geoff was in his element. When the ball hit the pitch, there was a slash but this seemingly suited Geoff's batting technique. He was there at the end and his fifty plus secured the

minor premiership. His comments as he left the field were along the lines of "I hope we get similar conditions for the semis"!

It's fair to say Geoff had no enemies. Wests were fortunate to have a great club man, one who loved his cricket and in fact loved life. He was, without doubt, one of the key people who made Wests a strong and successful club and a fun-filled and rewarding place to play cricket. He will be sorely missed by his friends and family.
