Dear Members

It is again my privilege to provide the President's report as an introduction to the Club's Annual Report for Season 1999/2000.

Well, the character of Canberra Cricket will certainly be strongly tested after the recent decision of the Australian Cricket Board not to extend the tenure of the Comets in the national one-day competition. It will be interesting to see how the key stakeholders in Canberra cricket respond to the disappointment that comes from this decision. The dynamics of so many relationships will change and the situation will encompass district clubs. I can only hope that the development of players, coaches and administrators is seen as an essential element to the sustainability of cricket in Canberra as a viable sport for participants and competitors. The strength of the clubs will be pivotal in the maintenance of cricket, which will need to be underpinned by strong linkages between the various elements of a club, all of which should be driven by having shared clear goals and sense of direction between and among the juniors, women and seniors.

I have no doubt that there are similarities in the current position of the Club and that of the A.C.T. Cricket Association. Both organisations are in the process of having improved playing facilities for their home grounds that will benefit their members, but more significantly the respective administrations are at the crossroads as far as their organisations' existence and importance are concerned. Indeed the performance of the administrations over the next couple of seasons will be critical to their organisations' future. To put it bluntly, if the administrations don't get their respective acts together then good people will be reluctant to continue their involvement.

However, to get an act together and to achieve and maintain an effective working arrangement, there needs to be relinquishment of holding onto sectional interests and avoiding the entrapment of populism. From this point there can be the growth of respect for alternative viewpoints and the acceptance of some creative tension in trying to achieve common goals. To me this will be important for the betterment of decisions for the overall Club.

In terms of this season, it has been very disappointing from an administrative perspective. Too much has been left to a handful of people. It is important that you read the Management Committee's Report for this season. It identifies some specific examples of poor, or lack of, assistance and it is fairly critical generally of a lack of contributions. This is a two-way street, where the Management Committee must lead and set an example, and where the members need to be prepared to support and contribute to the overall good of the Club. All of this requires discipline from all parties, particularly in taking on tasks that may seem difficult – no different to the success of a team on the field.

As far as the future of our own Club is concerned, I think that there are a number of significant issues that all revolve around administration, and which need to be addressed to ensure that it continues to be a relevant and viable organisation. These issues include:

- better financial management and planning processes, particularly with the estimating of costs and the approval of expenditure;
- greater accountability of committee members;
- increased awareness of committee members to the need for sound administrative structures;
- improved communication between the elements of the Club, including promotion of activities to our members;
- greater participation in Club decision-making and organising of activities by Club members;
- increasing our revenue base, particularly from sponsorship; and
- implementing development programs for:
  - junior cricketers in our district;
  - coaches at all levels; and
  - Club administrators.

From my perspective as President there are some people who I must congratulate on their efforts to maintain the well-being of the Club during season 1999/2000:

- Ashley Heddle for his continued contributions to the cause of Women's cricket;
- Graeme Cook who has been an unheralded worker in many different roles for a number of seasons;
- the Juniors Committee for their handling of the growing number of junior players, and particularly Doug Brown who undertook to keep communication open between the juniors and seniors;
- Jon Fuller for stepping into the breach and showing some drive in handling day-to-day cricket management within the senior's; and
- all the people who were prepared to have a go at taking on management committee positions, including Ajay Mehta, and in particular Garry Beauchamp and Gerry Garrity for getting involved in Club administration after many years away from the Club's activities.

Special thanks must also go to those individuals who undertook the responsibilities of junior coaches, senior grade captains, and ground curators – which are all vital roles in making a Cricket Club function. It is hoped that the majority of these volunteers will continue to stay involved.

I must acknowledge and record my appreciation to the people responsible for getting this Annual Report in order and ready for members in advance of the Annual General Meeting. In particular, I thank Geoff McKinnon for his persistence in coordinating and cajoling contributions, and to David Jess and Ben Keens for updating the Club's statistical history.

Again the Club has been strongly supported by the Western District Rugby Union Club, Inc. and my thanks go to Peter Munn and his directors and to Jon Welch and the staff of the Club for their ongoing commitment to the Cricket Club. This relationship will be further strengthened with the laying of a turf wicket at Jamison Oval.

I also acknowledge our major sponsors – Jamison Hi-Grade Meats and Rama's Fiji-Indian Restaurant – for their continued support.

My congratulations to Darryle Macdonald at the conclusion of a magnificent playing career with the Club, probably with the best record in the Club's history. His contributions both on and off the field have been important to the Club's existence in the past dozen years. Also well done to Kris Britt for her selection in the Australian Women's Under 23 squad, and to Ian Garrity for tying as winner of the D. B. Robin Medal (best and fairest A.C.T. First Grade player).

Finally, I have always enjoyed my involvement with the Club and this could only have been maintained through the support and patience of Deb, Nick and Rachel. To them thanks very much for allowing me the opportunity to be involved with the Club.

I congratulate Ian Garrity for an outstanding season, culminating in him being awarded joint best and fairest player in the first grade competition. I also thank Mick Brady and his committee for their hard work and dedication off the field, during what is a trying time in local club administration.

Once again it was an up and down season for 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade. The team failed to play consistently throughout the season and it was disappointing considering the calibre and potential of players in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade squad. Unfortunately we failed to consistently score runs and field well throughout the majority of the season, however, there were glimpses of the great potential that exists within the squad.

Special mention to those who played the last several games of the season, considering it was unlikely we were going to make the finals. We finished the season with three consecutive wins against teams that figured in the finals, which is disappointing, given we comfortably beat them on the first innings and nearly secured at least two outright.

Matt Broers began the season in fine form with a solid 72 against Weston Creek and deserved his later call up to 1<sup>sts</sup> for the majority of the season. This was to later pose a problem for 2<sup>nds</sup>, with a high movement of players through the grades – by the end of the season over 30 players had played in the side. Nonetheless, this created opportunities for many young players and this augurs well for the future.

The high turnover of players also resulted in the captaincy changing hands several times, with Scott Meehan, Swee Pang, Graeme Cook and myself all leading the side.

With only two wins before Christmas, there were few highlights. Gerard King cemented his position in 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade with some match winning digs. He also set a high standard of fielding and became one of the few players to play the majority of the season in 2<sup>nds</sup>. Swee Pang was the standout with the bat before Christmas with three consecutive half-centuries. His batting was a pleasure to watch, particularly his ability to consistently clear the fence. Daniel 'Junior Clarky' King also began to find glimpses of his potential with a cameo innings of 64 at Chisholm Oval, and Jimmy 'Harro' Harrison impressed with the ball, consistently getting wickets each time he bowled. Harro's use of his slower ball was a great example of how effective a variation in pace can be.

Adam Hall continued the family tradition, showing what he is capable of with some fine batting and bowling performances, although on one occasion he found the pressure to perform too much when his girlfriend decided to watch him play one day at Kaleen. He deserved his call up to 1<sup>sts</sup>, and with some work in the off-season should be a standout next season.

Jack ('lab rat') Scascacini impressed also, sometimes opening the batting and the bowling. His 75 at Boomanulla Oval laid the foundations for one of our wins before Christmas. He also received the 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade bowling award with 15 wickets at an average of 16.07.

It is important to also note the contributions made by young players toward the end of the season. Keith 'Hendo' Henderson made his debut in 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade at A.N.U. North and really bowled some heat. There is little doubt in my view that he bowled the fastest ball in 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade this season. His figures of 4/38 in the final game were a real show of character. With the temperature at least 35 degrees in the shade, Hendo stepped up and bowled us to victory. There is no doubt that he will be a standout next season in the top grades.

Tim 'Echo' Purser kept well throughout the season and 1<sup>st</sup> Grade lost nothing when Tim stepped up during the representative season. Matty Wootten bowled well towards the end of season, consistently getting wickets with the new ball. His performance of 5/48 at A.N.U. was a great example of swing bowling.

The highlight of the season was undoubtedly Matty Wheatley's century against A.N.U. It was a hard fought and patient innings, with glimpses of fine stroke play and big hitting. **1999 - 2000**

Wests 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade 1999/2000. A season of terrific performances and a team full of talent yet, in the end, one of frustration. Frustration at the fact we made the final of the one-day competition, yet were beaten comprehensively by Weston Creek. Frustration at the fact we made the semi-finals of the two-day competition, scored 328 runs in a day, yet were beaten with only two minutes to go until stumps on the final day. Ultimate frustration at the fact that in both matches our loss could be attributed to multiple dropped catches, in some instances 'dead set sitters'.

What was not frustrating was having the opportunity to captain a side of great guys whom I consider to be amongst the most talented I have played with in 3<sup>rd</sup>s since I returned to the Club four seasons ago. I believe 'The Family', as we referred to ourselves, enjoyed our cricket at all times regardless of the outcome and when on the back foot we continued to compete aggressively, always seeking a positive outcome. The camaraderie and support that team members exhibited for one another was exemplary.

As mentioned, there were some terrific performances including five batsmen scoring over 200 runs for the season. 'Irish' (Mark Murphy) (394), Dave Cook (384), myself (360), Stewy White (329) and Shaun Jones (238). The standout amongst them was clearly Dave Cook.

Who could forget Cookie's one-day innings against A.N.U. at O'Connor where he scored 106 not out from just 77 balls, quite simply the best dig I have ever seen in the lower grades. He followed this with 123 in the two-day semi-final against Tuggeranong, coming in with the score at 3/92 and exiting at 8/260, carving the opposition to all corners of the ground. With Dave it doesn't matter that opposition captains instruct their fielders to scatter as Dave strides to the wicket, he just smashes the seed over the top, striking 12 sixes for the season.

Irish, once familiarised with the additional pace young 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade bowlers generate, was a solid contributor in the opening position. Possibly the most handsome aspect of his batting prowess was the follow through on his drives, gently touching himself on the posterior prior to assuming a contemptuous WG Grace style stance as the ball raced off to the boundary. Stewy followed him up at number 3 where if he wasn't getting ducks (4), he was scoring runs in his typical cavalier style. His 52 against Weston Creek in the one-day final the pick of his digs, exhibiting a great degree of uncharacteristic maturity.

Jonesy showed promise on several occasions, and Chris 'Hot Chilli Woman' Evans ('Sooty') batted solidly down the order, particularly with Jimmy Harrison in the two-day semi final in putting on 48 for the 10th wicket against Tuggeranong. Adam Hall made two faultless fifties before being promoted and Brett Grocott contributed several valuable innings during the early part of the season. Damien 'Dimmer' Cleary chipped in with a couple of gritty knocks, but was well below his form of last year where he scored some 400 runs.

However, together with Cookie's 106 not out, the batting highlight of the season from my perspective was Warwick Baker who, at the age of 16, made 20 not out from 74 overs to draw the two-day fixture against Weston Creek. The determination he exhibited was truly inspiring, given that the Weston Creek players continually attempted to unsettle him, and he had suffered severe bruising to his hand early in his innings. The way Warwick 'stuck it to them' was a lesson for some of our higher order batsmen who continually threw away their wickets in the first half of the season. Cricket is not only a game of physical skill, but is one of mental attrition and concentration, both of which Warwick is mastering at a young age, and should continue to do so.

Our bowlers performed admirably throughout the season, particularly Irish, Tony Bailey and Jason Jensen.

When Irish wasn't complaining that he wasn't getting enough overs, that he was bowling from the wrong end, that my field placements were wrong, or anything else that came to mind, he turned in some match-winning performances. Ultimately, his bowling and whining efforts resulted in his winning the bowling award for the year taking 25 wickets at 12.04. Irish's bowling may not be suited to the faster, flatter and bouncier 1<sup>st</sup> Grade decks, however his irregular pace and low bounce is perfect for the below average decks encountered in 3<sup>rd</sup>s. His naturally competitive nature and desire to 'sort out' the batsmen was a pleasure to watch on many occasions. Oh, and for the record Irish, you did bowl more overs than any other bowler during the season.

Tony Bailey had one of the unluckiest seasons as a bowler I think I have seen. If a catch was dropped, it was invariably off Bailes' bowling, at one stage six catches in two innings being grassed. His return of 20 wickets at 12.30 would have been significantly better if he was playing with a side that could actually field.

Also contributing to his bad luck was the fact that, at times, he was simply too good to get a bat to, displaying a mastery of seam bowling on some pretty average 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade decks. However, on occasions it did come together for Bailes, the standout being his match figures of 10/38 against A.N.U. that helped secure our semi-final position for the two-day competition.

Jason Jensen played only six games with 3<sup>rd</sup>s, his return of 17 wickets at 11.00 outstanding. His early performances led to his being promoted to 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade where his form continued and he ultimately took out the Club's bowling award for most wickets during 1999/2000. That said the selection panel, with my input, left Jason out of the two-day semi final against Tuggeranong, with Jason proceeding to take five wickets in the 4<sup>th</sup> Grade semi final – good decision hey??

Other contributors in the bowling department included:

- 'Sooty' (18 wickets at 19.00) who bowled with good control and variation and took match turning wickets on several occasions. He seldom had the opportunity to settle into longer spells as the opening and first change bowlers had usually done the job, with the wet weather early in the season not helping either. In the latter part of the season when he did get a chance, he exhibited form similar to that which saw him in 1<sup>st</sup> Grade several seasons ago, and hopefully this will continue;

- Jimmy Harrison was another toiler who didn't quite break through to have a 'big' season. Regardless, he still managed to secure 18 wickets at 18.11 for the year and was more than a handful for opposition batsman on bouncier tracks;
- 'Dimmer', the 'find' of the year, bowled useful 'meds' and returned 8 wickets at 13.88;
- Matty 'Merv' Wootten complemented several promising digs with the bat, with one bag of five wickets and several tight spells in important games; and
- young Graeme 'Attitude' Cook who started to return to some form towards the latter part of the regular season and returned 12 wickets at 17.08

The wicket keeping duties were shared between Dave Cook, Warwick Baker and Steve Hinds, with Cookie being the pick of the bunch. Outstanding fieldsmen were virtually non-existent, notable exceptions being Jason Jensen and Sooty. Jason took ten catches in only seven games with one 'Johnny Dyson' special, a memorable moment. Sooty was again solid in the 'goiter' position (short square leg) and can expect to field there for some years to come. I would also have made mention of Stewy, but seeing he only uses his left hand I won't.

Other 'cricketing' highlights for me were:

- Daniel 'Sats' Sattler's head-on collision with Richard Leitis and truancy record;
- Sooty's previously mentioned experimentation as a 'Hot Chilli Woman';
- Jimmy's appreciation of Alexis' cheese and bacon rolls;
- Stewy and Jason's weekly movie reviews in the sheds, particularly that of the movie "Swingers";
- Stewy attempting to declare on my behalf;
- Irish being smashed for 22 from one over (against Tuggeranong); and
- the round 10 side against Tuggeranong that featured the 'old brigade' of Cosgrave, Foender, McKinnon and Mehta – a truly bizarre line up.

I also express my appreciation to Jonny Fuller and Ajay Mehta for assisting in the selection process, one that was a major exercise in coordination and diplomacy every week. Thanks also to Irish and Sooty for their efforts and advice as vice-captains, Dimmer and Jimmy for their time in preparing the Aranda wicket, and Mr Wootten for assisting as scorer during the season.

Cheers and let us hold our catches and stick it to them next year.

**ONE- AND TWO-DAY MINOR PREMIERS**

The WDCC 5<sup>th</sup> Grade side may be the unluckiest side in the world! The team lost only four games all year, yet two were the one-day and two-day grand finals. The other losses were a one-day game and a two-day game, all after Christmas. The guys gelled together as a unit and it was disappointing to see the hard work result in a runners-up performance in both competitions.

I took over the captaincy from Bruce Robertson with two games left before the two-day finals.

The side was basically built around Geoff ('Jay') Sloane. I think he is without doubt the best 5<sup>th</sup> Grade cricketer in the A.C.T. His statistics of over 450 runs, 40 wickets and about a dozen catches speak for themselves.

The nucleus of the side was Jay and Paul Goddard – everyone else were players that came and went as the season progressed. Even Andy Miller had a stint in 4<sup>th</sup>.

Paul Goddard took 37 wickets and had a very good season, and was one of the reasons that 5<sup>th</sup> got into both finals. With Jay and Paul taking 77 wickets between them, the next highest wicket takers were Scotty Longfield and Roger Lonie, with 13 wickets apiece.

Of special mention is that Roger, in a one-day game against Queanbeyan, opened the bowling and from 9.2 overs took all ten wickets at the cost of ten runs – that is, 9.2-2-10-10 – probably the best individual performance in any grade in years!

In the batting department, Jay led the way again with 494 runs. The only other batsman to get over 200 was myself with 256. Included in this was an unbeaten century, and I still can't believe how I got that!

Ashley Cripps developed much as a cricketer this year, with both his wicket keeping and batting improving quite noticeably. From batting at number 11 at the start of the year, he ended up opening the innings on a regular basis and getting amongst the runs. He deservedly played a number of games in 4<sup>th</sup>.

Scott Longfield in his first year with the Club performed a very steady role. He was shared between 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> and ended up one of the more reliable cricketers in the side with bat and ball. Scotty can turn a game on its head in a matter of minutes as was evident in the 80 he scored in the two-day semi final against Norths. It was one of the best knocks seen this year. He is also more than a handy bowler given the fact that he took over 20 wickets in all grades this year.



Anthony Cole has much potential, and with the right coaching could develop into a very handy left-armers who will no doubt play in higher grades. I believe Matty McGann is working with him on his bowling.

During the latter half of the season, 5<sup>th</sup> found it very difficult to field a full side. This was disappointing given the fact that the side was leading the competition throughout the year. We were assisted by Craig Selmes and his Under 18 side – for which we were most appreciative – but most of the time that was not enough. Players who had signed up to play at the start of the year found that other activities were more important than playing cricket.

Cricket is a team game and by not playing or not turning up to a game that a player has committed to, he is letting every other member in the side down. There is a general lack of commitment these days and people are tending to be more and more selfish. This was evident when for one reason or another players made themselves unavailable for games. Some of the reasons were “I have a party to go to”, or “I am going to the Sydney Swans game”.

These guys should have a look at players like Jay Sloane, who played with a knee brace for many games and could not run, yet gave 110% every weekend. Andy Miller, who wears a back brace always turns up to play, and I had almost everything strapped up before taking the field. That is what commitment to a side is all about, and I hope that some of these guys this season, young and old, read this and perhaps change their attitude for next season.

This year more than other years, 5<sup>th</sup> provided a number of players who ended up playing higher grades. Pete Widdup started the season in 5<sup>th</sup> and ended up in 1<sup>st</sup> Grade, which in itself is a great effort. Gerard ‘Hooters’ King ended up in 2<sup>nds</sup>, as did Keith Henderson. Steve Hinds ended up in 3<sup>rds</sup>, Crippsy, Andy Miller, Anthony Cole, Paul Huleatt, Lachlan McKinnon, just to mention a few, had lengthy stints in 4<sup>th</sup> Grade.

Overall it was a pleasure to captain and play with a very nice bunch of guys and maybe I’ll do it again next season (but only if Geoff ‘Kinners’ McKinnon calls me in August to tell me he is playing).

He has been able to produce in many circumstances that have arisen. His bowling and batting records are very good, but often statistics don't tell the full story. When Darryle has been needed to perform, he has. He will give his all in any situation. Whether it be scoring a hundred or taking five wickets in two of our Grand Final victories, or simply taking a catch to win the first game of a season, he has given no less than 100 percent.

This wholehearted approach is a good indicator of Darryle's character and it has been recognised and will show through on the field in seasons to come. Testament to his character was his ability to be away from the game for twelve months and still be able to force his way back into the representative side.



Darryle has been able to contribute to cricket in his roles as a member of the Western District Cricket Club Committee of Management, an employee of the A.C.T. **A TRIBUTE: KRISTINE BRITT**

Kris started playing cricket for Evatt Under 12 Division 2, 1995/1996 in a mixed team. She won the coach's award and hasn't looked back. After two seasons of mixed cricket with Evatt, she was spotted by Ashley Heddle and recruited to play for Wests senior women's side. Under the watchful guidance of Captain S-J Moore she has recently been selected in the Under 23 Australian Youth Squad.

In her short time in cricket she has produced some outstanding results. By the time she had turned 13 years of age during the 1996/97 season, she had represented the A.C.T. in the Under 19 Australian Championships, became a member of the A.C.T. Senior Women's side, and played for the touring Pakistan Women's side in a man of the match performance at Manuka Oval.

Turning 14 during season 1997/98, she again went away with the A.C.T. Under 19 side, this time as Vice Captain, only to suffer a back stress fracture on the first day of the tournament. Ignoring advice she played throughout the championships and helped the A.C.T. to some of its best championship results. On returning to Canberra she sat out the rest of the season, only to win both the Best Batting and Bowling Average Awards for the A.C.T. She also won the Batting and Bowling awards for the Wests Club.

The next year, season 1998/99, Kris as Vice Captain attended the Under 19 Championships in Orange, NSW, and returned with an average of 22.70 with the bat and six wickets. She was named Fielder of the Championships.

She was also selected for the Under 17 championships that season, a tournament that had alluded Kris. She had been forced to miss two championships due to injury, but with Canberra hosting the event Kris was not going to miss another. She was named Captain of the A.C.T. side and lead them to fourth place at the championship. The highlight of Kris' tournament was hitting 75 against Queensland at Manuka Oval and being named in the Australian Under 17 Honour Team. She also represented the A.C.T. Senior Women's team in the Inaugural 2<sup>nd</sup> XI Tri-Series Championships. She took 5 for 24 off 10 overs against the Victorian 2<sup>nd</sup> XI and was runner up in the player of the series awards. At the end of the season, Kris travelled with the A.C.T. side to Tasmania but while she was focusing on Senior representative cricket, she thought constantly about returning early so as to lead Wests' first ever Under 19 Women's side into their grand final. Wests won as the game was washed out and had finished well above the other teams in the competition.

Season 1999/2000 saw the Under 19 championships held in Toowoomba, Queensland, and with the captaincy weighing heavily Kris lead from beginning to end. Scores of 73 against Tasmania and 109 not out against Queensland (carrying her bat through the innings) saw her lead the A.C.T. to another fourth place finish, and Kris winning the Batting Strike Rate Award for the Championships.

Kris then once again lead Wests Under 19 Women's team to its second consecutive grand final win, and in her most successful season she again lead the A.C.T. Under 17 side to the Australian Championships. As this would be Kris' last Under 17 championships she was preparing for a big one, and her goals were high – seeking a batting average of 50.00, and to break the batting aggregate of 226 runs for a single championship (attained at an average of 56.50). Under coach S-J Moore, she duly set about destroying the states' attacks and scored 304 runs for championships at 60.80. Kris was named in the Under 17 Australian Honour Team, for the second time.

On her return to Canberra, she was delighted to be informed she had also been named in the Australian Under 23 Youth Squad, and to top off an extremely successful season, Kris has also gained a scholarship into the A.C.T. Academy.

Kris looks forward to another big season in 2000/2001, and hopefully continuing her Westies Senior Women's, Westies Junior Women's, A.C.T. Under 19s, A.C.T. Senior Women's, A.C.T. Academy and Australian representative duties to the best of her ability.

**1999 – 2000**  
**MINOR PREMIERS AND JOINT PREMIERS**

The Westies women's team had a successful 1999/2000 cricket season. We retained the minor premiers title and were joint winners of the premiership. It was, however, an extremely frustrating finish to the season.

Of the 13 scheduled games for the season, Wests won nine, lost two, and one was not played due to weather/state of ground conditions. The final was abandoned due to rain after some 68 overs were bowled.

The Wests 1999/2000 senior women's team saw the introduction of seven new players – Melissa Campbell and Trish Jean (ex Ginninderra), Kathryn Reilly and Helen Tournier (ex-North Canberra Ainslie), Julie Grant, Rebecca Iffland and Melissa Kells. We also saw the welcome return of Caley Armstrong (after the birth of Zoe) and Katherine Brown, who returned to Wests after stints with North-Canberra-Ainslie and Ginninderra. These gains were offset by the transfer of Ianthe Astley-Boden and Rachel Tokley to the Weston Creek Club, and Rebecca Luppino who had the season off pending the arrival of her second daughter (Jesse, born 20 February 2000).

We also suffered injuries during the season. Trish Jean whilst training with the A.C.T.'s representative squad got a top edge and suffered a broken jaw and teeth, but Trish was soon back into the thick of things after missing only two games. Kathryn Reilly incurred a knee injury playing rugby and was not available for the second half of the season, and S J Moore also experienced persistent achilles problems during the latter part of the season. In addition, Caley Armstrong retired during the Christmas break to spend quality time with husband Ian and Zoe.

With such a turnover of players, it is very pleasing that we maintained our competitiveness and are still a major force in A.C.T. Women's Cricket.

Some notable achievements on the field this year included an A.C.T. Women's record partnership of 257 between Kris Britt (118) and Kath Reilly (118) in round 6 against Ginninderra. The match was a notable one in which the team scored 356 in 50 overs, also an A.C.T. record high score, then dismissed Ginninderra for a record low score of just nine. To round off the day, Wests Captain 'S-J' took her 300th Club wicket, only the second player to achieve this. Later in the season S-J went on to break the long standing A.C.T. record of 310 1<sup>st</sup> Grade wickets, held by former Wests player and captain Glenda Hall.

Wests Women won the major A.C.T.C.A. women's awards for the 1999/2000 season. Sarah-Jane Moore took out the bowling award and Kristine Britt won the batting award.

### **SUMMARY OF THE GRAND FINAL**

Once again, the A.C.T. Cricket Association made its premier ground, Manuka Oval, available for the Women's Grand Final on 19 March 2000, for which we thank them very much. Notwithstanding the omission of an inner circle, the ground was in great condition. The captain of Weston Creek, Ianthe Astley-Boden, won the toss and elected to bat.

Rebecca Iffland and Captain Sarah-Jane Moore opened the Wests bowling attack and we had our first breakthrough with the first ball of the 10th over (1/16). Kris Britt took the second wicket (Sarah-Jane the catch, 2/33) but we were making it difficult for ourselves with some unusually sloppy catching and fielding mistakes. The third wicket to fall was actually a run out (3/51) and the fourth wicket was due to a brilliant catch by Sarah Jean off Kris Britt (4/60). Weston Creek captain Ianthe Astley-Boden then made us pay for our mistakes and, after being put down before she scored went on to make 89, before being caught behind the wicket by Trish Jean off Hannah Stanley with the score at 5/136. Kath Brown then chipped in with three wickets and we eventually restricted Weston Creek to 165 off 47.2 overs.

Kris Britt and Kath Brown then opened the batting for Wests in brilliant fashion. Only one chance was given (not accepted) but due to continuous rain for the previous four overs, and with light deteriorating, the girls came from the field at the end of the 20th over with the score 0/94. Unfortunately conditions did not improve and at 5pm, the umpires declared the match abandoned (drawn game), with the Konica Cup rules stating that each team has to face 25 overs before a winning result can be declared. The A.C.T.C.A. subsequently ruled both sides as joint premiers. Few would deny that we were in a winning position prior to the match being abandoned.

Let's hope that next season ends with the weather not disrupting the finals, but in the meantime the rules need attention and clarification.

My thanks to the players and supporters of the women's team for another season, with all enjoying their love of cricket and the 'sportship' that goes with it. Special thanks to the junior players and the occasional players for their valuable contributions, for without you the team could not have survived.

While the success of the non-competitive teams is not measured as part of the Club Championship, results from the competitions indicate the Club's future is strong. 'First time' coaches were training the vast majority of the non-competitive teams. I am pleased to report that the enthusiasm of both old and new coaches is filtering to the players. Consequently, as a Club, we are reaping the benefits across all age groups.

It should be noted that approximately 95% of our junior coaches are Level 1 accredited. This reflects the Club's initiative to sponsor coaches to become accredited and thus ensure the coaching provided is structured and appropriate to the sport.

This season a number of our Under 18 players commenced the transition into the grade ranks with the Western District Cricket Club (WDCC). I would like to wish them, on behalf of the Club, every success with their future at WDCC.

The success of our competitive sides from last season has been followed up again this season. While this season we did not finish second in the Club Championship, our finish in the top half of the competition was none the less credible in itself. Eight sides made the semi-finals and five progressed to the Grand Final. Of the five, the Under 19 Junior Women's (undefeated throughout the season), Under 18 and Under 14 Division three sides were successful.

The lifeblood of our Club – our Have A Go players – again showed great enthusiasm for learning the art of cricket. A special thanks to the coordinator of the program and his merry band of parents who ensure our 'HAG' players develop the skills required for cricket and have a good time as well. A special thanks to Richard Comley (Treasurer) who has done a lot of ground work to prepare for the introduction of the GST as well as coaching the Under 14 Division three and Under 12 Division two (for part of the season) sides.

Our Club has sponsors who provide player awards and perpetual trophies. On behalf of the Club I publicly thank Eagle Boys Belconnen, Video Ezy Belconnen and Deans Trophies (for donating our perpetual trophies), and I recommend readers to patronise these establishments all year round, not just during the cricket season. I would like to thank the WDCC for their continued interest in the EWDJCC throughout the season.

Finally, I acknowledge the hard work of the Executive Committee, General Committee Members, Age Group Coordinators and Coaches. It is this group of people who manage the affairs of the Club and enabling our junior players to compete each weekend during the cricket season. To them, I say a personal thank you for your hard work throughout the season.

However, the work does not stop there. A number of significant challenges face us during the off-season, such as:

- planning for the impact of the GST;
- consolidating our current position, both on and off the field;
- secure storage for kits and other equipment;
- additional home ground (Spence Oval); and
- further development of our coaches/officials (Level 1/2 coaching courses).

These are but a few of the challenges to get the Club onto the field for season 2000/01.

While there will be a tendency by people to be interested solely in the reports of each team, members are reminded that there is a considerable amount of work that is necessary before a Club can successfully function and hence the importance of the Management Committee's Report. This work, which is invariably performed by volunteers, requires the support and cooperation of all members. In this regard, season 1999/2000 must go down as the worst in the Club's history.

Throughout this Report, members will find reference to various deficiencies, but it is important to group some of these to make everyone aware of the shortcomings. Did you, as a Club member, realise that:

- at the scheduled Annual General Meeting the positions of President, Secretary and Treasurer were not filled;
- a raffle conducted by the Club had to be deferred because raffle books were not returned, with several members saying they had been lost;
- the trivia night had to be cancelled because of lack of support;
- the annual golf day was not attempted because of general apathy;
- payments of most subscriptions were not finalised until March, and then in many cases only with the threat of standing down players from semi finals;
- the Annual Presentation Night was poorly attended;
- complaints were received from another cricket club and the Western District Rugby Union licensed Club of unsatisfactory behaviour of Club members off the field;
- a request that a member from each grade attend monthly meetings of the Management Committee met with no response;
- the appointment of selectors for each grade, ie. captain, vice-captain of the relevant grade and the captain of the lower grade, failed on several occasions to meet to select sides.

The President convened a Special General Meeting to address matters yet apart from the Committee members, only five other members attended, highlighting the apathy. The Management Committee acknowledges its shortcomings by not enforcing its own decisions, but clearly lacks the support and interest of the members have never been more evident.

Members must face up to the reality that unless there is a pronounced change in attitude, the Club may be forced to engage a person on a paid basis to attend to some of the administrative functions of the Club. This cost together with the GST would add more than \$100 to each member's subscription. Such a move should be seen as a retrograde step from many angles. It is said that members are too busy! As a Management Committee, we reject that comment. Nobody is too busy to assist in some small way. The failure of members to assist in the conduct of the Club in 1999/2000 was nothing short of disgraceful.

Attendance at the Annual General Meeting will be the first step in avoiding a repetition of the problem in the coming season. Be there.

Note: At the end of the season, the Management Committee agreed that the following player code of conduct is to become a by-law to the Club's Constitution:

### **Responsibilities of Western District Cricket Club Members**

In addition to the requirement to pay fees on time, membership of the Western District Cricket Club carries with it other responsibilities.

You will be expected to exhibit behaviour of an exemplary standard at all times where you are identified as a member. The most obvious occasions are on the playing field where acceptance of umpires' decisions, without dissent, is essential and unseemly conduct is not allowed. There are other occasions, however, such as socials, gatherings at the Rugby Club, as a spectator at matches involving the Club and at meetings, where you will be identified as a member of the Club and behavioural and dress standards will be upheld. The Club has the right to enforce penalties where there are proven breaches of reasonable conduct in these matters.

As a player, you should endeavour to be available for all matches as membership carries with it a commitment to the Club. Part of that commitment includes working cooperatively with the captain, team members and officials to ensure your side achieves its optimum performance.

While there is no compulsion for individuals to undertake administrative duties, members should be aware that the workload in conducting all aspects of the Club's activities is considerable and should not be left to a select few. Your contribution to assist in making the Club work harmoniously and efficiently is encouraged.
